

LOS ANGELES – It was not supposed to be so difficult. Florida went to Los Angeles riding a wave of supreme confidence, well-earned after twelve weeks of perfection. The re-match of the 2009 Championship was no longer expected to be the dramatic showdown predicted at the start of the season – the Knights had struggled all year and, due to the loss of their starting quarterback, a raw rookie would start at the most important position. But the LA defence rose to the occasion and the rookie led one clutch scoring drive to push the Dragons to the edge of their first defeat of the season.

Florida showed a penchant for mistakes early when *Ray Rice* fumbled away the ball on the Dragons first possession. The Knights would not capitalize on that turnover, but they would overcome an early 3-0 deficit by taking advantage of two others; both in the 2nd quarter. *Darius Butler* picked off *Aaron Rodgers* at the Florida 26 yard line, leading to a 30-yard *Dan Carpenter* field goal. Then *Courtney Roby* fumbled the ensuing kickoff at the Florida 30, setting up a 46-yard boot by Carpenter to make it 6-3 for LA. It was a good start for the LA defence but the three Florida turnovers had translated into just 6 points for the Knights due to the struggles of rookie quarterback *Jimmy Clausen*, who was ineffective outside short range.

The Dragons scored the game's first major with less than one minute remaining in the 1st half when Rodgers hit Rice on a quick slant for a 6-yards to give Florida a 10-6 lead at half time. *Steve Weatherford* fumbled away the snap on LA's first possession of the second half to set up a 35-yard field goal by *Ryan Longwell* to give Florida a 7 point lead, 13-6. It looked as if the Dragons would begin to pull away from the wounded Knights at that point, but the stubborn LA defence stood its ground and forced consecutive three-and-outs. That was enough to tilt the field position battle in their favour and the offence managed to scrape out another Carpenter field goal, narrowing the gap to 13-9. But Florida got the 3 points back two drives later when Rodgers completed a pair of passes each to *Heath Miller* and *Brandon Marshall* for a total of 37 yards and Ray Rice carried 8 times for 20 yards to get within striking distance for Longwell's 3rd field goal of the day.

With time running out, the Knights' offence got on track when they needed to with the help of *Jamaal Charles*, who gained 41 yards on 8 carries on the drive and scored on a 4-yard TD run on to tie it at 16 apiece with 1:27 left in the game. The momentum had shifted to LA and that was confirmed when the Knights won the toss to begin overtime. But Charles could not repeat his clutch performance in overtime and the Knights punted the ball to the Florida 22. The Dragons made slow but sure headway against the entrenched Knights' 'D' but were finally stopped at the LA 32 yard line. Longwell, who had missed just one field goal all year, nailed it home from 49 yards for the win, keeping Florida's quest for perfection alive.

MARKHAM UPENDS MOHAVE

GAME POINTS: Louis Delmas intercepted Matt Schaub with 42 seconds remaining in the 1st half and returned it 43 yards for a TD to give Markham a sudden 10-point advantage in a tightly contested battle at the Dawg Pound. A pick from Hellfire corner Leon Hall on Markham's second possession had led to the game's first points; a 10-yard TD pass from Schaub to Donald Driver. The Stars came right back with Jason Campbell completing 4 of 5 for 41 yards on the next drive to help set up a 4-yard TD run by Jahvid Best to tie it. The teams exchanged TDs before Markham took a 3-point lead on a 47-yard Rian Lindell FG set up by a 39-yard kickoff return by Chad Simpson and a 15-yard run by DeAngelo Williams. Staked to a lead, the Markham defence stiffened in the 2nd half while Campbell sealed the game with a 23-yard TD pass to Devery Henderson in the 4th. KEY PERFORMANCES: Jason Campbell completed 16 of 24 for 159 yards, 2 TDs and 1 INT, DeAngelo Williams gained 119 yards on 21 carries, Devery Henderson caught 5 balls for 61 yards and 1 TD; Matt Schaub went 21 of 32 for 190 yards, 3 TDs and 1 INT, Donald Driver caught 6 passes for 71 yards and 2 TDs.

BIG BEN BEATS DOWN YORK

GAME POINTS: Ben Roethlisberger lobbed a ball behind the York coverage and Andre Johnson reeled it in for a 42-yard TD pass to draw even at 7 in the 1st quarter. The free-throwing Hawks' QB added a 2nd TD pass to James Casey to gain a 13-7 lead, but stalled when Jonathan Wilhite intercepted him at the Ringgold 37, leading to a 40-yard FG by Shayne Graham to tie the game 13-13. But the vertical passing attack of the Hawks was too much for the Excaliburs. Big Ben struck suddenly with less than 2 minutes left in the 1st half, making York pay for a failed 4thdown conversion at the Ringgold 49 with a 23-yard TD pass to Santonio Holmes to make it 20-13. Before the end of the 1st half they were on the board again after a 30-yard pass to Johnson set up an 11-yard TD pass to Holmes to make it 27-13. York was out of the game after that.

KEY PERFORMANCES: Ben Roethlisberger completed 19 of 28 for 305 yards, 5 TDs and 1 INT, Andre Johnson caught 7 for 152 yards and 1 TD. Maurice Jones-Drew gained 104 yards on 15 carries; **Tom Brady** went 21 of 33 for 213 yards, 1 TD & 1 INT.

PATS PUMMEL DINOS

<u>GAME POINTS:</u> Adrian Peterson tore a strip through a converging gang of Durham defenders for a 45-yard run; the highlight in a 91-yard scoring drive that ended with a 7-yard TD pass from **Peyton Manning** to **Sydney Rice** to open the scoring. Charleswood would not look back. **Jon Beason** intercepted **Philip Rivers** and returned it 28 yards to the T-Lizards' 37 yard line to set up a 37-yard FG by **Stephen Gostkowski** early in the 2nd. After a crazy sequence of 4 consecutive turnovers by both teams, Peterson took control again with a 46-yard sweep to the Durham 7-yard line and finished the job with a 4-yard TD run to make the score 17-0. The Dino's hole got a little deeper when they failed to convert a 4th down and 4 at their own 33, setting up a 43-yard Gostkowski FG as time expired in the 1st half. The rout was officially on after **Danny Amendola** fumbled the opening kickoff of the 2nd half, leading to a 6-yard TD pass to **Ovie Mughelli**.

<u>KEY PERFORMANCES:</u> Peyton Manning went 20 of 30 for 203 yards and 2 TDs, **Adrian Peterson** rushed for 113 yards and 1 TD on 29 carries, **Sydney Rice** caught 8 passes for 79 yards and 1 TD; **Philip Rivers** went 9 of 22 for 81 yards and 2 INTs.

ONE TD ENOUGH FOR GLADS

GAME POINTS: Terrence McGee intercepted Brodie Croyle then Eli Manning connected with his favourite target, Reggie Wayne for a 41-yard TD pass with less than one minute remaining in the 1st half to give the Glads all the points they would need on a cold day at Joe Ferguson Stadium. Although it was the Cubs' offence that carried the balance of play, it was the Gwinnett offence that scored all of the points. Iowa City squandered an opportunity to take an early lead in the 1st quarter when they failed to punch it home after gaining 1st and goal at the Glads' 2 yard line. During the ill-fated series they lost starter Sam Bradford on a 3rd down sneak and saw Brandon Jacobs stuffed for a 1-yard loss on 4th and inches to leave them shutout for points on the 75-yard drive. In the 2nd half, Daryl Smith blocked a long Iowa FG attempt and Manning hooked up with rookie Demaryius Thomas for a 44-yard pass play to set up a 24-yard FG by Josh Brown. Despite opportunities, Croyle was unable to mount a Cubs comeback.

CONVICTS "CUT" APART MUSTANGS

GAME POINTS: Jay Cutler overcame an early interception that led to Garland's only TD to throw 3 TD passes in an easy win for the Convicts on the road at The Corral. The Mustangs looked sharp early – Brian Cushing picked off Cutler on Chino's second possession and on the very next play Matt Ryan exploited the aggressive Convicts' secondary with a 45-yard TD pass on a long slant to Wes Welker. But that was all the home team would have to cheer about. Chino dominated from that point, scoring 27 unanswered points as Cutler combined with Hines Ward and Randy Moss for 153 yards and 3 TDs while Steven Jackson kept the sticks moving with 5 first down rushes. The Convicts took the lead on a 9-yard pass to Ward to cap off a drive that featured three conversions on 3rd down. Nick Collins squelched a late 1st half Garland rally with his 4th pick of the season and 45-yard return to set up a 25-yard Jeff Reed FG.

KUTZTOWN KICKS ASIDE COWTOWN

<u>GAME POINTS:</u> Nate Kaeding had to kick the winning FG twice after a holding penalty nullified a successful 34-yard effort and pushed him back 10 yards for another try. The Bears kicker was perfect on the day, turning sputtering drives into points by hitting 4 of 4 FG attempts, the longest from 48 yards away, to lead Kutztown to a scrappy 19-10 victory over the punchless Corn Kings. It looked like the Golden Bears would have a fight on their hands in the 1st half. Marion Barber ploughed through a stacked line for a 1-yard TD run to cap off the day's longest scoring drive and give Cowtown a 7-3 lead. Kutztown answered with their own 1-yard TD run by Le'Ron McClain, set up nicely by 3 rushes for 30 yards by Garrett Wolfe. Olindo Mare booted a 37-yard FG to tie it at 10 each but missed from 49 yards as time expired in the 1st half. In the 2nd half, the Kutztown defence shut down the Cowtown attack, holding Joe Flacco to just 1 completion in 10 attempts.

<u>KEY PERFORMANCES:</u> Tony Romo went 22 of 29 for 220 yards, **Greg Jennings** caught 8 passes for 94 yards, **Garrett Wolfe** rushed 4 times for 32 yards, **Richard Seymour** logged 2 sacks; **Joe Flacco** went 13 of 31 for 120 yards.

JOHNSON SETS TD RECORD

GAME POINTS: Chris Johnson set a new EFL touchdown record with 3 rushing TDs to account for all of Pickering's scoring in a surprisingly close contest with Virden at Thermopylae Stadium. Johnson has 28 TDs so far this year, 26 rushing and 2 receiving. The previous record of 26 was held by **DeAngelo Williams**, who recorded all of those on the ground. Johnson can break the single season record for rushing TDs with one more in the next 3 games. The win and the record brought a shine to an otherwise sloppy performance by the Spartans against a team they were expected to beat handily. The Violators capitalized on a 1st quarter kickoff return fumble by Percy Harvin when Lawrence Tynes hoofed a 32-yard FG to give Virden an early 6-0 lead. An interception by Virden's Nate Clements and a lost fumble by Pickering's hero, Johnson, led to no more Virden points but helped keep Pickering off the scoreboard until the final minute of the 1st half when **Brett Favre** hooked up for a 32-yard pass to **Vincent Jackson** to set up the first of Johnson's 3 TDs; a 4-yard pitch to make it 7-6 for the Spartans. After a 2nd half opening TD drive by Pickering made it 14-6, Virden drew within 1 point when Ricky Williams barrelled through the line from 1 yard out to make it 14-13. The Spartans got their final score after Tynes missed a 51-yard FG trying to take the lead and Johnson topped off a 59-yard drive with a 6-yard TD run off left tackle.

KEY PERFORMANCES: Chris Johnson rushed for 130 yards and 3 TDs on 22 carries, **Brett Favre** completed 15 of 21 for 272 yards and 2 INTs, **Vincent Jackson** caught 5 passes for 137 yards; **Drew Brees** went 22 of 31 for 253 yards, **Ricky Williams** gained 59 yards on 23 carries with 1 TD, **Fred Davis** caught 6 passes for 66 yards.

NEW YORK – The Egyptians are angry with us. What's new? Fanatics bombed a Coptic Christian church in Alexandria on New Year's Day for no other reason than they blame us for a myriad of misfortunes; ones as long ago as the burning of their library by a Christian Patriarch to ones as recently as five minutes ago when who knows which unnamed and ephemeral Jewish-influenced Western Christian puppet in the Egyptian Government acted Crusader-like by making a legal ruling that did not suit some good Muslim fanatic, thereby justifying bloody murder of anyone near or in a place identified with the Christian faith. Makes sense to lunatics and fanatics. Unfortunately, lunatics and fanatics seem to be in the majority these days, no matter where you look.

The most recent Egyptian complaint is more mundane and, for a change, actually reasonable. It appears that we have one of their ancient obelisks in Central Park. Not many people know this. Why would they? The thing is perched one block away from the Metropolitan Museum of Art on a hill which is rarely visited except by joggers and bikers – and we all know how oblivious to their surroundings *they* are. This 68-foot tall monument to Thutmosis III was crafted in 1450 BC and was gifted to the US by the Egyptians in 1879 to promote "friendship and trade" – in other words a bribe. The Egyptian Secretary General of the Supreme Council of Antiquities ('Head of Old Things') is demanding that we take better care of this precious historical artefact or return it to Egypt. Apparently, our *weather* and *pollution* is damaging it! If our weather and pollution can harm, in 132 years, a relic that has been on the Earth for 3,461 years, imagine what the weather and pollution is doing to New Yorkers! Maybe it's time to move.

GROWING PAINS

It seems like yesterday, but in fact it was 4 years ago in February, that the old NFL came crashing down in a sports scandal of unparalleled scope and magnitude. Since that time, professional football has taken on a new, but somewhat fragmented face, with no less than 4 professional leagues competing for our entertainment dollars. Although it's not encouraged by my Editor to devote any significant space, or to even *mention*, the other leagues; to pretend that they do not form part of the landscape of the EFL is to bury one's head – ostrich-like – in the sands of journalistic irrelevance. With FOX recently investing \$50 million in a new contract with the SFL and Versus doling out \$20 million for the American rights to the Tex-Mex Football League, the smaller markets in the EFL are feeling the pinch of a CBS and NBC TV contract that guarantees national exposure, but a smaller proportion of cash directly to the teams. The gross money numbers going into the EFL dwarf those of their competition, but the costs of running an EFL franchise are higher since the players have so many viable options elsewhere and demand top dollar for their services.

In a surprise announcement that shocked the EFL even more than Virden and Los Angeles nearly pulling off upsets of Pickering and Florida this week, **Tim Molinaro** – owner, manager and coach of the Ringgold Crimson Hawks – declared his immediate sale of the Crimson Hawks to **Chris Wadley**, President of *Wadley Western Alliance Confederated Co-operative Optimum Insurance Company* of Chicago. At the same time, he announced his purchase of the Tijuana Tacos of the Tex-Mex League. According to sources close to Molinaro, the allure of a new stadium in Tijuana, a guaranteed TV contract, and a 60% stake in the Manchester Mermaids, an elite English women's Octopush team, was enough for him to turn his back on the unpredictable and disturbing antics of "*Big Ben" Roethlisberger* and the generally crazy inconsistency of the Crimson Hawks as they struggled to establish a following in the small market on the Georgia-Tennessee border.

Signs that Molinaro had been frustrated with his team were evident last year, when failed experiments in extreme blitzing and a hard core commitment to the vertical passing game that maximized receiving options and minimized the number of pass blockers were exacerbated by maddeningly bad luck and unsympathetic officials. Hopefully, 2010 was to be the year that everything came together for the cursed offspring of the Meadowlands franchise, but despite an impressive array of offensive and defensive weapons, the inexplicable volatility of the Hawks' performance – high or low from week-to-week – continued without any apparent remedy. With the Hawks sitting at 6-7 and coming off a strong win over York, Molinaro could foresee the inevitable crash coming against Florida and

Gwinnett and obviously did not want to be on the sideline to witness it.

At the same time that Molinaro announced his exit, Wadley announced his early entrance into the league. Previously awarded an expansion franchise by the EFL Board, Wadley rescinded his expansion application and signed an agreement that would keep the Crimson Hawks in Ringgold for the remainder of the 2010 season but allow him to move the franchise to the more lucrative Chicago market at year's end. This leaves the EFL's 2011 expansion plans up in the air. EFL Board member, Seamus O'Coghlin released a terse statement late Sunday simply saying, "Our priority is the health of the EFL's existing 16 franchises. We are pleased to approve the sale of the Ringgold Crimson Hawks to the Chicago ownership group headed by Mr. Wadley. The addition of new franchises in 2011 will be a matter for discussion."

KUTZTOWN ON THE MOVE

As reported last week, Golden Bears owner, **Pete Katsafanas** left Jurassic Park abruptly in the wake of his team's blowout loss to the Durham Thunder Lizards in Week 12. The next day he released his entire coaching staff by internal memo (written on a napkin), ordering them to "destroy all records." According to my sources in Kutztown, all funds held in the team's various accounts were moved en masse the next day to an offshore account on the Caribbean Island of Nevis, the headquarters of Katsafanas' financial empire as well as 'Poker World,' a private offshore casino where sports franchise owners meet to bet and trade. 

VIRDEN @ CHARLESWOOD (line – PATRIOTS by 12)

IOWA CITY @ CHINO (line - CONVICTS by 12)

However, in the desperate attempt to survive, the Cubs will do what they always do in these situations – play hard. GWINNETT @ GARLAND (line – GLADIATORS by 1)

The Gladiators are still alive in the wildcard hunt, but they face an uphill battle and will need help to snatch the prize. They cannot be eliminated if they lose, but a win would be preferable to start this final round of Divisional match-ups. Garland is mercifully out of the picture, eliminated with force last week by Chino. They are playing for pride at this point and the satisfaction of inflicting a humiliation instead of being on the receiving end of one for a change.
