

'UNKNOWN' CHAD SIMPSON SCORES 2 TDS

LOS ANGELES – Who is *Chad Simpson*? The undrafted free agent from the Tex-Mex League, who was on pace for 6 carries in 2010 before injuries to the Markham running back corps forced him into the primary back-up role in Week Six, and who wound up starring for his team in perhaps the most stunning upset of the season – that's who. Simpson ran back a 1st quarter kickoff 96 yards for a TD to register the first big score of the game and on Markham's next possession, broke a 35-yard run off right tackle for another to give the North Stars a 14-10 lead over the home town Knights. *Rian Lindell* added a 46-yard FG and 5 minutes later *Jason Campbell* connected with play-maker *Devery Henderson* for a 64-yard pass to the Los Angeles 9 yard line to set up an eventual 1-yard sneak by Campbell into the end zone to cap off a 17-point 2nd quarter and put Markham in the lead, 24-13 at half time.

The Knights inched back into the game on two field goals by *Dan Carpenter* and after *Calvin Pace* sacked Campbell on an attempted 3rd down and 2 conversion, LA took control at their own 25 yard line trailing by 5 points. But then *Kurt Warner* made the first big mistake of the game by forcing a ball to his secondary receiver that middle linebacker *Barrett Ruud* intercepted to give Markham possession at the Knight's 34 yard line. Campbell made short work of the Los Angeles "Blue Shield" with a 20-yard cross to *Chad Ochocinco* followed by a 15-yard slant to Henderson for a TD to put Markham in a command position, leading 31-19. The Knights overcame a series of penalties to scramble back into the game on a 15-play drive, ending with a 7-yard TD pass from Warner to *Mark Bradley*. But the Knights failed to recover the onside kick and Markham took control with 2:42 remaining in the game. Campbell converted a key 3rd down following the 2-minute warning, connecting for 6 yards to *Vonta Leach*. But the Knights dealt themselves the final blow when *Andre Carter* was flagged for a personal foul to give Markham all the downs they needed to run out the clock.

PICKY PATS PREVAIL

GAME POINTS: Lineman, Quentin Groves kicked off a 6-pick performance by the Patriots with an interception of Matt Ryan early in the 2nd quarter, setting up Adrian Peterson's second TD of the game and signalling the beginning of a Charleswood rout of the Garland Mustangs at Patriot Place. The Pats took a 24-0 lead into half time and did not let up after Robbie Gould nicked them for 3 points on a 21-yard FG to start the second half. Peterson scored his third TD of the game to make the score 37-3 early in the 4th quarter after Jon Beason's interception set the Pats up at Garland's 7 yard line. The Mustangs wasted a 15-catch performance by Wes Welker, adding two meaningless late TDs late against the Pats' back-ups to register double digit scoring.

<u>KEY PERFORMANCES</u>: Matt Ryan completed 31 of 52 passes for 377 yards, 2 TDs and 6 INTs, Wes Welker caught 15 passes for 246 yards and 1 TD, Adrian Peterson rushed for 107 yards and 3 TDs on 20 carries, Peyton Manning went 20 of 26 for 170 yards, 1 TD, Sheldon Brown made 2 interceptions and 11 tackles and 1 deflection.

YOU HAVE TO BE "KAEDING!"

GAME POINTS: Nate Kaeding accounted for all of Kutztown's points, kicking 6 field goals to tip the game in favour of the Bears, 18-17 over the struggling Crimson Hawks. In 6 trips deep inside the Ringgold red zone, the Bears opted for field goals every time rather than challenge the Hawks 'D' on 4th down. The slow and steady strategy worked as the Ringgold offence, despite scoring the game's only two TDs, failed to preserve 3 separate leads, the last one coming on a 21-yard TD pass from **Big Ben** to **Mike Thomas** that gave them a 17-12 lead in the 3rd quarter. Two long drives of 17 and 15 plays each, in which the longest play from scrimmage was 11 yards, erased that advantage. **Ike Taylor** picked off Roethlisberger twice, the second to ice the game with 10 seconds left.

KEY PERFORMANCES: Tony Romo completed 23 of 33 passes for 254 yards, **Austin Collie** caught 8 passes for 80 yards, **LeSean McCoy** rushed for 64 yards on 21 carries; **Ben Roethlisberger** went 24 of 35 for 258 yards, 2 TDs and 2 INTs, **Andre Johnson**, 9 passes for 100 yards and 1 TD, **Maurice Jones-Drew**, 68 yards on 14 carries.

BRADY BUNCHES 4 TD PASSES IN WIN

GAME POINTS: A red hot **Tom Brady** torched the Corn King's secondary in the first half of the game, starting off with a 45-yard bomb to **Michael Jenkins** for a TD on the game's opening drive, and ending the 2nd quarter with a 13-yard slant to **Donald Lee** for his fourth TD and a 28-3 lead at half time. Brady put on a virtuoso performance, completing passes into double coverage and finding the open man with 5 or 6 defensive backs patrolling the secondary. Cowtown's **Joe Flacco**, who fought against inaccuracy in the first half, finally found some success against the Excalibur's defence in the 3rd quarter, breaking out for 2 TDs, but it was too little too late. **Marion Barber's** 4th quarter fumble at his own 45 put the brakes on a Cowtown comeback, and York went on to cap off the win with a 47-yard field goal into the wind by **Shayne Graham**.

KEY PERFORMANCES: Tom Brady went 24 of 32 for 302 yards, 4 TDs and 1 INT, **Michael Jenkins** caught 6 passes for 85 yards and 2 TDs, **Donald Lee** caught 5 balls for 39 yards and 2 TDs, **Pierre Thomas** rushed for 85 yards on 21 carries; **Joe Flacco** went 23 of 34 for 228 yards and 2 TDs, **Donnie Avery** caught 6 passes for 76 yards.

REGGIE IS THE "WAYNE" TO VICTORY

GAME POINTS: Reggie Wayne turned a short hitch route into a 78-yard play from scrimmage to set up a 2-yard TD run by Thomas Jones to open the scoring for Gwinnett. After a FG increased their lead to 10-0, the Glads let the Violators back into the game with a couple of turnovers, the second a fumble by Jones at the end of a 16-yard run that Virden eventually turned into a major on a 1-yard dive by Joseph Addai. Jones redeemed himself on Gwinnett's next possession, rushing for 25 yards and two 1st downs on a drive that ended with Eli Manning finding Wayne in the end zone from 12 yards out for a 17-7 half time lead. The Glads built up a 31-14 lead by early in the 4th quarter and held on despite a 68-yard TD run by Ricky Williams and a second TD pass from Drew Brees to Devin Hester. The Glads ran out the clock after fielding the ensuing kickoff.

DINOS DEAL CHINO FIRST LOSS

GAME POINTS: Philip Rivers regained some confidence with a 2-TD pass performance against the league's best defence to lead the Thunder Lizards to a critical win. Danny Amendola's 22-yard punt return at the end of the 1st quarter shortened the field for Durham's first TD drive, then a 4th down gamble by the Convicts at their 34 yard line shortened the field even more for their second TD, a 4-yard run by Kevin Smith. Leading 14-0 early, Durham held off a Chino comeback with solid play by their 'D' which included limiting the Convicts to a field goal after Calvin Johnson had fumbled away the ball on a 40-yard pass play. Johnson made up for that gaffe at a critical point late in the game, turning a short slant into a 25-yard gain to convert 3rd down and 20 and spurring his team to a 20-yard FG by Mason Crosby to top off the scoring in a 24-16 win. KEY PERFORMANCES: Philip Rivers completed 20 of 35 for 258 yards and 2 TDs, Mushin Muhammad caught 6 passes for 62 yards and 1 TD; Donovan McNabb went 20 of 33 for 231 yards, Steven Jackson rushed for 81 yards and 1 TD on 19 carries.

COMPLETE WIN MOVES FLORIDA TO 6-0

GAME POINTS: The Dragons dominated the game in every way, striking quickly, holding on to the ball when necessary, and shutting down Mohave's MVP, **Matt Schaub. DeSean Jackson** made another big play, turning a 4-yard slant into a 55-yard dash to pay dirt to give Florida an early 7-0 advantage. The Hellfire attack fizzled out against the Florida "Firewall," with **Darrelle Revis** returning an interception 57 yards, only to be knocked out of bounds at the 1 yard line. **Ray Rice** brought the ball in off tackle to finish it off and the Dragons led 17-0 at that point. They finished off the first half with a grinding 64-yard drive that featured a big run by **Jonathan Stewart**, an 8-yard tipped pass to guard, **Logan Mankins**, and ended with Stewart breaking the plane from inches away for a decisive 24-0 half time lead. Mohave's best shot at points was snuffed out in the Florida red zone when Schaub mis-fired to **Hakeem Nicks** on 4th and 10 in the 4th quarter.

SPARTANS MARCH OVER CUBS

GAME POINTS: The league-leading Pickering offence continued to dominate opponents, this time teeing off on the Iowa City Cubs for 4 first half touchdowns. A 23-yard pass interference penalty against the Cubs' **Chris Gamble** on the first play from scrimmage set the tone for a first half collapse by the Iowa City defence. **Brett Favre** continued to fire the ball, completing 5 passes for 50 yards the rest of the way and hitting **Percy Harvin** for a TD from 19 yards out to open the scoring. After a two-punt pause for breath, the Spartans hammered the Cubs for 3 quick TDs in the 2nd quarter – all 3 of them on runs by running back **Chris Johnson** after Favre had put them in position through the passing game. Rookie QB, **Sam Bradford** did not have an answer for the equally impressive Pickering defence, throwing a pick to **Jason Taylor** and losing a fumble that led to the Spartans final points in the 4th quarter.

<u>KEY PERFORMANCES:</u> Brett Favre completed 22 of 31 for 241 yards and 1 TD, **Chris Johnson** rushed for 3 TDs and 72 yards on 12 carries, **Darren Sproles** gained 125 all-purpose yards on 11 carries and 8 receptions; **Sam Bradford** went 18 of 36 for 152 yards and 1 INT, **Demeco Ryans** made 13 tackles and 3 run stuffs in a losing effort.

NEW YORK – It's nice to be back in Gotham. I like the tall dark buildings obscuring the dull grey sky, the grumble of idling taxi engines, the screech of rubber on the road when the light turns green, the clacking of a thousand shoes reverberating in the subway tunnels, the rudeness of the newspaper vendors, the entitlement of the bums, the smell of rotten fish in the lanes, the lack of birds. But mostly, I like the grandness of it all. It's like living in the belly of a giant beast.

IT'S TIME TO PANIC

Remember how I said 'pshaw' to **Jeff Dohrn** for pushing the panic button in Week Three? Well, now I'm pushing the panic button for him. After watching Markham go into round Round Table Stadium and beat Los Angeles with *Chad Simpson* at running back, I think panicking is the only sensible thing that the 1-5 Knights can do at this juncture. Certainly they have tried everything rational – even breaking a long standing tradition of plugging in a journeyman at quarterback by bringing in the vet, *Kurt Warner*. And speaking of Warner, he is 1-2 since joining the Knights. You cannot fairly say that their continued slide has been his fault – in those 3 games he posted LA's only win and he has thrown 8 TD passes to only 2 picks, completed 68% of his passes, and averaged 278 yards passing per game. But he did throw an interception to Markham middle linebacker, *Barrett Ruud* at a critical point in the game on Sunday that essentially snuffed out any reasonable chance of a Knights comeback. *Barrett Ruud!* No disrespect intended, but the runstopping Ruud is not exactly a coverage specialist. He wasn't even covering any receiver on the play – he was just *there*, in the path of Kurt's pass.

On the other side of that big trade, *Jason Campbell* is 2-1 since joining Markham and he looked pretty efficient picking apart his old team. He even went after *Nnamdi Asomugha* deep, catching him off balance and forcing him to tug at receiver *Devery Henderson* just before the ball arrived to earn a 21-yard pass interference flag. Campbell's 243-yard, 1 TD, no pick performance on the road in the face of the league's best pass rush and secondary is arguably more impressive than the win itself. There were other contributors to the Markham upset that were opportunistic and somewhat fluky; such as the emergence of one-game wonder, *Chad Simpson*, who returned a kickoff 96 yards for a TD and who broke a 35-yard run for another behind a great block by tackle *Ryan Clabo* on run-stuff specialist *Andre Carter*. The Knights also drew almost as many flags as the United Nations, which thwarted their momentum and often boosted Markham's. But the steady, cool performance of Campbell in the clutch was impressive and has to have raised eyebrows in Tinseltown and cast some doubt on Dohrn's handling of his former scapegoat.

The fact is that the Knights collapse has been a true team effort. They are finding ways to implode every week – whether due to penalties, turnovers, missed field goals, special team breakdowns or blown coverages. **Jeff Dohrn's** stock is falling faster than BP shares in Louisiana after blowing what everyone thought was a safe "guarantee" that his team would beat the North Stars. Could it be the pressure of expectations after last season's inspiring charge to the Championship Game and a near upset over the Dragons? Could last year's wild ride have induced a severe Championship Game "hangover?" Are they like MacBeth – *cursed*? Let me hear *your* thoughts on why the Knights suck. PHILIP RIVERS EARNS A STAY.....

...of execution. The QB most under-the-gun earned a reprieve from having his front lawn spray-painted with the word "LOSER" and other nasty tricks with a gritty performance against the "Lockdown Crew" in Durham's 24-16 victory over Chino. Durham Police were called in to investigate an alleged series of threats against *Philip Rivers* from what may have been one, or several, deranged fans. Police have been tight-lipped about the details of their investigation but have divulged that threats against the struggling star were received, and suggested that they may be the work of one individual, or a group of individuals working together. The game got off to another laughably bad start for Durham. They engineered the season's longest drive from scrimmage resulting in a punt, marching 72 yards in 16 plays starting from their own 2, only to punt the ball from the Convict's 36 after a holding call nullified a 43-yard field goal by *Mason Crosby*. This brought out the boo birds at Jurassic Park early, but Rivers quieted them down with back-to-back touchdown drives to make it 14-0 after that, the second coming after *Jason Jones* stopped *Donovan McNabb* cold on a risky 4th down and inches play at Chino's 34 yard line. The Lizards managed to keep one step ahead of Chino the rest of the way, but such has been the star-crossed ways of the Thunder Lizards that nobody in the Lizard's corner could

relax and enjoy the game confident that Durham would press home its advantage.

On the other side, it was the Convicts' first loss of the season and it did not sit well with head coach, **Rob Nazar**. The back-breaking play of the game came with 5 minutes remaining and Durham ahead 21-16. Facing 3rd down and 20 at their own 23 yard line, Rivers fired a short slant to *Calvin Johnson* as the Chino DBs played the deep ball. Johnson gathered up a head of steam and put a move on *Terence Newman* to get in the clear long enough to cover 25 yards for the first down. Nazar threw his headset and clipboard then lifted a barrel of 'Gatorade' and spilled it on the bench. He harangued his secondary from the sideline and pulled Newman out of the game, directing him to the Gatorade-soaked bench to have a seat. When Newman refused to sit in the puddle, Nazar fired tape and other debris from the trainer's bag at Newman and had to finally be restrained by defensive coordinator, **Monte Kiffen**.

After the game, Nazar apologized for his outburst but still put the blame on his players and not on Kiffen, who had placed the secondary in a deep zone to guard against the long pass. "We have to make that play!" Nazar barked. "I don't care if it's Calvin Fu^*ing Johnson! We're the Chino F@\$#ing Convicts and we find a way to win games. We did *not* lock them down in that situation and that is unacceptable. Let's just say that we are going to work on a few things.....the *hard way*, during practice this week." I guess that means the Convicts players will have their day passes revoked in the lead-up to their big Week Seven match-up against Pickering.

NO 'KAEDING,' HAWKS LOSE AGAIN!

With so many eyes focused on the meltdown of the LA Knights, Ringgold's continuing troubles are not drawing much scrutiny. One possible explanation is the general lack of expectations of a team that has never had a winning season in its history. Another is that journalists and fans don't really take Ringgold seriously going back to their inception as the comically bad Meadowlands Swamp Dogs in the EFL's first season. **Jack Buffolano**, the team's original owner, is now serving time for tax evasion after being nabbed at LaGuardia Airport trying to leave for the Caymen Islands. His sister, **Bocchina Buffolano**, who stills owns 10% of the team, was indicted last week for her role in a Ponzi scheme that reportedly bilked first generation Italian investors of over 100 million dollars. Try as he might, new owner and head coach **Tim Molinaro** seems to be fighting a steep uphill battle to bring credibility to his franchise both on and off the field.

His on field "cred" is plummeting with another loss in which his offence failed to perform to its perceived talent level. This time the Hawks could not keep pace with **Nate Kaeding's** leg. The Golden Bears' kicker made 6 easy field goals and that was enough to knock the Hawks out of the air. Although Molinaro is reportedly well-liked by his players and gets along with reporters, a small group of writers, including Ringgold elder statesman, **Jebidiah Cleburne**, are publicly musing over the value of a coaching change. It had to happen at some point. Most serious football analysts rate the Ringgold talent pool on the offensive side of the ball quite high and contend that playmakers like **DeMarus Ware** and **Clay Matthews** make their defence ever-menacing despite a couple of notable holes at both ends of the defensive line.

Molinaro is reportedly pulling out all the stops to get *Ben Roethlisberger's* head into the game and out of Bubbles' cleavage. The Ringgold mascot has been getting a little too close to the sidelines when the Hawks have the ball and this is supposed to be having a negative effect on Big Ben. In the Week Five loss to Pickering, Roethlisberger allegedly audibled "37-blue, 84-bubbles, 49-boobies, *hut!*" – a play that does not exist. The resulting confusion resulted in a missed blocking assignment and *Jason Taylor* broke through for a sack on the play. As a result, a hypnotist was brought in to promote positive

And that is what the Violators did at Gwinnett on Sunday in a 31-28 loss to the Glads. Now, in fairness, I have to give some credit to the idea that **Leodis McKelvin** might have tried making the ESPN highlight reel by running the ball back hard and fumbling it away - he has done that before to lose a game in an alternate universe, according to my geek nephew, Byron. However, that possibility is still just a gnat's hair greater than a long shot, while the success rate of onside kick-off attempts is about 26%, with adjustments for whether the opponent is expecting it or not.

So why kick the ball back to Gwinnett to run out the clock? Well, you either think gnat's hairs are pretty thick, or you don't really want to win the game. And the only two rational reasons why anyone would *not* want to win the game would be if that person thought his team was bad, but not quite bad enough to earn the first overall pick in the rookie draft through honest failure; or else a BIG bet was involved. In any case, the trick to covering it up is in explaining such a move (or lack of a move) to reporters after the fact. And in that respect, Barrate gets an "F" for his "oops, I forgot" excuse.

In the post-game media scrum, Barrate was grilled on his decision to kick the ball away and his response was not comforting or coherent. After first asserting that he had not realized how much time was left because he had forgot to set his watch to daylight savings time, he switched gears and claimed that he had been distracted by 'Gladiella' and had not realized the situation. When he saw the incredulous expressions on the faces of reporters, he reluctantly "volunteered" his secret strategy. "We knew they were expecting us to kick onside," Barrate offered somewhat tentatively, "so we thought our best option was to kick deep, because they weren't expecting it. That also would put us closer to their goal line, which is where we wanted to be. Yeah, that's it! They caught the ball, but we all know that's not a sure thing in this league. Heck it's easy to second guess a coach's decision. I wish I had your job sometimes; then I could always be right about things after they're done. No more questions, guys, I think the pizza's here."

THE HAVES AND THE HAVE-NOTS

The gap between the haves and the have-nots in the EFL is widening and it is becoming obvious in the quality of some of the games. Week Six brought us a bunch of insipid meetings (I would not go as far as to call them "contests") between confirmed "haves," such as Charleswood, Florida, and Pickering; aspiring "haves," such as Kutztown and York; and a line-up of both traditional and new "have-nots," such as Garland, Ringgold, Iowa City and Cowtown. Even Markham's stunning upset of the LA Knights may turn out, in hindsight, to have been merely a confirmation that Los Angeles has inexplicably and suddenly fallen into the ranks of the "have-nots" and that we had simply not figured that out at the Week Six mark.

Charleswood got *Adrian Peterson* back on track with a 107 yards rushing, 3 TDs, and a season long 30-yard run from scrimmage while pounding the hapless Mustangs 40-17. The sophomore slump is hitting *Matt Ryan* like a ton of bricks this year. Six (count' em) interceptions sets a new league record for airborne gaffs in a single game and catapults Ryan downward in the QB rankings below even Cowtown's unsteady *Joe Flacco*. Despite being down at one point 40-3, the Mustangs tore a shred of bragging rights from the game sheet with a 15-reception, 246-yard performance by *Wes Welker*. For Pats' corner, *Sheldon Brown*, it was a rare example of a 2-interception day he would like to forget. Brown also made 11 tackles chasing Welker down all over the field. When a corner leads the team in tackles, you know he had a bad day.

Pickering toyed with the Cubs at Joe Ferguson Stadium – calling off the dogs early in the second half after jumping out to a 28-0 lead without really trying. Iowa City is beginning to look like a beaten team before they take the field, which is a posture from them unseen before. Everyone thinks the kid, *Sam Bradford*, is going to be good some day but everyone also knows he won't be good enough to lead this team anywhere meaningful this season.

Tom Brady showed why he is the best pocket passer in the league in dissecting the Corn King's secondary and staking his team to a 28-3 lead at half time with 4 touchdowns passes. Cowtown was missing Rashean Mathis, but it is debateable how much he was missed because he was not getting the job to his usual standard before the injury. The remaining defensive backs did not play badly, but Brady made them look bad with precision throws and spilt second reads from the pocket that defeated almost every look the Kings put on the field. Joe Flacco took a step forward by avoiding interceptions, but his inaccuracy in the first half kept putting the fragile Cowtown defence on the field to face the Brady storm. York's defensive shortcomings were not obvious against the Flacco-led Kings. Antwan Odom was a regular guest in the Cowtown backfield and Geno Hayes was a wall against the run.

Florida unmasked Mohave at Dragonmount, 34-0. *Matt Schaub*, once the toast of the Fiery Depths, got badly burnt against the "Firewall." It was the second consecutive bad game for Schaub, who had been a viable MVP candidate after 4 weeks and 4 wins into the season. The Dragons looked much like they did last year, grabbing the early lead with the help of a big turnover and then running the ball for most of the second half. *Aaron Rodgers* attempted only 16 passes and *Brandon Marshall* was tight-lipped with the Media after getting only 4 balls thrown his way.

FLORIDA @ KUTZTOWN (line – DRAGONS by 9)

As if facing powerful Florida were not challenge enough on its own, the Golden Bears enter this game severely banged up on defence. Both starting corners are out, as is inside linebacker, E.J. Henderson, defensive end, Aaron Smith and big defensive tackle, Glenn Dorsey. Aaron Rodgers will have all options available to him and need fear just two men on the other side of the line – safety Darren Sharper and lunatic linebacker, Ray Lewis. Tony Romo on the other hand will have basically one option – pass the ball. The Dragons are able to control the run while defending the pass and the Kutztown running backs are not likely to surprise them for big yards as they have other teams. But even if they do, who cares? The Florida juggernaut will score as often as it needs to score to stay comfortably in front for 60 minutes. **Pick: FLORIDA**

GWINNETT @ CHARLESWOOD (line – PATS by 11)

The spread appears a little excessive at first glance, but the odds-makers *love* Charleswood at home, where they are 3-0 and really don't like Gwinnett on the road, where they are 0-3. Actually, the troubles run deeper than a winless road record for Gwinnett. The defence continues to underperform. They appeared on the verge of a late collapse last week but were given a reprieve by Virden's deep kickoff to end the game. They enter this game without two of their top defensive backs, Terrence McGee and Troy Polamalu. Robert Mathis, their top pass rusher, is questionable. Meanwhile, everything is going according to plan in Patriot country except for the loss of safety, Ed Reed. Eli Manning will have a small window to score points through the air but will have to catch fire if he is going to keep pace with his older brother, Peyton. **Pick: CHARLESWOOD**

VIRDEN @ GARLAND (line – MUSTANGS by 3)

The Violators are notoriously slow to get started, having scored a league-low 41 points in the first half of games so far this year. The Mustangs are not much better with 57 first half points. The question will be who can finish strongest. With Drew Brees behind center for Virden, they unquestionably have the edge under pressure. Unless Garland jumps out to an unexpectedly big early lead, something about as likely as a comet striking the Earth this Christmas, the Violators should pull out a victory with a late surge. Unless, of course, they elect to free kick the ball for the entire last period instead. **Pick: VIRDEN**

MOHAVE @ RINGGOLD (line – CRIMSON HAWKS by 3)

For once I am completely baffled by the Vegas line on this one. Obviously enough people still see hope for the Ringgold offence and others see no hope for a Mohave recovery after two consecutive bad outings. To put things in perspective, the Hellfire misfired against two tough opponents, Chino and Florida. The Ringgold offence faced a challenge in Pickering but wet its pants against a relatively soft Kutztown defence. The Mohave defence will be much harder to throw against so a lot is riding on Maurice Jones-Drew to draw the linemen into the box and help out Big Ben. Teams have had success running the ball against Mohave,

but that certainly does not mean that the basket-case Ringgold offence will have similar good fortune. My take on this is that the line got switched by a mischievous clerk in the Vegas wire room. **Pick: MOHAVE**

DURHAM @ IOWA CITY (line – THUNDER LIZARDS by 2)

The Iowa City defence is on the verge of complete recovery from injuries with Aaron Curry 'Probable' and DeAngelo Hall 'Doubtful' for this Sunday's game. They are just the kind of defensive group that can rise up and take the game away from a superior opponent, as they showed against Los Angeles; and the Durham offence is just the kind of group that can help them do that. Fundamentally, there remain all sorts of problems for the Cubs on both sides of the ball, but I have this strange feeling that they are going to keep this one close. At the end of the day, Sam Bradford will struggle to finish the job and Durham will win, but it will be another ugly victory for the Big Tails. **Pick: DURHAM**

COWTOWN @ LOS ANGELES (line – KNIGHTS by 6)

Knight's coach, Jeff Dohrn wisely kept his mouth shut this week, declining most Media requests and steadfastly refusing to speak at all about this upcoming game, let alone "guaranteeing" a win. The Knights are doing a bit of everything wrong, so it is difficult to put a definitive tag on their problems, apart from the obvious difficulty with turnovers. On the other side of this contest, it is no secret that the quarterback play in Cowtown is holding them back from greater respectability, if not a better won-loss record. Both teams are functioning at low ebb heading this contest, but Cowtown is the most severely banged up, missing five starters. All signs point to a comfortable victory for LA, despite recent troubles. Take the Knights and the points, but don't take out a second mortgage. **PICK: LOS ANGELES**

YORK @ MARKHAM (line – NORTH STARS by 2)

This is the toughest game for me to call. Markham is the best "bad" team in the EFL while York is utterly transformed with Tom Brady at QB. Both teams have weaknesses on paper, but none of those weaknesses are emerging as impediments to victory on any given Sunday. The North Stars are having modest success defending the pass despite a weak pass rush and a mediocre and shallow talent pool in the secondary. York lost middle linebacker, Brian Urlacher for the season after last week's game and Jeremy Shockey is "doubtful," but otherwise they are in good shape. I would fall back on my "better quarterback" theory if it weren't for Jason Campbell freaking me out with a top grade performance against Los Angeles last week. Still, Tom Brady is Tom Brady. I'm not confident about it, but I'm sticking with the Swords. **Pick: YORK**

CHINO @ PICKERING (line – SPARTANS by 4)

This game just became a lot more important for both teams after Durham's victory last week. The "Lockdown Crew" suffered its first loss when they failed to shut down the Durham offence late in the game and now they face the real prospect of back-to-back losses after starting 5-0. The Spartans see the Thunder Lizards finally rising from near extinction and would like to maintain that two-game advantage they currently enjoy as insurance against a late season Durham push. Both teams are fully healthy, so it will be a full head-on collision at Thermopylae Stadium. The Spartans appear to be gathering steam every week and are gaining national recognition because of their offence. But the Spartan's defence is almost as impressive and will pose a big challenge for Donovan McNabb. The Chino QB is the key to a Convicts victory here as Steven Jackson is not the threat that Chris Johnson is to take control of a game. The Spartans can kill you on the ground and through the air. It will be a great game, with the Spartans offence making the difference. **Pick: PICKERING**
