

In Week 13 many contenders solidified their playoff positions. In Markham, Matt Ryan found Anguan Boldin wide open, turning a medium hitch into a 49-yard TD pass as the Mustangs trampled the North Stars, 27-0, In LA, Carson Palmer found Antonio Brown behind the safety for a 71-yard TD pass to spur the undefeated Triumph to a 21-14 victory over the Knights; In Durham, LeGarrette Blount turned the corner for a 7-yard TD run to touch off a 21-point 1st half and the Corn Kings held on in the 2nd half to down the Thunder Lizards, 21-14, In Brooklin, **Ryan Mathews** gashed through the Cannibals' line for a 12-yard TD run with 0:34 remaining to lift the Hawks to a 24-21 win on Mohave, Charger safety Reggie Nelson intercepted Ryan Fitzpatrick to set up a Carson Wentz 1-yard TD run as the Chargers built up a lead then held off the Hellfire, 24-10, In Erieau, the Monarchs eclipsed a 17-13 deficit in the 3rd when *Eli Manning* hit Allen Hurns on a long slant for a 29-yard TD pass to spark his team to a 27-24 victory over the winless Cadillac; The Chino, Convict **DeMarcus Ware** picked up his own forced fumble and carried it 69 yards for a TD to put away the Patriots, 33-17; (s) In Virden, **Russell** Wilson connected with Heath Miller for 3 TD passes, including a 26-yarder to open the scoring, as the Cubs blanked the Violators, 26-0, 26 At Stone Pony Shore in New Jersey, *Brian Hoyer* hooked up with *Brian Hartline* for a 46-yard TD pass in the 3rd quarter and the Wrecking Balls would hold the Regulators to field goals in the 4th to emerge with their second straight 17-16 victory; An Gwinnett, Jarvis Landry gained 20 yards on an end-around to_∧set up a tackle-busting 18-yard TD run by **LeSean McCoy** and the Glads shut down York in the 4th quarter to emerge with a 20-10 win, In Scarborough, Andy Dalton hit Doug Baldwin in stride for an 86-yard TD pass play, his third of four on the day, as the Swordfish walloped the Blue Eagles, 54-20; Toronto, Pickering safety Mike Adams opened the scoring with a 39-yard pick six and Sterling Shepard caught a 5-yard TD pass with 1:07 left as the Spartans squeezed by expansion Toronto, 20-17.

Chris Ivory, RB (MVM) With Matt Forte out this power back will be featured against a Charger defence that doesn't have what it takes to stop him. He'll burn up ground and maybe even score.



NEW YORK – In addition to creating a whole lot of mediocrity in the large middle cut of EFL teams, the age of parity is making it increasingly difficult for professionals to make money betting on the games. A study released by *Sportsman's Bet* magazine, a Vegas insider's subscription-only periodical, reports that average winning percentages are down for professional gamblers betting on EFL games; while they remain steady across the board in other sports. Many of the industry's top professionals in Vegas and Atlantic City have taken big hits to their pocket books and their reputations this year as they scramble, and often fail, to make sense of a season where feeble Toronto can hang with the potent Mustangs while the playoff-bound North Stars cannot even score a point against them.

Vegas' top forecaster, **Jimmy the Geek** – whose weekly bulletin *Bug the Bookie* is worth every penny of its outrageously priced \$875 annual subscription – is having his worst season since the start of the EFL, winning 55.7% of his games, compared with historical success rates in the 60 to 68% range. By comparison, Jimmy's main Vegas competitor, **Fat Tony** of *FatWads.com* – whose 61% success rate in 2011 brought him to prominence during one of Jimmy's off years – is hovering around 53%, down from 56% in 2015. Meanwhile, **Pete the Belcher**, the best Atlantic City has to offer, is barely staying afloat at 52%; while the east coast's hot hand of 2015, **Micky** "*The Meatball*" **Milano**, is currently sitting in the red at 49.7%; along with *Bet Pie's* **Tricky Dicky O'Toole**, mired at an embarrassing and potentially career-ending 48.6%.

Traditional bookmakers are panicking as computer models and predictive algorithms replace good old-fashioned insider information and game-fixing. While there is no evidence yet that the latter practice has resurfaced since the discovery of its prevalence in the old NFL consigned that league to oblivion in 2007, insider information is still available, but harder than ever to come by as teams increase their counter-intelligence measures to combat "spy-gate" style scandals of the kind **Chris Worthley** was accused of at the high point of his Undertakers' success in 2012. In an era when cheating opportunities are diminishing and teams are more evenly matched, the weaknesses of individual betting models are being exposed and driving some people out of business as a result.

A case in point is **Lucky Leo Lamanna**, a Vegas insider of the old school who enjoyed great success handicapping football games while his business, 'Football Good Eats' enjoyed a near monopoly on pro football catering services. But when teams started to move away from spaghetti and meatballs and veal parmesan and began turning to healthier options, Lucky Leo's football success rate dropped as information gleaned through his food-serving spies dried up. His betting model, a "luck-based predictive method" also known as darts (tossed at a board with 'visitors' on one side and 'home' on the other), harmless enough when only being used for the odd game, was unable to sustain the full weight of his handicapping business. He fell into deep debt and now Lucky Leo the handicapper is actually handicapped, with a pair of broken knees courtesy of his mob connections to remind him of the importance of knowing what the f&*k you're doing when playing with other people's money.

Traditional betting is a seedy, dirty and sometimes dangerous game with apparently diminishing returns. The future seems to lie in "clean" computerized betting technology, like *Cyberstakes* from FanTunnel.com and Virtual Bookie's *Electro-Bet*. These services are cheap and easy-to-use even as they are prone to the occasional glitch and built strictly on pure mathbased statistical probabilities. The drawback is that you have to pretty much bet on all of the games to gain the edge, whereas the traditional insider can provide particularly deep insight into one or two games based on such things as undisclosed injuries, internal politics, and the like.

Not a betting man myself (except for the occasional beer wager), these developments do not threaten my pocket book. But they are instructive to the degree that they reflect the challenges *all* analysts – whether of the betting industry, the fantasy football craze, or the conventional sports world – face in the age of EFL parity. Or is it really the age of EFL mediocrity?

THE HOT SEAT

When was the last time a coach was fired in the EFL? I bet you can't remember. That coach was the notorious "Jonesy," the discredited first hire of Blue Eagles' owner **Chris Dickinson** upon his purchase of the Florida Dragons and subsequent move to Scarborough. Jonesy (aka **Paul Jones**) had no professional football coaching experience. His football credentials consisted of playing back-up tight end on the Birchmount High football team and, of course, being best friends and drinking buddies with "Dickhead" (as he would often refer to his new boss when speaking in public). In a reassuring sign that rampant nepotism in the clannish cliques of Scarborough society has its limits, Jonesy was summarily fired by his best friend in 2012 after burning out

the finely-tuned engine of the Florida Dragons' football machine he had inherited. The subsequent panic hiring of **Bill Belicheck** to a 15-year contract was welcome news for locals. But after leading them to their best campaign of the Dickinson Era in 2012, the dysfunctional off-field dynamic of the Blue Eagles franchise as a whole became too much for the legendary former NFL head coach to tolerate and he quit in disgust.

The locals held out hope for a new saviour until they found out that Belicheck would be replaced by Dickinson himself – a person with absolutely no experience of playing or coaching football, but who prided himself on being a "good team player" and a "consensus builder." Plus, "things seem to work out for me in life," he famously boasted at his press conference announcing his own hire.

It was soon obvious that Dickinson had no idea what he was doing. But seeing that he was "the boss" and people depended on him for a paycheque, the football people in the organization were hesitant to criticize him. On those rare occasions when they did, Chris would just smile, put his arm around them, and say, "I think you need a drink, [insert coach name here]. Let's go to the Fox – it's on me."

The Fox – short for 'The Fox and Badger,' a pub near Bluffs Stadium – was where most of the Blue Eagles' plays were designed during their dismal 2014 campaign. Defensive schemes with more moving parts than a Swiss pocket watch and pass plays featuring

alternating rollouts and opposite field pass patterns were scribbled on stacks of paper napkins that were subsequently copied into a playbook over one thousand pages thick. Most of the plays were barely executable in theory, let alone in practice. The infamous 'Play Action Triple Reverse,' that involved two fake handoffs and three real exchanges, took 6 seconds to execute even after practicing it 64 times one mid-week afternoon in December.

But even this rare incompetence did not get Dickinson fired. After all, he couldn't "fire" himself. Instead he brought in flamboyant **Rex Ryan** to steady the Scarborough defence, while he concentrated on fine-tuning the offence. And this is where the Blue Eagles are at present: they have the worst defence in the league and a passing offence that surpasses only Toronto and Erieau in efficiency. At 3-10, they are long out of the playoff race and their desperate fans are reduced to rioting and attempting to murder the owner because they know he cannot be fired.

However, much as it would appear that I pick solely on poor **Chris Dickinson**, there are other coaches on the public hot seat who will likely, and undeservedly, still be around after the season is over in three weeks. Here are the consensus top three candidates (other than Dickinson of course) in the running for pink slips when the 2016 season comes to a close:

Lance Barrate (Virden): being the owner's son goes a long way toward maintaining job security. But there are signs that the blood between father Vance and son Lance might not be thick enough to survive a withering Manitoba Media assault on the Violators' coach. A Virden Eviscerator article described one recent coaching performance as "Lance going through the motions again" while the Winnipeg Free Press scornfully dismissed the "other team" in Manitoba as "an unwatchable broken down heap of junk rusting away under the indifferent stewardship of a coach who has repeatedly violated the trust of fans." Virden's track record over 7 complete seasons is unimpressive. A .384 win percentage with 1 playoff loss doesn't look good on a résumé. Early failures to meet expectations were placed on the shoulders of quarterback Matt Stafford. But the shock therapy of a 0-16 season combined with the failure of a team infused with young talent to compete this year has turned the media firmly against Lance. Apologists point to injuries as the main factor in the Violators' disappointing season, but most people aren't buying that excuse. "It's always the same excuse, injuries!" declared an angry Curtis Grimm, radio host of the Virden Vibe. "Maybe if the coach put in more work during pre-season and hired a strength & conditioning coach like a normal team, injuries would be less of an issue!" With fan attendance down and the Press coverage mostly negative, it may be that the seat is getting too hot even for Virden's own Lance Barrate.

George Kaldis (*Durham*): this one comes as a shock. The winningest coach in EFL history, who has never had a losing season, is suddenly feeling the heat for what has been a truly star-crossed year. A second consecutive loss to hated division rival Cowtown seems to have been then tipping point. Even staunch Kaldis supporters like Sir Reginal Malcolm Clapham of the *Durham Diggatel & Pick* are now questioning his effectiveness: "One must wonder whether the players actually listen to their head coach anymore," he wrote yesterday. "Has his voice and message become so familiar that they no longer hear it?" The old "coach-is-getting-stale" argument is gentle compared with snide accusations that Kaldis is unable to win the big game. "He is a regular season coach, not a playoff coach," declared Tim Carplett, shock jockey host of *Durham Digs*, a local radio show. "And now it looks like he's no longer a regular season coach! <laughter> If you can't win the big game, why are you there?" The frustration in Durham lies in the fans sensing that their long anticipated and hoped for moment of glory is slipping away with an

ageing quarterback and wide receiver, declining secondary and a tired playbook. Nobody wants a rebuild, but that seems to be where the Lizards are headed after this year. Will **George Kaldis** be around for it?

Chris Ferraro (Mission Viejo): the manic head of Football Operations for the Monarchs oversees and approves all coaching decisions within the royal hierarchy of his staff. While technically not the Head Coach (that title belongs to Shane Falco), he directs everything, like some kind of "King Coach." He is also the team's owner. Nevertheless, he is in a tenuous position as another desultory season in Mission Viejo comes to a joyless end. Objectively, 2016 has seen a slight improvement in the bottom line over previous years; the team is on course for 6 or 7 wins. The difference this year is that fans expected more, much more. Whether the expectations were fair or not, it was Ferraro himself who built them up in his usual pompous style. "A Pretender no more, the Monarchs are Ready to Rule!" he declared passionately during his first press conference of the year. His claim was largely backed up by more objective independent media that saw a well-constructed offence and competitive talent in the front seven of the defence. The team failed to deliver on the field. It wasn't only that they lost games they expected to win; it was that they got blown out in some of those games. Unable to face the failure, Ferraro became a bit of an absentee King Coach. The near loss to Erieau betrayed apathy among the players that critics claim was instilled in them by their apathetic coach. It is certain that Ferraro will not relinquish the reins of control after this season, but with the peasants in a "pitchfork" mood these days; he may be forced to make some changes or face a public relations guillotine.

AROUND THE EFL

In Jurassic Park a boisterous and confident sellout crowd came to witness their Lizards exact revenge on the Corn Kings for a Week One loss that nobody saw coming, and probably should never have happened. A win would also be a shot in the arm for their post-season ambitions. But a strange turn of events in the 1st quarter foreshadowed an unexpected outcome. Cowtown appeared to draw first blood with a 49-yard field goal, but an offside penalty nullified the kick and pushed them out of field goal range. Instead of punting on 4th & 12 at 36, Coach Coghlin sent his offence on the field. The Durham secondary backed off and *Mike Evans* squirted underneath for a first down. The visitors went on to score a touchdown and a pall was cast over the crowd. *Drew Brees*, perhaps feeling the pressure of the crowd's discontent, fell into a panic. He threw two interceptions on the next two series, both forced throws, to set up two touchdowns for the Corn Kings. With 9 minutes remaining in the first half it was already 21-0 for Cowtown. The Lizards mounted a comeback, of sorts, but a *Tramaine Brock* interception of Brees at the Cowtown 2 yard line and two failed 4th down conversions, one in the red zone, put 2nd half advantages in time of possession and yards gained to waste. The Corn Kings held on and emerged with a surprise 21-14 victory, all but clinching a wild card berth in the process.

On a snowy day at the Dawg Pound in Markham the league's showcase match-up between the Aurora Mustangs and Markham North Stars quickly turned into a dawg's breakfast, so to speak. The Mustangs parlayed a big kick return, a fumble by *David Johnson*, a big pass play to *Anquan Boldin* and a brilliant 8-yard TD run by *Kenyan Drake* into a 21-0 lead by the midpoint of the 1st quarter to send the North Stars reeling in shock. Regaining their focus somewhat, the Stars responded with an epic, 22-play 88-yard drive starting from their own 11 yard line. Now do the math: 88+11=99. And guess where the drive ended. You are correct! The Stars were stymied at the 1 yard line after pushing the pigskin 4 yards in 4 plays from the Aurora 5 yard line. With the entire Aurora defence guarding against a 4th down run by *Tyrod Taylor*, *Brandon Marshall* dropped the pass in the end zone, the Stars came away with nothing and the **Fat Lady** in Row 54 had a seizure and had to be hoisted out of her seat to a waiting flatbed. That was the ball game. Their spirit broken for the second straight week, Markham went through the motions as the Mustangs trotted over their catatonic carcasses for a 27-0 victory.

At makeshift Optimist Park in Brooklin, the Hawks pulled ahead by a nose in the turbulent race for the East Division crown with a dramatic 24-21 victory over Carthage. As many pundits had predicted, the crazy Cannibals tore into the Hawks defence with abandon, making mistakes galore but also making big plays to jump out to a 21-7 half time lead. To their credit, the Hawks did not panic. Coach **Tom Jones** smartly played the mismatch between his offensive line and the Carthage defensive line and fired up the twin engines of *Jonathan Stewart* and *Ryan Mathews* to churn up 298 yards on the ground. But three missed field goals by *Zach Hocker* threatened to undo the game plan. Trailing 21-17 with 4 minutes remaining, the Hawks continued to pound the exhausted Carthage line even as they were running out of time. The strategy paid off at the 0:34 mark of the 4th with a dramatic 12-yard TD run by Mathews as the Cannibals' D finally collapsed.

At the Big House in Chino, the Convicts brought a bit of everything to bear in closing the door on the wheezing Patriots, 33-17. A big day by workhorse *Adrian Peterson* – 30 carries, 158 yards – stabilized the flow of the offence and enabled *Cam Newton* to have a signature day throwing for a TD here and running for a TD there. To top it off, the 'Lockdown Crew' made it presence felt with a 69-yard fumble recovery for a TD by *DeMarcus Ware*. While the Convicts appear to be settling down, the Pats appear to packing it in. While not out of the race, the *Blake Bortles* Offence does not appear to be a winner.

And finally, the Regulators' season hit a new low with a 17-16 loss to the Wrecking Balls at Stone Pony Shore. The game featured another **Hal Corson** coaching controversy. Despite capitalizing on the game's only turnover – a 39-yard pick-six by *Luke Kuechly* – the Regs could not sustain an attack, converting just 1 of 14 third down tries. *Brian Hoyer* out-dueled *Kirk Cousins*, slinging a perfect spiral to *Brian Hartline* for a 46-yard TD pass and the eventual game-winner. But did it have to end this way? With the Regs trailing by 1 and on the march with 2:00 remaining, Corson declined to call a timeout or hurry up his offence on the final drive. As a result, time expired as *Justin Tucker* scrambled to line up the game-winning field goal! Corson, who perhaps had no good explanation for this obvious gaffe, ducked out of the post-game press conference afterwards.



GAMES TO WATCH

BROOKLIN @ IOWA CITY (line – CUBS by 7)

INJURIES: Brooklin – Charles Johnson (OUT); **Iowa City** – None.

The Hawks have a one game lead in the East but they also have their work cut out for them to maintain that advantage. A trip to bone cold Joe Ferguson Stadium to face the hot-and-cold Cubbies, while the Chargers tackle the mushy Monarchs, could have them knocked back into a draw and needing a win in Week 15 to avoid irrevocably losing the tie-breaker to their expansion nemesis. One game at a time, they say. The already dangerous Hawks attack just got more lethal with the long-awaited return of Alshon Jeffery, giving Alex Smith four high-grade targets to choose from. On the down side, defensive end Charles Johnson is out for the remainder of the year. But seeing as the Hawks defence has been largely ineffective at keeping opponents off the board all season, his loss does not change the original prognosis that Brooklin will have to score its way to victory. That will be difficult – or easy – against the schizophrenic Iowa defence. With three shutouts and three 30+ point games on its resume, the Cubs' defence is an unknown in solving the pre-game equation. The Cubs have a precarious hold on the West Division, owning the third tie-breaker over LA, but feel the pressure to keep winning. If X (Cubs D) is greater than Y (Hawks O) expect an easy victory. **PICK: IOWA CITY**

MOHAVE @ LOS ANGELES (line – KNIGHTS by 6)

INJURIES: Mohave – Garrett Graham (QUESTIONABLE), Jay Ajayi (OUT), Pierre Thomas (OUT), Tim Wright (OUT); **Los** Angeles – Sean Lee (QUESTIONABLE), Le'Veon Bell (OUT), Robert Quinn (OUT).

It is the dawn of Week 14 and the Hellfire are in the playoff hunt; just one of many examples of how this year has been a strange one. Perhaps stranger is how the Knights have transformed from a one-trick dark pony into a legitimate contender to upend the Cubs in the West. This is good for football. But one of these success stories will take a sad turn after this week. The Hellfire is in the clear underdog position here. Yes, Ryan Fitzpatrick is capable of catching fire, but he is more likely set to flame out against the steady and punishing LA 'Blue Shield.' On the other side, Teddy Bridgewater faces no similar challenge against an unreliable Mohave defence that needs to take the ball away in order to stop anybody. Sir Teddy is coming off his worst outing of the year, one in which he failed to fully capitalize on a stunning five takeaways by his defence. He needs a bounce-back game here to quell the unfair criticism he endured for not being the first QB to beat the Triumph. Expect a measure of redemption. **PICK: LOS ANGELES**

ST. CHARLES @ MISION VIEJO (line – CHARGERS by 1)

INJURIES: St. Charles – Justin Ellis (OUT), Jimmy Graham (OUT); **Mission Vejo** – Larry DONNELL (OUT), Matt Forte (OUT), Kareem Jackson (OUT), Markus Kuhn (OUT), Cecil Shorts III (OUT), Donte Whitner (OUT), Gabe Wright (OUT).

The Monarchs came perilously close to being the first team to lose to the woeful Cadillac last week. They trailed at half time and did not gain the upper hand until late in the third quarter. A loss to Erieau would have signalled the death knell of an already depressingly unfulfilling season for the Kings. So why are they watchable this week? Well, they are technically still in the race for the last wild card spot that nobody seems to want. But more importantly, they are playing a Chargers team that can regain control of the East with a win here and a Brooklin loss. Having an expansion team leading a division after 14 weeks is more than noteworthy. Judging from the heavy Vegas action that has slowly moved the spread from the Monarchs to the upstarts, watching rookie Carson Wentz try to get them there is piquing widespread interest. In theory, the Monarchs have the talent edge to win this game by a touchdown. But the undeniable reality in practice is that they have rarely been impressive, even in victory. There is no compelling reason to expect them to suddenly snap out of their funk this week against a motivated Chargers squad. **PICK: ST. CHARLES**

GAMES OF NOTE

DURHAM @ AURORA (line – MUSTANGS by 8)

INJURIES: Durham – Dee Milliner (OUT), Xavier Su'a-Filo (OUT); Aurora – None.

This match-up would be a lot more interesting if there was more than a Tyrannosaurus Rex's chance in a meteor strike that the Thunder Lizards could make the post-season. Durham's near-fatal loss to Cowtown last week was their season in a nutshell: they looked like the stronger team, but they simply failed to execute at key moments. They made crucial errors and crippled themselves with penalties. Now they must win out to get into the post-season. The good news is that if they somehow manage to steal victories on the road here and at Sebastian, they come home to face Gwinnett with their fate in their own talons. The Mustangs are not in their usual comfort zone this year: it is already Week 14 and they have not locked up the South Division despite a two-game lead. Gwinnett has already beaten them this year and a rare season sweep would hand them the tie-breaker. However, Aurora can guarantee winning the Division if they win two out of their last three. They are fully healthy and playing for something. I see the Mustangs as a huge interstellar meteor about to make the Dinosaur's playoff hopes extinct – but it will be close. **PICK: DURHAM**

YORK @ MARKHAM (line – NORTH STARS by 6)

INJURIES: York – Delanie Walker (DOUBTFUL), Max Tuerk (OUT), Nate Washington (OUT); Markham – Stefon Diggs (OUT), Andre Ellington (OUT), Leon Hall (OUT), Tim Hightower (OUT).

Another team on the edge of playoff oblivion is York. With all tie-breaking scenarios going against them in the wild card race, their only way in is an unlikely, but possible, division win. A strange quirk in this year's schedule has pitted the Swords against the Stars in back-to-back weeks. IF (huge "if") York somehow manages a sweep, beats Pickering in the final week AND (massive "and") Markham somehow loses to New Jersey, the Excaliburs win the Atlantic Division. This scenario could put Markham out of the playoff picture entirely, depending on how the Corn Kings and Gladiators finish. Although the Stars have faltered against tough competition these past two weeks, it is unlikely that they will suffer a complete collapse down the stretch. Yes, the performance of Tyrod Taylor last week against Aurora is a cause for concern for their post-season prospects, but it was just one game in an otherwise impressive resumé so far in 2016. He will find the York corners much more cooperative than the pair of All Pros patrolling the edges of the Aurora secondary. When the Swords have the ball, Tom Brady will be keeping one eye on his blind side

for Cameron Jordan as he scans the field for his most credible receiving threat, Zach Ertz. With York's hopes resting on the Brady-to-Ertz combo, it could be a long day at the Dawg Pound and an easy division clinch for the Stars. **PICK: MARKHAM**

CHARLESWOOD @ VIRDEN (line – PATRIOTS by 2)

The Violators are relatively healthy – missing only two starters – but their partial physical recovery likely comes too late to save their season. They barely remain in the hunt for a wild card spot and the hope that remains is due to their hundrum conference competition, not to any anticipated accomplishments on their part. Similar sentiments can be expressed about Charleswood, a team with an offence that has not flourished under Blake Bortles. The Pats' defence, on the other hand, has credibility and is capable of getting them into the playoffs provided they keep playing teams like Virden. Fortunately for the reigning champs, they get two shots at their tired and demoralized provincial rivals before having to endure the Triumph in the final week. These two games are crucial for the Pats since they can expect no let up by the steadily improving Convicts, the team they have to catch. Despite an unimpressive season so far, expect Virden to win one of these two games – most likely this one. **PICK: VIRDEN**

COWTOWN @ GWINNETT (line – GLADIATORS by 6)

Many in the Cowtown media initially believed that the Corn Kings had clinched a wild card berth with their unpredicted road win over Durham. But technically, that is not true. If the Corn Cobs were to lose their final three games and the unlikely York division-winning scenario played out, the North Stars would win the tie-breaker with Cowtown based on record in common games. So it is not yet time to break out the whisky in Cowtown. The Glads currently enjoy the first seed wild card and retain an outside shot at the South Division, but both playoff scenarios would change with a loss here. Either team can clinch a wild card spot with a win so there will be no resting of starters yet. Both are hot: the Glads are winners of their last three while Cowtown is riding high after two tough road wins. These teams typically play each other close, regardless of who wins, so the sizeable line in favour of the home team looks like an opportunity to make a little mad money. The belief persists, however, that Cowtown is a bit of an illusion; while admiration for Big Ben is at an all-time high given his team's injury challenges this year. The Glads look like a good bet to cover, but a lot of money has been lost this year underestimating the Corn Kings. **PICK: COWTOWN**

CARTHAGE @ CHINO (line – CONVICTS by 9)

INJURIES: Carthage – Harrison Smith (PROBABLE); Chino – Spencer Long (QUESTIONABLE), Travaris Cadet (OUT).

The Cannibals are out of the playoff hunt but that doesn't mean they have packed it in. Playing spoiler is a more welcome consolation prize for the combative Kenny Main than it is for most coaches. He can make Convicts fans sweat out the final two weeks provided his feisty head-hunting savages can outscore a resurgent Cam Newton. The big man on the range in Chino is back in full form while stud Adrian Peterson is beginning to impose his will on opposing defences. This is bad news for the Cannibals' spoiler hopes, as a granny in a walker might be able to eke out a yard on 3rd & short against the Carthage D-line. If Carthage is to compete at all, let alone win, they will have to score, score; which means Marcus Mariota will need to be on his game. This is certainly possible against a Chino defence that has struggled to stop the pass. I say he keeps it close. **PICK: CARTHAGE**

HOLIDAY LEFTOVERS

ERIEAU @ TWIN CITIES (line – TRIUMPH by 23)

23-point betting lines do not come around often in the pro game and when they do they are extremely hard to resist – except in this instance. A 24-point "explosion" by the Cadillac in a losing effort against the Monarchs last week forces a pause to consider possible extra motivation in Erieau to avoid the winless tag in its first season. But one must also consider the Triumph's motivation to be the third team to complete the milestone of a perfect regular season. In any case, winning straight up – a foregone conclusion in favour of the Triumph – is not our issue. It is whether the Triumph can cover. If they wish to administer a Charger-like beating on the back-firing Cadillac, they will cover with ease. A more laid back approach could place the spread in jeopardy, especially if Kenny Britt gets lucky once or twice. It is difficult to turn away 23 points; but it is even more difficult to picture anything less than a total blowout by the Triumph at home against one of the worst teams in EFL history. **PICK: TWIN CITIES**

SCARBOROUGH @ TORONTO (line – BLUE EAGLES by 2)

The total and abject collapse of the Blue Eagles is bad enough to make you wonder what Vegas is smoking when they peg them as road favourites over a team that two weeks ago held the Mustangs to 10 points and last week almost pulled off an upset against the Spartans. The mystique of Aaron Rodgers continues to hang like poisonous swamp gas over the befuddled heads of millions, leading them to conclude that he is about to break out every week. I harbour no such misconceptions. I remain open to the possibility, but I base my calls 90% on probability and 10% on "feel." Right now I "feel" that the Eagles are a basket case, starting with Rodgers; and that Ryan Tannehill is looking more of a legend for getting the most out of a motley gaggle of receivers in Expansion Land. Expect to see a thoroughly rattled Scarborough squad fall all over themselves. **PICK: TORONTO**

The Wrecking Balls carved themselves a tiny niche in EFL history by becoming the first team to ever win back-to-back games by the unusual score of 17-16. They are hoping to make it three straight 17-16 victories against a Spartans team now thoroughly demoralized by their irrelevance. Any Spartans resistance to the Wrecking Ball steamroller will be due to reflex borne of their coach's natural defiance and to their fear of falling below expansion New Jersey in the standings. For Jeff Cohen, he sees an opportunity for his team finish out of the basement and earn some "street cred" in the local football community. I thought Brian Hoyer looked pretty good against a better defence in South Carolina. I am betting he keeps it close here. **PICK: NEW JERSEY**

SEBASTIAN @ SOUTH CAROLINA (line - SWORDFISH by 10)

The Regulators are in the quiet death throes of a lost season. Officially eliminated after a lacklustre effort against New Jersey, the only thing left to play for is a spectacular, if purely symbolic, upset of the Swordfish in order to prevent a wholesale bailing of season ticket holders. But a win here would not be enough to fully repair the damage to the Regulator brand. Kirk Cousins has been targeted by the local media after being lauded early in the season. Luke Kuechly is being questioned as a leader and Hal Corson criticized for not being more creative with the game plan. Most of the criticism is unfair, but the effect is visibly wearing down the football operation anyway. The Swordfish like this winning thing....and like to win by a lot. **PICK: SEBASTIAN**





FROM THE EFL ARCHIVES – Week 13 of the 2010 EFL season witnessed the direst threat yet to the Dragons' quest for a perfect season. While the Week Four 34-31 victory over Pickering in OT had been close, and possibly the best game of the year, the 2009 Championship re-match with LA in Week 13 was even closer, although far from a classic of football execution. This game was full trench warfare, brutal and unyielding, just the way the Knights liked it. In the end, *Ryan Longwell* kept the drive for perfection on course with a 49-yard FG at the 7:11 mark of the OT fame to give the

Dragons a 16-13 victory. All things being equal, the outcome would certainly have been different if *Kurt Warner* had not been injured. Leading the charge offensively for LA was the inexperienced *Jimmy Clausen*, who looked it with a 110-yard passing day and a 40.7 QB rating. The Knights, looking doomed to miss the post-season this year, seemed to throw everything they had into avenging last year's loss in the Gale Sayers Game. They came oh so close. Close enough to call it a true *moral* victory.

Coincidentally, on the other side of the continent in Pickering, the league's other powerhouse had its hands full trying to subdue a stubborn Virden squad emboldened by being the beneficiaries of 4 Spartans turnovers! In the end, the magic legs of *Chris Johnson* compensated for the stiff arm of *Brett Favre* to secure a 20-13 victory. Johnson won it with a 6-yard run with 4:44 left and set a new EFL rushing TD record (26) in the process. Johnson would add one more to that total by the end of the season to set a record (27) that still stands today.

Around the rest of the league, wild card races were drawing little interest as it was already apparent that the teams that "won" would be certainly knocked out in the first round.
