45-yard bomb and a 10-yard TD pass to Rishard Matthews, to begin a day of total dominance. With Jordan Howard knocked out, the Eagles were held to just 69 total yards and eight 1st downs. Matthews caught 2 TD passes and the Triumph held the ball for 37 mins.

DeShaun Watson threw 3 TD passes and Aqib Talib returned an INT 46 yards to give the Pats a 24-7 lead with 0:13 left in the 1st half. Drew Brees hit TY Hilton on a 55-yard bomb with 0:01 left to make it 24-14. The momentum carried into the 3rd, with Durham scoring two TDs to take the lead. Jamie Collins made it 31-28 Pats on a pick-six, but with 0:24 left, Brees and Hilton hooked for a 25-yard TD to win it.

With the Fish loaded to stop the run Derek Carr fired deep over the middle to Amari Cooper for a 64-yard TD pass to start a 27-point Virden 1st half barrage. The presence of Ezekiel Elliott as a focus of the Sebastian D was a factor in allowing Carr to exploit a vulnerable secondary for 242 yards and 3 TDs and help build a 37-point lead by the 4th quarter. The Fish added two late TDs to break the shutout.

Julius Thomas' first catch of the season went 31 yards and set up a 2-yard TD run by LeGarrette Blount for the game's opening score. The teams traded FGs in a tight 2nd quarter to make it 10-3 Cowtown at the half. On the first drive of the 2nd half, Joe Flacco converted a 4th down then hit Mike Evans on a long cross for a 33-yard TD, the first of 2 for him in a 3rd quarter turning point against the Caddies.

NJ capped an 83-yard opening drive with a 16-yard TD pass to Amara Darboh then the Cubs evened the score with 4th & 1 15-yard TD pass to Margise Lee. The NJ offence moved the ball, but turnovers – including a forced fumble and 62-yard return for a TD by Jamar Taylor – led to 2 Cubs' TDs and a 21-7 lead. Two stands, on the goal line and at the 4-yard line held off the Balls' comeback.

The teams traded 9 punts each in a heavy down pour at Camelot. The Knights struggled most in the slippery conditions, turning the ball over 3 times in the 1st half. But the Swords managed only a FG thanks to a Kenny Vaccaro end zone pick of Brady. With York leading 6-3 with 2:28 left, Andy Dalton led the game's only TD drive, finding DeVante Parker from 13 yards out for the winning TD.

In his first start since an injury in Week One, Brian Hoyer moved the offence but turned the ball over twice inside the Chino 10-yard line; including a devastating 4th quarter pick by Kiko Alonso with 2:31 left in the game. Meanwhile the Convicts converted 3 trips to the red zone in to 3 TDs, a 10-yard QB draw and 2 TD passes from Dak Prescott, to Marvin Jones Jr and Greg Olson, to nail the upset.

A pick by Marhson Lattimore and a 40-yard pass to Phillip Dorsett set up a Luke Willson 1-yard TD run that broke up a 3-3 tie in the 2nd. Philip Rivers struck back before half time with a 36-yard TD pass to Zay Jones to even the score. The teams traded TD passes on their first series of the 2nd half to make it 17-17 before a 62-yard Devonta Freeman run set up the eventual game-winning FG.

Marcus Mariota was knocked out in the 2nd qrt but the Bombers did not miss a beat with back-up Nick Foles. He threw 3 TD passes, including a 59-yard deep slant to Terrelle Pryor, to allow his team to pull away after falling behind 14-10. The Regs started strong on a Samaje Perine 59-yard run to set up the first TD and a Corey Davis 37-yard TD catch, but the offence went silent in the 2nd half.



NEW YORK – In 2017, the Year of the Fire Rooster, people in general were supposed to be politer and less stubborn. Frankly, I saw no evidence of a change in society's mood. People on the streets of New York appeared tenser than ever. Our public figures, on both sides of the political divide, continued to behave disgracefully. Our foreign policy continued to be belligerent. Our agenda-driven mainstream media continued to report innuendo and gossip using rhetorical tricks to prompt naïve readers to accept them as facts. The casualty counts of our mass shootings hit a new high. We appeared to be on course, more than once, to declare war on both North Korea and Iran and then, not. About the only thing that consistently went right in 2017 was the rise of the stock market – which either means that we are heading for a crash in 2018; or the smart money likes something about the direction of the Trump Administration.

So, with its predictive reputation somewhat battered here in the United States (I can't speak for what happened in China in 2017), I nevertheless turn to the Chinese Zodiac in an attempt to figure out what's in store for society and the EFL in 2018. In the case of the latter, it's worth a shot, as traditional football indicators no longer appear to be working.

2018 is the Year of the Dog. The dog is a good friend to Man (species "man," not gender "man," so relax you politically correct dweebs!). Perhaps, as many claim, the dog is Man's *best* friend. So, in a year ruled by Man's Best Friend I am expecting some pretty damn good fortune to come the world's way in 2018. Perhaps a bank bailout of the average American's record debt will be implemented – as a Thank You to the American taxpayer for bailing the banks out in 2008. If some banks are "to big to fail," an entire nation of 323 million people must surely be as well. *Ahhhh*....a man can dream can't he?

In terms of football, the message is clear: 'dogs will rule. The problem is: figuring out which teams are actually the underdogs. There are a lot of fakes out there; like the rebounding Twin Cities and Durham squads, who both appear ready to make a push after playing possum or most of the first half of the season. Would either of those *technical* underdogs truly surprise if they were to make noise in the post-season? I know I wouldn't be surprised. Of course, I may have the wrong sports "dog" in mind here. Although, traditionally, "dogs' in sports are thought of as "underdogs," perhaps the Year of the Dog will be ruled by the Top Dogs. In that case, there appears to be just one of those: Aurora. But they are mustangs, not dogs. Seeing as the closest thing to a dog nickname in the EFL is the Wolverines however, the Mustangs may have to serve as honorary dogs this year – after all, horses (the broken-in kind) are friendly and useful to Man as well.

It's turning into a Fool's Game trying to make sense of this current EFL season, and Week 11 did not make things any easier. And while I have made a bit of a fortune posing as a fool, I tend to shed the image when things get serious. We are heading into "crunch time" in the playoff race and it s a crowded pack at full gallop behind Aurora. From here on in, I'm just calling it like Race Caller at the Kentucky Derby, without trying to predict which horse will lose a shoe or "Seabiscuit" us in the final stretch. So, let's look at Week 11......

TYMVP

It was a wild and wacky game at Jurassic Park that ended as improbably as it was played with a 35-34 win for Durham. This is one that ultimately the Pats let get away; and, with it, any reasonable shot at a playoff spot. Conversely, if the Thunder Lizards eventually find their way into the playoffs, this game could very well be looked back upon as a microcosm of their season.

The signs of strangeness came early in this one when *Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie* picked off *DeShaun Watson* on the Pats' second series and fumbled the ball during the return. Ethan Pocic recovered for Charleswood and five plays later *Mohamed Sanu* turned an innocent-looking short hitch into a 39-yard touchdown pass to make it 7-0.


A flustered *Drew Brees* tried to get it back all at once with a couple of deep attempts looking for his security blanket *TY Hilton* but the Pats were ready and Durham was soon forced to punt. On the ensuing Pats' possession, the Lizards forced another turnover when *Kam Chancellor* punched the ball out of Watson's arms during a scramble and *Richard Sherman* recovered at the Pats' 26. But Durham squandered its opportunity when Brees promptly threw an interception, with *Aqib Talib* snaring the pass tipped by safety *HaHa Clinton-Dix* and returning it 46 yards to the Durham 28. Two plays later, Watson, looking like the Brees of 2012, threw a perfect touch pass on a fly to *Sammy Watkins* for a 31-yard touchdown to make it 14-0.

Durham returned fire with a pair of completions to Hilton for 43 yards and a pair of *Carlos Hyde* runs of 16 and 10 yards, with the latter finding the end zone. But the Pats' *DeShaun Watson* engineered a determined drive, mostly through the air

into the teeth of the Lizards' defence, to regain the two-TD advantage on an 11-yard short hitch to *Duke Johnson Jr*. Watson then set up a late field goal with a 47-yard pass to Sanu to make it 24-7 Pats with just 0:21 left in the first half.

The fans at Jurassic Park howled in discontent, even as Brandon Langley returned the largely symbolic kickoff 43 yards to the Durham 45. They booed particularly loudly as Brees stepped under center with just 0:13 left some of them probably hoping he would not attempt a pass, in order to avoid an interception. And then the next strange thing happened: The Pats sent their base 4-3 onto the field to face a nearly certain kneel down or passing situation, perhaps prompted by the Lizards sending a two-back set onto the field. But anyone who knows Durham's tendencies knows that they don't need a third or fourth WR on the line in order to throw to the player who really matters. Having Tyler Boyd as an option would only serve as a distraction from the sole imperative to find TY Hilton in space. It was odd enough that the Pats chose to deploy only 4 corners, but the apparent decision to key on Carlos Hyde was truly baffling. As Brees dropped back, the Pats' front seven stuck to their lanes, and their corners peeked into the Durham backfield, TY Hilton jetted in front of Aqib Talib on a deep post route and Brees did not miss this time. He hit Hilton perfectly, allowing him to run through a glancing desperation blow by Talib and rocket into the end zone for a 55-yard TD pass play with just 1 second remaining on the clock. In the space of 12 seconds the Lizards went from looking dead in the water to having new life, down just two scores heading into the half. The approving fans, apparently forgetting their mood mere seconds before, cheered giddily as Phil Dawson nailed the point after. They perhaps sensed that they had just witnessed a turning point.

In retrospect, they had. The Lizards rode the momentum they had built with that improbable last play of the first half into the 3rd quarter. They scored on their first possession of the half and took the lead 5 minutes later after the second interception by Rodgers-Cromartie set up the

offence at the Charleswood 36-yard line. **TY Hilton** finished off that drive with a 16-yard catch-and-run through the Pats' zone to make it 28-24 Lizards. Jurassic Park was abuzz as fans chanted "T-Y-M-V-P! T-Y-M-V-P!" The genetically-engineered, dinosaur cyborg, **Raptorius Blaster**, Durham's mascot, simultaneously horrified and delighted the sell-out crowd by bounding across the field and into the stands with impossible speed, pretending to engulf the heads of players and fans alike with its huge, powerful jaws before pulling back at the last second. Nobody could be certain that the electronic device used to control the creature remotely from the press box would not short-circuit or lose its signal, and that made every playful mock head chomping thrilling.

Things appeared to be going Durham's way as certainly as the Pats had looked in control before the final play of the half. On this day, that was a warning sign. The Durham defence forced a demoralized Pats' offence into a three-and-out and Brees took over at his own 9-yard line. He wasted no time returning to his magic man. On the first play he looked for Hilton on a short slant. But Pats' linebacker *Jamie Collins* was ready for it and picked it off on the run, bringing it in untouched for a pick-six. The roller coaster ride continued for the Durham faithful as the Pats were suddenly alive again and in front, 31-28. Boos rained down on the field as the Lizards followed up with a three-and-out and a few disgusted fans, unable to witness any more, started to leave the stadium with over 10 minutes remaining after watching Brees throw the ball straight into the arms of Charleswood safety, *Mark Barron*, on the next series for his third interception of the game. That turnover set up a 28-yard *Ryan Succop* field goal and put the Lizards behind by a converted touchdown with 5:13 remaining in the game.

The drive that followed was a white-knuckler the whole way, for both teams. Things did not start well for the Lizards. With the Pats in high gear and gunning for the quarterback, the Durham offensive line was flagged three times for holding, the second of of those wiping out a 3rd & 1 conversion and the third setting up a 3rd & 16 from the Durham 16-yard line after a Charleswood offsides

penalty. With the Pats flooding the secondary with 7 DBs, Brees found Hilton up the seam for an 18-yard completion and a first down. Two plays later he hit Hilton on a slant for 14 yards. After an 11-yard run by *Carlos Hyde* brought them to the Pats' 41 and yet another holding call pushed them back to their own 49, Brees hit Hilton for 8 yards on 1st & 20 which set the stage for an eventual 3rd & 3 conversion by Hyde. Then, with 0:59 seconds left and the ball on the Pats' 27, Durham called a timeout. This would certainly be their last possession of the game and time was now a factor. On 2nd & 10 Brees once again found Hilton on a slant for 12 yards to the Pats' 15-yard line, but on the next snap their fifth holding penalty of the drive pushed them back to the 25. Facing 1st & 20 with just 0:35 left in the game, Brees dropped back and surveyed a field crawling with Patriot defensive backs in straight 'man' coverage. Talib cheated a little to the deep side as Hilton streaked toward the end zone. But just before he reached the goal line, he turned around abruptly just in time to snare a high-flying missile from his quarterback. The force of the throw pushed a leaping Hilton backwards and he fell across the goal line for a touchdown. The fans at Jurassic Park exploded in joy. All was forgiven in that moment. The magic of the Brees-to-Hilton connection had made things "right" again. All that remained was for their erratic kicker to finish the job. Dawson made no mistake on the extra point, making it 35-34, a score that held up with just 0:24 seconds left for Durham's sixth win of the year.

It was an amazing win for Durham made possible by two amazing things. The first was the play of Brees and Hilton in the clutch. If the Lizards go on to salvage their season the second part of that duo has to be in the running for MVP. The second was that the Pats' did not double-cover Hilton even once the entire game. They left Talib on an island to fend for himself. He did his part, limiting Hilton to 10 catches in a whopping 20 targets and picking off a pass in the process. But his effectiveness dwindled as the game progressed, a factor of the physical toll of trying to mirror a jet-propelled water-bug like Hilton all by himself. A little help might have made a big difference on that final drive. Maybe I would be writing now about *Cooper Kupp...*.

AROUND THE EFL

The Week Eleven slate was riddled with another raft of unbearable clunkers. But one of those drew a lot of attention for the completeness of the victory and role reversal of what had been initially expected from the protagonists.

At Bluffs Stadium in Scarborough a sellout crowd watched in stunned silence as the Triumph thoroughly humiliated the Blue Eagles on both sides of the ball by the score of 27-0. With rare goodwill and optimism from the typically surly Scarborough crowd permeating the air prior to the game, it was like a cruel joke to then watch the home team's offence totally derail and its prized secondary careen frantically around the field in confusion at a Triumph game plan replete with the likes of *Shane Vereen*, *Charles Clay* and *James White*. Where was *Antonio Brown*? He was there, but more of a decoy than a weapon until he was knocked out of the game entirely in the 4th quarter. In his place, the money shots went to *Rishard Matthews*, who opened the game with a 45-yard bomb and hauled in TD passes of 10 and 12 yards in the 1st half. As for the Scarborough offence, *Jordan Howard* came out of the game after his second carry when he twisted his knee slipping on the sandy Bluffs turf. With no running threat and the Triumph playing nickel-pass all the way, *Aaron Rodgers* looked a lot like a svelte version of *Ryan Leaf*, finishing with 95 yards passing, 1 interception and a game day QB rating of 37.5. Actually, Leaf has had better games...Does this mean the Triumph are back and the Eagles are scrap? Heck, I never saw this one coming, so I am going to reserve judgement until I see how they both rebound.

At the Big House in Chino, the quarterbacks played pivotal roles in their teams' fortunes as the Convicts surprised the North Stars, 21-18. Despite being outmuscled in the trenches the Convicts found a way to convert their opportunities into touchdowns thanks to several key plays by *Dak Prescott*. He set up a perfect screen to *Christian McCaffery* that went for 42 yards then ran it into the end zone two plays later from 10 yards on a designed QB draw for Chino's first TD. In the second half he capped the other two good Chino drives with TD passes to finish with a hand in all three of his team's scores. On the other side, *Brian Hoyer* got the offence moving well in between the 20s, but turned the ball over twice: the first a fumble at the Chino 5-yard line that denied them points before half time, and the second a 4th quarter interception at the Convicts' 3-yard line with 2:28 left in the game during their attempted comeback. Sensing a controversy, *Tyrod Taylor* standing on the sideline, with clipboard in hand, was the media's most filmed player of the game.

I noted a general trend in Week Eleven that will have fans of certain front-runners worried. The Brooklin Hawks, Iowa City Cubs and Pickering Spartans all struggled to put down the three sickest teams in the league.

In Toronto, the woeful Wolverines intercepted ball control specialist *Alex Smith* twice and forced a *Ryan Mathews* fumble to stay close in a game that should have been over by half time. Despite losing *Ryan Tannehill* early in the contest and his back-up *Matt Moore* getting sacked 6 times and pressured all day, Toronto somehow managed to get close enough, often enough, for the spasmodic leg of *Zane Gonzalez* to kick four field goals in a 20-12 loss.

At Stone Pony Shore in New Jersey, the Wrecking Balls dominated the Cubs on the line of scrimmage and on the stat sheet in almost every category but the score in a 24-14 Cubs win. Despite 390 yards from the much-maligned New Jersey offence, a 41 to 19 advantage in minutes of possession, and their defence holding the Cubs to just 11 first downs and 204 yards of offence, the game turned tragically against the Wrecking Balls on a 41-yard pass interference penalty in the end zone that set up a TD; a *Jamar Taylor* fumble recovery and 62-yard return for a touchdown; and a goal line stand by the Cubs at the end of the third quarter.

At the Kingdome in Seattle, mercifully far away from the hospital bed of Spartans coach **Gus Konstantakos** (who is still recovering from his head blowing up in New Jersey two weeks ago), Pickering found themselves tied 17-17 with the Pilots late in the 3rd quarter. This simple fact, regardless of how it came to be, would have killed the Spartans coach had he been there. But the steady **General Pausanias** kept his players from panicking. **Devonta Freeman** soon burst free for a 62-yard run to set up what would prove to be the winning field goal and the defence shut down the Pilots "attack" in the 4th quarter for a 23-17 Pickering win.

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

The Lizards most dominant single game performance this season came in Week One against the Corn Kings. Now ten weeks have passed and these appear to be two completely different teams. Injuries and an erratic Drew Brees were factors in making Durham look weak in victory. They are coming off a crazy win where the only impressive thing about it was TY Hilton. But he was really impressive, taking over the game in the second half to rescue his QB. Since falling ignominiously to Toronto in Week Four, Cowtown has put together a robust 5-2 stretch against some stiff competition. Concerns about Joe Flacco were mitigated somewhat by last week's precision performance against Erieau, but the Durham defence is a different animal (a dinosaur actually); one that mauled him in Week One. Expect Flacco to get a quick hook in favour of Jimmy Garoppolo if things don't start well. The newly confident Corn Kings can vault into a wildcard spot with a win here. Expect them to even the score. **PICK: COWTOWN**

Although fighting for different prizes, these are two evenly-matched teams who both need to keep winning – Virden to stay ahead of a resurgent Triumph; and Chino to catch the red-hot Knights. The Violators are, as usual, banged up on the offensive line, but don't expect that to hurt them much with league-leading rusher Ezekiel Elliot busting tackles and Derek Carr getting the ball out quickly. The Chargers charged smack into the brick wall of reality last week against Aurora. The team we thought they were showed up and more as they were trampled by the Mustangs in both phases of the game. But it took the league's hottest team to expose them and, while the Hellfire are on a hot-streak of their own as winners of five of their last six, they are no Aurora. Mohave sits one game back of a wildcard berth, chasing LA at the moment. The Chargers remain in the hunt but must start their push right now if they hope to have a fair chance down the stretch. When these teams met back in Week One, a 4th quarter TD drive engineered by Carson Wentz wound up being the difference on a day when both offences sputtered. looks like a kitten the next. With Antonio Brown out, Melvin Gordon listed as "doubtful," Doug Martin out, and Orleans Darkwa called up from the grocery-bagging squad to start at running back, it is hard to envision the Triumph stealing this game on the road against the mostly healthy West Division-leading Cubs. Still considered by many to be the team to beat in the Pacific Conference, the Cubs have not roared much in victory. But if they don't win this one by a touchdown there is a problem. **PICK: IOWA CITY**

When a team is a touchdown favourite on the road against a team that can bite like the Spartans, it is a sign that money takes that team seriously. At 11-0 and looking stronger every week, the Mustangs are without a doubt the class of the league in a year when their top competitors have been bruised more than once. Having already clinched the South Division, they are playing for home field advantage and history – hoping to become the first team to post two perfect seasons. If the Mustangs are going to lose a game this year, this one is the most likely of those left on their schedule. The Spartans currently have a tenuous hold on a playoff spot and any misstep will resonate as they face a tough schedule down the stretch. They will be motivated and bringing their 'A' game, something we have not seen much of since Week Four. The question is whether a Spartans' 'A' game can stack up against a Mustangs' 'B' game. An Aurora let up is the only scenario favouring Pickering and the 'Stangs show no signs of letting up. **PICK: AURORA**

But appearances can be deceptive in the free-for-all Central Division, where a 9-7 record could ultimately win it. The Pats' backs are against the wall, however, and it is unfortunate for them that they are visiting the hottest team in the Conference this week. The Knights have not always looked hot during their six-game winning streak but this is a reflection of their stuttering offence, which looks good statistically but tends to misfire at critical moments. The 'Blue Shield' has held firm when needed, bailing out Andy Dalton on his off-days and sustaining team morale. This defence is good enough on its own to beat the DeShaun Watson Offence. And while the Knights' offence is not usually scintillating, it will get more than enough opportunities. **PICK: LOS ANGELES**

With essentially nothing to play for but a vestige of pride, both these teams may still prize a win in order to avoid the tag of "worst team in the EFL" and offer a glimmer of hope to their demoralized fan bases. Expect them to go at each other like cats and dogs, even if it looks like kittens and pups. As for the game, both defences are capable and overmatch their opponents' offences, which means a low-scoring contest. Both Ds feature tough front sevens, but the Erieau pass rush is likely to be the difference-maker in severely limiting Eli Manning's passing options. It will be Kareem Hunt vs Jordy Nelson in the big play contest, with "big play" meaning anything that helps find the end zone. If you like good defences beating up poor offences – tune in. **PICK: ERIEAU**

Both teams are coming off bad games. But, for Scarborough, the sting of being shutout at home and gaining just 69 yards of total offence in the process is still being felt. Jordan Howard went down early in that game, which should tell you how vital he is to the Blue Eagles' attack. He is listed as "doubtful" this week and brows are furrowing in the Scarborough media as TJ Yeldon and Corey Clement trade first team reps in practice. The Swordfish will likely have CJ Anderson back at running back, which will add depth to the offence. A strong dose of the running game is probably needed, as Jameis Winston did not fare well against the Scarborough secondary in Week One. Still, don't put it past Russ Lemmon to challenge the elite Scarborough corners in the belief that the equally elite Odell Beckham Jr and his sidekick Doug Baldwin will make a play or two. They just might! **PICK: SEBASTIAN**

The various permutations that would enable the Wolverines to make the playoffs are too complex to list. But the team is still alive and must win all of its remaining games, while also getting help, to pull it off. The Excaliburs, at 4-7, are just technically alive in the Coastal Division race but still have a viable shot at the wildcard if they can put a few wins together. The York offence, while not terribly inefficient, has struggled to score thanks to turnovers and a red zone TD efficiency rate of 34% - third worst. The Wolverines defence, while statistically the worst overall, is second in takeaways, which has kept them in games. Matt Moore will start at QB for Toronto – he is a wildcard that could tip the offence in either direction. Go with Tom Brady and the better D. **PICK: YORK**

Ben Roethlisberger being listed as "questionable" makes calling this game trickier than it would normally be. As bad as Big Ben has been for most of 2017, he is better than the two alternatives on the bench for Georgia. A graphic illustration of this would be last week, when the Glads gave up only 7 points but still lost. The Wrecking Balls defence has been playing at a playoff level over the past three weeks, but the team is not getting rewarded due to the ineptitude of the offence. Although Sam Bradford probably deserved better last week against the Cubs, he is the main culprit in an offence that has averaged just 13 points per game and has generated a mere 4 plays of 25 yards or more – second worst in the league. Still, something has to break New Jersey's way this year and expect it to be this week a wounded Glads squad. **PICK: NEW JERSEY**

The second coming of the Brian Hoyer-led Budapest offence posted big yardage numbers last week, as anticipated, but the Stars lost anyway thanks in large part to Hoyer doing something that Tyrod Taylor doesn't do very often: turn the ball over at the critical moment. The risk-reward element to Hoyer's game must be resolved by the coaching staff before heading into tough competition, but for this week it is unlikely to have a negative impact. The Regulators are getting gouged on the ground and torched through the air and the offence cannot keep up. Losers of six-in-a-row, the Regs are effectively out of the playoff picture even if they technically remain in the hunt. They are playing out the string with a minimum of enthusiasm and it will show this week. **PICK: BUDAPEST**





FROM THE EFL ARCHIVES – At the end of Week 11 of the 2011 EFL season mighty *Joe Flacco* topped the list of league passers, with 2,876 yards, 24 TD passes and an impressive 104.7 QB rating. This, and the 9-2 Cowtown record, were finally developing into the stories of the year. Sure, the Blue Eagles were still drawing a lot of media attention – for the wrong reasons – as they floundered embarrassingly in their new home. Of course, everyone was also interested in what the Spartans, last year's champs, were up to without *Brett Favre* at QB. And let's not forget Knights Fever, brought on not by their dominant defence, but by the

offence they had never had, led by darling *Josh Freeman*. But the real shocker was the Corn Kings – a team that had been 3-13 the year before and had shown no pre-season signs of improving significantly on that dismal record.

As with any unlikely winning streak, a few good breaks are vital and Cowtown got one in Week 11 when the 2-9 Regulators decided to bet on their defence by taking three straight knees at their 45-yard line while leading 19-16 with 1:41 left. Cowtown used all 3 of their TOs to preserve the clock and got the ball back at their 28 with 1:32 left. It took Flacco 1:26 to get into FG range to tie the game and just 4:08 of OT to win it as the Corn Kings survived a scare, 22-19.

Another notable Week 11 match-up saw the 10-1 Spartans dismantle the 7-4 Blue Eagles using the ground game. *Chris Johnson* and *Rashad Jennings* combined for 178 yards and 2 TDs while the Spartans defence forced 3 turnovers in a 20-14 victory.

Finally, following the teams that the media cared about most the LA Knights stemmed a two-game losing streak by taking care of York, 23-17. *Jamaal Charles* rushed for 173 yards and *Josh Freeman* threw 2 TDs in the victory.
