

Two missed extra points ended up the difference in a dramatic come-from-behind Cubs' win. Mohave built up a 22-13 lead by early in the 4th, the balance coming on 2 Tevin Coleman TD runs. But a 45-yard Justin Tucker FG followed by a Mohave 3-and-out set the scene for a classic Russell Wilson 67-yard game-winning TD drive that ended with a 6-yard TD pass to Mike Wallace with 0:26 left.

a 20-13 lead on their first drive of the 3<sup>rd</sup>. Chino moved the ball but got just a FG while turning it over on downs 3 times in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half.

Marshon Lattimore picked off Marcus Mariota on the opening series to set up a FG and an early 3-0 Seattle lead. The Pilots' D held the Bombers to 2 FGs in the 1st half while adding a score on a 28-yard fumble return by Lattimore to lead 9-6. But an Artie Burns pick on the 1st series of the 2nd half set up a Mariota TD run and Bruxelles never looked back, adding 2 TD passes to finish off the win.

A medium hitch to back-up TE, OJ Howard for 38-yards set up a 7-yard TD run by DeShaun Watson for a 10-0 Pats lead. A daring 4th &10 gamble at their own 24 backfired when Demarcus Lawrence sacked Matt Stafford to set up a FG to make it 13-0 Pats. A 53-yard punt return TD in the 3<sup>rd</sup> by Jalen Richard swelled the Pats lead to 20-0. Erieau marred the shutout with a late TD pass to Jordy Nelson.

Melvin Gordon dominated the first 2 Triumph drives, taking a pitch 9 yards and snaring a 3-yard dump-off for a pair of TDs. The Violators answered with a Mark Ingram TD but needed an end zone pick by Eric Berry to save a score. Rishard Matthews broke a fly for a 72-yard TD and Kyle Williams sacked Derek Carr for a safety to provide a cushion to blunt a 10-point Virden surge in the 4th.

Toronto drew first blood with an interception by Will Compton setting up a Mike Gillislee 10-yard TD run. A PI penalty on 3rd down set up a 7-yard TD pass to Pierre Garcon then a 50-yard off-tackle run by Jordan Howard gave the Eagles a 14-7 lead. Toronto recovered an onside kick to start the 2<sup>nd</sup> half and drove for a FG, but Tannehill was picked by Landon Collins in the endzone with 3:31 remaining.

The lead changed hands 5 times over three quarters before the Mustangs began to pull away after a Jason McCourty pick of James Winston at the Sebastian 41 set up a 7-yard TD pass to Davante Adams for a 36-22 Aurora lead. With Aurora ahead by 17, Winston fired 2 TD passes in a 3-minute span to pull within 3. But Matt Ryan's 5th TD pass made it 46-36 and the Fish could not answer further.

Ben Roethlisberger was 5-of-5 on the opening drive that ended with Matt Asiata scoring off-tackle from 6 yards out. Cowtown countered with LeGarrette Blount busting a 43-yard run and finishing it off with a 4th & inches plunge across the line. Cairo Santos kicked a FG to make it 10-7 at the half. Garoppolo led the final game-winning drive that saw Blount score from 4 yards with 0:26 left.

A bad 1st half for both offences but very bad for the Spartans as Philip Rivers gets picked, surrenders a safety and fumbles in three straight series. A 2nd Rivers pick sets up a NJ FG with 0:02 left in the 1st half for a 5-0 lead. A 35-yard TD pass to Zay Jones on 4th & 10 to start the 3rd turned the momentum. Golden Tate made it a two-score game with a 28-yard TD in the 4th and the Spartans held on.

David Johnson chugged 35 yards off right tackle and Tim Hightower took it in from 7 yards to give Budapest a 7-0 lead off their 1st series. After a Forbath FG made it 10-0, Tom Brady offered resistance with a 7-of-9 drive ending with a TD to Quinton Patton. But the Stars ground out an 8-minute drive for a TD to start the 2<sup>nd</sup> half and added another TD on their next series to walk away with the win.

In an error—filled 1st half, 3 picks in 10 attempts got Drew Brees pulled in favour of Cam Newton, who responded by throwing a 12yard TD pass to TY Hilton to make the score 14-3 Lizards. Kirk Cousins was no better, picked off twice and fumbling once to hold his team to just 3 points in the 1st half. A reinstated Brees threw a TD to Tyler Boyd to start the 3rd and Durham coasted to the win.

My Smart Play for Week 9, **Mike Wallace** (17FP), had a good day as expected, reviving **Russell Wilson**'s(22FP) flagging numbers of late.

When picking defences, follow the offences: the top three this week, **Charleswood Defence** (17FP), **Durham Defence** (17FP) and **Bruxelles Defence** (15FP), each faced low-ranking or struggling offences.

**Cam Newton** (17FP) came out of nowhere in relief of **Drew Brees** (7FP) to finish 7<sup>th</sup> overall in the QB category on just 29 snaps. He gained more yards rushing than passing. Don't expect this to be a regular substitution.

There were no long FGs (50+) in Week 9. More teams are gambling on 4<sup>th</sup> & short outside the 32-yard line, but long legs like **Justin Tucker** (11FP) are still valuable.





NEW YORK – My long-time readers may recall that I tend to become unsettled during Week Nine; precisely why this is so escapes me. Possibly the change in weather from crisp, exhilarating Fall, to the dankest chill of 1-degree above freezing just prior to the first snowfall has something to do with it. Perhaps I'm just worried that I have not started my Christmas shopping yet. Perhaps it is because there is no natural milestone associated with Week Nine upon which to fix one's bearings or sharpen one's creativity, other than it being simply "Week Nine" – the first week after the halfway point of the season. Perhaps, in the case of this particular football season, the halfway point has already rendered its verdict on the shape of the post-season; and it is a depressingly familiar one.

A few faces at the top of the pack have changed, but the song remains the same. Two teams are pre-destined to compete for the Atlantic Conference crown and it should be obvious by now that they will be Scarborough and Aurora, with the latter ultimately prevailing. Budapest will make a lot of noise but will be eliminated by one of the above because it will not be able to pass against Scarborough and won't be able to keep pace with Aurora. 
# **DENOUEMENT IN MOHAVE**

At least the wildcard spots in each conference are up for grabs. The non-division-winning teams that screw up the least over the next 7 weeks will earn those spots. The fact that the dysfunctional Mohave Hellfire remain well in the hunt underscores the shambolic nature of this battle for a post-season lottery ticket. The Hellfire have looked markedly unimpressive in blundering their way to a 4-4 record over the first 8 weeks of the season. Ironically, that they remain relevant *is* somewhat impressive given their mode of play to date. But the fans are not believers. Neither is coach and owner, **Bobby Elder**, who has been caught on camera a few times playing video poker with his I-phone on the sidelines during games he is supposed to be coaching. Nor, according to inside sources recently come to light, are members of the Board of *Hellfire Consultants Ltd.*, the obscure holding company that owns the Hellfire as well as various other murky business interests throughout the world.

A well-known but controversial local Mohave sports blogger named **Jack Wannabe** was the first local reporter to write about Hellfire Consultants preparing to divest themselves of the team. The scoop, broken in the week leading up this Sunday, was a minor bombshell due to the fact that getting anything better than glib communications out of Hellfire Consultants was considered impossible. But apparently somebody on the inside of the Hellfire Board is against the idea of selling the team and was hoping to stoke a grassroots movement of support for keeping it in Mohave by leaking the plans to the Press. This move backfired by revealing that there is, in fact, only lukewarm interest in the team locally. With the illegal Mexican fans continuing to avoid the games due to the policies of the Trump Administration and FLAME still leading its now 5-year boycott, the team

has felt compelled to prop up dwindling local attendance by selling cheap tour and ticket packages in Las Vegas and luring tourists at the Grand Canyon with two-for-one ticket deals and half-priced helicopter rides to the stadium.

This Sunday, prior to the Hellfire's home date against the Iowa City Cubs, a planned demonstration to demand that Mohave County intervene to protect the team from the intentions of its owners drew only 16 diehard Hellfire fans, led by local beef jerky maker, Jack Locklear. It was quite a preposterous sight to see Jack, his wife, their 8 adult children and 6 grandchildren, wearing Hellfire jerseys and other team paraphernalia, holding up signs and chanting slogans in front of two dozen reporters, a full platoon of riot police and a section of paramilitaries from the private security firm, S.A.T.A.N. (Special Applications and Tactical Assessment Network), a firm under the umbrella of Hellfire Consultants Ltd. The odd

sympathetic drunken tailgater would blast a horn or yell out a slogan from a distance, but anyone inclined to join the Locklears in their family demonstration thought better of it due to the menacing presence of *S.A.T.A.N.*, whose members looked like space age storm troopers in their black reflective helmets, full body armour and.... were those laser guns they were carrying?

"Me and m' family have bin rootin' for the Hellfire through thick and thin for 11 years! We bleed red!" Jack explained to local TV reporter, **Chaz Gomez**, oblivious to the danger he was in. "All of my grandchill'n 'r named Andrew – even the girls! My dog's name is Lucky! I don' know what we'd do on Sunday if they took our Hellfire away! I'd be so mad I might just have to shoot up the town!"

Locklear, whose dried beef products, marketed under the brand name *Jack's Jerky*, are sold at gun stores and gun clubs across three States, boasts that he has the largest personal collection of legal automatic weapons in the Southwest and has membership in every gun club within 200 square miles of Kingman. He certainly has access to guns. But since his right to own them is considered more important in the Kingman area than pre-emptive action based on any well-founded concerns about what he might do with them, all we can do is cross our fingers that he doesn't do anything crazy if the Hellfire are moved out of Mohave.

But other than a mass shooting, it would appear that life would go on, (at least for those not caught in the line of fire), if the Hellfire were to move. According to a very special source, the entity that bankrolls investment in the Hellfire Group of companies is going to make sure that happens as early as next year. Smarting from losses incurred by financing failed rebel groups in Syria and from now unrecoverable "donations" to the Clinton Foundation, **Mr. Sammael Mastema Baphomet** of the arcane Bank of West Hades is determined to restructure financing of *Hellfire Consultants Ltd.* and to shift priorities. This will involve, I am told, sale of the Hellfire to fund research into a pathogen to wipe out the Russian race. This sounds far-fetched. But in these days of hysteria about Russia, not seen since the days of McCarthy, it is not out of the question that there would be a buyer willing to pay big bucks for such an evil weapon.

With all of the farce and evil going on in the media and behind the scenes; and with their coach playing video slots on his phone and occasionally barking out orders to his players using that *'Crazy Helium Voice Changer'* app, it was remarkable and in a strange way sad to see the home team put in a spirited and indeed "fire-y" performance against the West Division leading Cubs.

In a simultaneously invigorating and demoralizing 23-22 loss, the Hellfire, as they tend to do on occasion and without warning, looked like a good football team this week. Of course, they would like to replay that final defensive series – minus the personal foul penalty against *A.J. Klein*, and with a little more attention to Cubs running back *James Conner* and containment of *Russell Wilson* in the pocket – but any day that you force the Cubs' indomitable quarterback to use his magic powers to save a game in the dying seconds is a good day at the office, no matter who you are. It was impressive that it was not Cub's mistakes, but rather the Hellfire making plays that put them in a position to blow the game late. *Jay Ajayi* and *Tevin Coleman* slipped tackles in compiling 151 yards rushing. *Andrew Luck* looked closer to his old self with 202 yards on 19 completions and a touchdown pass. *Jordan Hicks* was a tackling machine and *Jimmie Ward* flew around the secondary like his cleats were on fire. The fans who witnessed it – less than half the stadium capacity of 66,666 with half of those Cubs fans from Iowa – were into the game in way not often seen this far into a Hellfire campaign.

We tend to lose true appreciation for the things that are given to us. Only when they are taken away, do we know their value.

## WE'RE NOT WORTHY

In an important cross-divisional showdown at Optimist Park in Brooklin, the home town Hawks got three touchdown-passes from *Alex Smith* to *Alshon Jeffery* to prevail over the Chino Convicts, 20-16. If one were to look solely at the team statistics for both squads without knowing the score, one would invariably draw the conclusion that Chino had won the game. The Convicts had the edge in 1<sup>st</sup> downs (24 to 14); net yards (500 to 297); trips to the red zone (5 to 1); and time-of-possession (39.5 to 20.5); yet fell short in the most important category of them all: points.

Hey, that's football! For those who actually watched the game it was a clear case of the Hawks making the most of their opportunities – which included the game's only turnover, a devastating fumble by *Dak Prescott* at the Brooklin 6 that was returned 32 yards and led to the second Hawks' TD – and the Convicts squandering theirs. Having to settle for field goals on 3 of 5 trips to the red zone and missing on 4 of 5 4<sup>th</sup>-down conversion attempts carries a price against a team like the Hawks that can strike from afar.

Yet, in a bizarre post-game press conference, Hawks' coach **Tom Jones** put on his best impression of penitent, self-flagellating monk by denouncing his team's victory.

"This was not the kind of win we strive for as a team," he began, his stern countenance radiating revulsion. "That we were rewarded for this performance with a victory is outrageous. This shows, in my opinion, the flaw in the points system. We were beaten in every way, except on the scoreboard; and that's wrong! I am disgusted, frankly....and I apologize to the Convicts players and their fans for the three lucky touchdowns we scored. They deserved better; we deserved to lose. It's that simple."

With that, Jones left the podium, saying that he did not wish to dignify his team's victory any further by devoting any more time to it, as reporters yelled out questions at his turning back.

This is not the first time Jones has publicly challenged the legitimacy of his team's victories. However, in the previous case he was critical of the referees – something most of us can generally agree on. This time he disowned the winning effort of his players – something that will probably not go down well inside the Hawks' locker room. To my eyes, on those touchdowns Jeffery looked like an elite receiver and Smith looked like a passing surgeon; while the Convicts looked shaky in the clutch. The better team won.

## THE CURSE OF SPATS AND THE POWER OF SPARTA

I think I may have acquired a new power along with my new-found wealth: the ability to curse a team. Accustomed to being right, or nearly right, on everything football-related, nobody is more shocked than I am at how wrong I was about the Durham Thunder Lizards and the Pickering Spartans. The only reasonable explanation I can think of is that, by *correctly* identifying them as contenders with a lock on the playoffs, I have inadvertently placed a debilitating curse upon them. Could it be that Fortune, having bestowed unexpected wealth upon me, has extracted an, until now, hidden price? Have the Unseen Powers fixed a gag on me that I may not speak what I know to be true without altering its truth? Is this Fate's way of pushing me to leave my football world to pursue greater matters?

I am not ready to let go of football until I know for sure if I have, indeed, acquired the *Power of Curse*. On the other side, Alex Smith is enjoying one of his finest seasons playing pitch-and-catch with DeAndre Hopkins and Alshon Jeffery. But for that combo to be effective against the Cubs' secondary the Hawks will need to establish the run, something teams have had success doing against the Iowa defensive line. This is a winnable game for Brooklin, but the spread seems high for teams so evenly matched. **PICK: IOWA CITY**

FROM THE EFL ARCHIVES – In Week Nine of the 2011 EFL Season, the oft-ignored Regulators (2-7) gained national attention by upsetting the previously undefeated LA Knights (8-1) by the very Knight-like score of 17-7. Both defences played a suffocating style in keeping the score 7-7 going into the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter. The Regs won a long field position battle in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and it paid off in the 4<sup>th</sup> with the go-ahead FG by *Nate Kaeding* from 35 yards. *Frank Gore* made a play on a short hitch from *Jason Campbell* for a 47-yard TD to ice the win. Pundits *en masse* scrambled to jump off the Knights' bandwagon anticipating a derailed offence.

Today it is hard to imagine a time when *Matt Ryan* was struggling to establish himself on an unimpressive team that, all the same, managed to underperform on modest expectations. But it certainly was news in 2011 when Ryan threw for 359 yards and 1 TD to lead his Garland Mustangs (2-7) over the Iowa City Cubs (3-6) 13-10 in a driving rain storm.
