

7 21 pass to Michael Thomas. St Charles tied it at 10 on their 1st series of the 3rd, but Ryan Succop nailed a 23-yarder in the 4th for the win.

A short slant to Terrelle Pryor Sr that he took 21 yards to the house broke up a scoreless, penalty-laden 1st half in favour of the Bombers. In the 3rd, back-to-back Marcus Mariota runs of 22 and 23 yards set up Chandler Cantanzaro's second FG to make it 13-0, where it stayed. The Cadillac stalled on 3rd down, converting 1 of 12, while facing blitz pressure and an aggressive Bomber secondary

Sheldon Richardson blew up a screen to log a safety then the Cubs found the end zone on the ensuing possession for a 9-0 lead. Kareem Hunt broke a 30-yard run and later pounded it in from 3 yards for a Pilots' TD but a 69-yard bomb to Tyler Lockett early in the 3rd made it 19-7 Cubs. Brice McCain's pick-six put Seattle within 5 but a pair of Justin Tucker FGs and a tight Cubs' defence put it away.

Jordan Matthews turned a medium cross into a 55-yard gain and Andy Dalton hit DeVante Parker for a 19-yard TD for an opening TD. That would be it for the LA offence. Chino chipped away with 2 Dan Bailey FGs before the half then converted 4 3rd downs over a 95yard drive ending with a 31-yard TD pass to AJ Green. Chino put it away with Kiko Alonso's 35-yard return of a Dalton fumble for a TD.

The Swordfish ran 52 plays, converted 5 4th downs, and controlled the ball 26 minutes in the 1st half to build up a 24-7 lead, while the Stars scored on 1 of just 3 1st half possessions, on a 66-yard TD pass to Demaryius Thomas. The Stars scored a TD to start the 2nd half then took a 28-24 lead on back-to-back TDs set up by a Fish turnover on downs and a George Iloka pick. The Stars then controlled the ball and add a FG for the win.

Joe Flacco appeared in control through 2½ guarters, going 19 of 23 for 241 yards a 2 TDs in building up a 14-0 Cowtown lead. Meanwhile, Philip Rivers looked stymied and going nowhere. Then Flacco started throwing interceptions, 4 of them, including a picksix, to set up all 24 Spartans points. Willie Snead caught a 42-yard TD pass and threw a 23-yard trick pass to star for the offence.

Tom Brady caught the Lizards off guard twice resulting in a pair of 20-yard TD passes to Kelvin Benjamin to stake his team to a 14-3 lead. Cam Newton started the 2nd half for Durham and got the comeback started with a 5-yard QB draw for TD. DaQuan Jones returned a fumble 32 yards for a TD and Drew Brees finished it off with a 36-yard TD pass to TY Hilton, his 16th TD catch of the year.

A 53-yard run by Isaiah Crowell on the game's first play led to a New Jersey FG, but the Eagles would drive 75 yards on the next series for a TD. Late in the 2nd, a huge PI penalty against NJ on 3rd & 29 led to the second Scarborough TD, a 24-yard pass to Pierre Garcon. NJ started the 2nd half with a 64-yard pass to Will Fuller to set up 7, but Aaron Rodgers' 2nd TD pass and a Marcus Peters INT put the game away.

Matt Ryan connected on TD passes of 49 and 40 yards to Davante Adams to grab an early lead, but also threw 3 interceptions to help set up a Toronto comeback that had the Wolverines leading 21-14 before Julian Edelman tied it before half time. Mike Gillislee scored for Toronto on a 9-yard TD run to start the 3rd, but the Mustangs then kicked into high gear with a pair of TD runs & a 4th Ryan TD pass to pull away.

As the Glads' offence struggled to make any progress, the Regs slowly built up a 14-0 lead on a 1-yard QB sneak by Kirk Cousins and an 8yard TD pass to Corey Davis, set up by Joe Haden's interception. A sack and fumble at the Regs' 27 led to a 10-yard TD pass to Jarvis Landry to get the Glads on the board, but a 45-yard bomb to Davis on the next play set up Cousins' 2nd TD on a sneak to cap the scoring.

Kevin White, WR (DTL). Few will remember how effective he was back in Week One prior to getting injured. With TY Hilton getting the attention, White will have lots of room to roam.

It was not a particularly good week for the tight end position. The top point-getter was Kyle **Rudolph** (11FP) and the next highest was **Lardarius Green** (9FP) (who is he?) High profilers like Zach Ertz (4FP), Jordan Reed (4FP), and Travis Kelce (3FP) performed like back-ups.

My Smart Play for Week 13, Le'Veon Bell (12FP), got a lot of action but not much traction against Chino. More receiving yards than rush yards and 0 TDs.

In a year when kickers are struggling across the league, Justin Tucker (11FP), Wil Lutz (9FP) and **Ryan Succop** (7FP) continue to deliver consistently.

The **Bruxelles Defence** (18FP) delivered a shutout while the Aurora Defence (2FP) got shelled by **Matt Moore** (17FP) and the Wolverines. Defence is the most unpredictable fantasy component from week-to-week.

- How many times must I point out that **Russ Lemmon**'s 4th down playbook is the work of a madman without sounding like a broken record?
- Can somebody please give me a word with a meaning stronger than "depressing" to describe the South Carolina Regulators?
- This will be the last time I point out the irony of the Wolverines and their defense-oriented coach and GM having the worst defence in the league.
- Evidence of the "The Curse" on the Blue Eagles is re-emerging after a promising start to the season but what exactly is this "evidence" and where can we find it? Still no definitive answers to reveal.
- My long-standing observation that York coach and GM **Jay Hammond** appears to think, erroneously, that *Tom Brady* can do it all by himself continues to fall on deaf ears.
- Monitoring the progress (or lack thereof) of the Seattle offence is no longer fun now that it appears it will end the year as *one* of the worst offences in EFL history, as opposed to *the* worst.

And the beat goes on. There is much more to repeat. At various points throughout the remainder of the year, perhaps even in this very article, I will trot out more observations I have made before...just to confirm that nothing much has changed in a season tortured by the league's darling attribute and the fan's curse: *parity*!

SPART-O MAN

Some are calling it a miracle of modern science. Others are simply calling it a miracle, in the classic divine intervention sense of the word. But Spartans' defensive coordinator, **General Pausanias** believes it is the work of *Ares*, God of War. And that belief has dramatically changed the approach of **Gus Konstantakos**' inner circle to Pickering's one and only coach.

Gus looked at his two coordinators, dressed in full ceremonial armour, and tried to fathom what they might be thinking. He quickly gave up. "Look guys, if this is some kind of joke then you've gone too far," he finally said, one eye on the goat and the other on the hand that held its bleeding heart. Using the word "crush" seemed to instantly inspire both of them. "Straight away, My Liege," Pausanias snapped, his boot clicking on the shower tiles. "Consider it done, My Lord!" Dercylidas added brusquely, his hand extended in the Spartan Salute.

As if this all wasn't already weird enough, it was about to get even weirder in a way that even the mainstream media would be hard-pressed to suppress.

An air of festivity rose from the stands at Thermopylae Stadium. The Spartans were on a bit of a roll, their coach had undergone a life-crisis and had emerged as something of a hero, and the team had a chance to take control of its destiny with a win over the hated Corn Kings. 'The Spartans better win after all this,' I remember thinking to myself when I settled in to watch the game Sunday night.

As it turned out, the game unfolded like so many have this crazy season, with fortunes shifting dramatically for both teams from one half to the next. Perhaps intimidated by the pre-game ceremony of a magnitude and drama not witnessed since the Spartans' 'Golden Age' of 2010-2011, the home team played stiff for the entire first half and better part of the third quarter. *Philip Rivers* was off-target, *Devonta Freeman* couldn't break tackles, the line struggled to block and there was clearly a limit to how many times fullback, *Kyle Juszczyk* would surprise the Cowtown secondary by sneaking downfield. The Corn Kings looked loose by comparison. *Joe Flacco* was dialed in early, hitting his targets with an accuracy not often seen these days. *Mike Evans* did his part to get the Corn Kings on the board first, breaking a short slant for a 36-yard gain, hauling in an 11-yard pass on 3rd & 5 and finishing off an impressive 90-yard drive with a nice grab in the end zone for a 7-0 1st quarter lead.

Although it was still early, there was a hint of impending disaster in the air in Pickering. Fans had seen this version of *Philip Rivers* before and it usually ended badly for the Spartans. Fortunately, the defence, under a fiercely animated **General Pausanias**, bent some more but did not break again for the remainder of the 1st half. "*Ares is watching you!*" he barked at his squad. Four plays later, Flacco again found Evans' 6'5" frame half a step ahead of corner, *Tony Lippett* in the end zone for a touchdown to give the visitors a 14-0 lead.

The Spartans countered with a long drive, fueled by a heavy dose of Freeman and a successful trick pass from *Willie Snead* to *Ty Montgomery*, good for 23 yards. It electrified the crowd momentarily, but the balloon of optimism broke when the drive stalled and *Caleb Sturgis* missed the 42-yard field goal attempt. It was appearing to Spartan coaching staff and thousands of fans that the Football Gods were prevailing over the Gods of Ancient Greece on this day. It happened – Greek Gods were notoriously fickle.

"I told you we should have sacrificed a bull!" **Commander Dercylidas** said to **General Pausanias**, his voice tainted with acrimony. "Ares is punishing us for our insult to his emissary!"

General Pausanias turned to Coach **Gus Konstantakos**, who stood stoically in his usual spot close to the sideline, his midriff protruding ever so slightly onto the field of play. "My Liege! Blessed deputy of the Gods. Has Ares abandoned us?" he asked.

Gus did not respond. He stared across the field at the Corn Kings' sideline, where a relaxed *Joe Flacco* appeared to share a joke with Coach **Jim Coghlin** as he put his helmet on before taking the field at the spot where the Spartans' field goal kicker had missed his mark. With grim intensity he stared at the Cowtown quarterback as he approached the huddle, clapping his hands. Suddenly, Gus' eyes began to glow with a faint blue light. A wave of heat wafted through the air around him. His coaches took a step back in

alarm as he uttered in an otherworldly voice: 'I am Spart-o-man!'

With those three words his helmet began to crackle with the sound of gathering energy. His eyes turned a deep blue. He lowered his forehead a touch and squared his body in the direction of the Cowtown quarterback. There was a sudden, short burst of blue light accompanied by a barely audible 'zzzpppp!' The beam came from the holes in the capped "vent" affixed to the front center of his helmet and appeared to strike the Cowtown quarterback directly in the face. It lasted a fraction of a second, but long enough to be visible on video. (This video will certainly be reviewed extensively by experts in wake of Cowtown's post-game protest, but determining exactly what happened and how it occurred may be beyond the league's best science).

Almost immediately the momentum changed. Flacco threw wildly in the direction of *Todd Gurley* to botch a screen pass. Left tackle *Ryan Schraeder* was flagged for holding on a play in which it appeared he did not even contact the defender. The interception set up the Spartans inside the Cowtown 30 and in short order they were in the end zone on a *Tom Savage* (in the game for Rivers who had been shaken up on the previous play) 3-yard check down to *Chris Johnson*. When *Tom Savage* throws a touchdown against you, you know you are in for trouble.

From that point on, Cowtown fans would not recognize their quarterback of the first two quarters-and-a-half. Flacco's throws were all over the place. He was intercepted by *Gareon Conley* on the next series, setting up a 42-yard TD pass from Rivers to Snead. He was again picked off on the next possession, this time by safety *Marcus Maye*, who returned it 22 yards for a touchdown. And yes, picked again on the second snap of the ensuing Corn King possession, with corner *Tony Lippett* getting his revenge on *Mike Evans* with a clean snare on a deep hitch. The 18-yard return would set up Sturgis for an easy field goal and, in the space of 8 minutes from the time of the first interception, *Joe Flacco* had thrown 4 picks leading to all of Pickering's 24 points.

The shell-shocked Corn Kings never recovered, although they tried to make a game of it. The Spartans were too fired up to let that happen. The crowd was going berserk. The Spartan coaching staff proclaimed victory in the name of *Ares* well before the final gun. And **Gus Konstantakos**, apparently as surprised as anyone, bounced around on the sideline like a kid at Christmas. The defence snuffed out two developing Cowtown drives before they drew blood and the offence ran out the clock for a 24-14 victory.

The media ran with the "feel-good" story of Gus' triumphant return to the Spartan sideline, which was a compelling take. The noise of it drowned out the bitter protests of the Corn Kings and their media allies. Something very strange had happened, they claimed, and the league needed to investigate. This was portrayed by some as sour grapes.

"As if Joe Flacco hasn't thrown dumb interceptions before!" **Cowan Bullherd** hissed sarcastically the next day on Morning Bull. "Ooooh, it's got to be that mind-control laser beam that did it to poor old Joe! Yeah, right! Move on Cowtown fans. You're fitting right in with the alien abduction crowd!"

But video stills popping up on YouTube clearly show *something* emanating from **Gus Konstantakos'** helmet and that something appearing to contact the Cowtown quarterback immediately prior to his epic meltdown. I am sure we have not heard the end of this story.

AROUND THE EFL

At The Fiery Depths in Mohave, Hellfire fans (such as there are these days) were unusually lively in anticipation of their team's Week 13 contest against Virden. It had been too long, longer than most could remember, since the Hellfire had played a meaningful game this late into the season. But a wildcard spot was within grasp if they could pull off a win. The Violators, for their part, were also in an unusual position – leading their division with their destiny in their hands. These two teams, unused to pressure, put on a pretty good show, despite Mohave's loss of *Andrew Luck* – again – for a portion of the game. In the end, the outcome boiled down to *Ezekiel Elliott* running for 160 yards and 2 touchdowns, including a 53-yard scoring burst, to put the Hellfire into a 23-7 hole from which they could not extricate themselves. They came oh so close, however, bouncing back to within 2 points with 4:02 remaining. But a couple of clutch throws from *David Carr* set up a late FG to make it a 26-21 final in favour of Virden.

The strange roller-coaster of a season continued for the Triumph as they scraped out a 10-7 victory over the Hawks to keep their playoff hopes alive. With Brooklin's receiving corps short-staffed due to injuries, it was a simple matter of the Triumph clamping down on superstar *DeAndre Hopkins*. He was given what is now referred to as the '*Odell Beckham treatment*' – virtually constant double-coverage – and it shut down the Brooklin offence. *Alex Smith* finished just 9 of 24 for 63 yards and 1 pick in his worst outing of the year by far. Brooklin is in a mini-tailspin, having lost two-in-a-row, and now Smith has been declared injured for Week 14.

At The Big House in Chino, the Convicts drew back into the thick of the playoff hunt with a surprisingly painless 20-7 subdual of the LA Knights. *Dak Prescott* and *AJ Green* got it going, hooking up for 10 catches, 133 yards and a dazzling 31-yard TD pass to lead the offence. *Andy Dalton* improved on his 5-interception performance of Week 12, throwing just one in this game. But clearly the memory of last week's catastrophe remained in his mind. He also gave up a fumble on a sack by *Robert Mathis* that was scooped up by *TJ Ward* for a touchdown and generally stunk up field with bad passes.

And finally, the amazing Bruxelles Bombers put an early lock on the East Division with a not-so-amazing, but nevertheless effective, 13-0 smothering of the Cadillac. This was one of uglier games of Week 13. The teams combined for 22 penalties (11 each) and could manage just five 3rd down conversions (1 for Erieau and 4 for Bruxelles) in 27 combined attempts. The one highlight reel play was a nice one, however. On 3rd & 7, *Marcus Mariota* dropped back, side-stepped a charging *Myles Garrett* and slung a dart through the upraised arms of *Trey Flowers* to *Terrelle Pryor Sr*, who scampered 21-yard for the game's only touchdown.



While a loss for the Chargers here would not necessarily spell their doom, they would need help to stay alive and, if so, hope for a favourable match-up at 7-9 to slip into the final wild card berth. Not ruling out that scenario with the pack of mediocrity in the running with them, but highly unlikely. So, in terms of keeping the odds real, this is a must-win for John Clingan's crew. The Hawks cannot catch the Bombers but a wild card berth is in the cards if they can take care of business against teams like the Chargers. Unfortunately, the Chargers are a different team at home and Hawks' team leader, Alex Smith, is ruled 'out' for this game. Veteran, Shaun Hill will call the signals, but will be missing three important targets in the passing game. Can DeAndre Hopkins do it all himself in the air phase? With the right QB, perhaps; but Hill will likely check down rather than risk throwing into almost certain double-coverage and there are no good receiving options at running back. The Chargers are healthy by comparison

and playing for their survival. If they are going to get 'er done, this is their chance to do it. PICK: ST. CHARLES

Virden can clinch the Central Division with a win while the Corn Kings can sneak back into a wild card spot with a win and a Durham or Pickering loss. The Atlantic wild card race is essentially down to those three teams, although a resurgent Sebastian refuses to go away quietly and could catch up. The bottom line for Cowtown is that they cannot afford to have Joe Flacco throw another 4 interceptions, as he did last week, if they hope to make the post-season. The Violators are riding Ezekiel Elliott like a rented mule and getting the most out of him so far, but concerns that he is wearing down have been voiced by local media. I have seen no evidence of fatigue yet, and I expect we will get ample opportunity to evaluate his energy levels this week. Derek Carr will take his shots, but won't want to fling the ball deep under pressure against the second-ranked intercepting defence in the league. Injuries are not a major factor for either team, but Cowtown would feel better if they had their nickel and dime corners available in case the Virden game plan goes airborne. This one is a tough call. Go with the desperate home team. **PICK: COWTOWN**

This is a fitting line for two of the most unpredictable teams in the league this year. Even Vegas cannot decide which way this will go or even how it will get there. The Triumph need this one more. They are looking forward to the probable return of Charles Clay and are confident that Melvin Gordon is fully recovered from a knee sprain suffered in Week 9. The Thunder Lizards are slowly on the mend and get two important pieces of their offence back this week: Kevin White, a dangerous complement to TY Hilton when he was on the field; and Theo Riddick, a lurking duo-weapon threat out of the backfield. Both defences are in decent shape, although Triumph corner Byron Maxwell is listed as 'doubtful,' as is Lizards linebacker Brian Cushing. This last could pose a problem for Durham as back-up BJ Goodson is no more than a special teamer. Both defences have playmakers capable of turning games around, but expect this game to turn on which of these error-prone, but sometimes inspired QBs, screws up the least. **PICK: DURHAM**

Andy Dalton's meltdown in Week 12 seemed to impact last week's conservative and tentatively-executed 7-point performance against Chino. The Knights are suddenly in trouble after putting together a six-game win streak that had them threatening the Cubs at one point. This is a chance to regain their footing against a team that has wobbled serendipitously into a wildcard spot. The flagging Spartans were revived last week by their opponent's sudden self-immolation in the second half of a game that had looked lost. With Dalton pitching for the Knights, a similar scenario is possible here and it may be the one they need in order to prevail. Philip Rivers has done little to inspire confidence lately and cannot be counted on to regain his better form against the 'Blue Shield.' With the passing game in a funk, Devonta Freeman is not running as freely as he was early in the season. The Spartans are favoured, likely due to hysteria over Dalton's 11 picks in the past 5 games. Remember: Rivers is just as capable. **PICK: LOS ANGELES**

The Bombers have already clinched the East Division but still covet the no.1 seed and the resultant home field advantage throughout the playoffs. Don't expect a let-up here from the coaching staff against division rival Mohave, but whether the players will retain the burning need to prove themselves after locking-up a playoff spot remains to be seen. The Hellfire have truly gutted it out the past few weeks, winning two of three with back-up QB, Connor Cook seeing far more action than fans would like. But it seems that Andrew Luck is fully healthy, at least for now, and ready to test a Bruxelles secondary that is surrendering plenty of yards between the twenties before tightening up in the red zone. Jay Ajayi remains a force in the running game, but Telvin Coleman is showing a nose

for the end zone, meaning double-barrel trouble for the Bombers inside the 20 if Luck can get them there. The fuse was damp for the explosive Bomber attack last week with Leonard Fournette out. But he is back and with him the fireworks. **PICK: BRUXELLES**

The Blue Eagles staunched the bleeding with a much-needed win over the humble Wrecking Balls last week. Aaron Rodgers looked sober in that contest, steadied by New Jersey's focus on Jordan Howard. The Pats' secondary will be a tougher nut to crack, however, provided Aqib Talib returns to action as expected. If not, lack of depth, with four bodies unavailable, could be a game-changer if Scarborough becomes in dire need of offence. But with DeShaun Watson matched against the scary Scarborough secondary the game is unlikely to turn into a shootout. Expect to see a trio or more of Pats' running backs in action, fed into the meat grinder at the line of scrimmage to chew up turf and time off the clock. The slender line is due to an anticipated low-scoring affair. Expect a couple of scoring drives and a pick-six to seal this one for Scarborough....and take the "under." **PICK: SCARBOROUGH**

York is still in the race, but considering their 5 victories have come against teams with a combined .200 winning percentage, it is obvious that they are pretenders rather than contenders. They have enough stars to beat the dregs of the league, but not enough depth to handle the mid to upper tier teams. On the road, against the first place Cubs, a win looks unlikely, especially taking into account the slew of injuries to the receiving corps. Thin to begin with, it is decimated heading into Week 14, with Kelvin Benjamin virtually alone on an island. However, with the Cubs seemingly going through the motions from week-to-week and either unwilling, or unable, to put opponents away with the force of a front-runner, the Swords could hang around long enough to easily finish within the very generous spread. Tom Brady can expect little pressure, which will give him time to find...somebody; and the Cubs have proven vulnerable enough to the ground game that Derrick Henry and Eddie Lacy could find traction. Will probably be boring. **PICK: YORK**

A daring coaching style that can knock an opponent off balance as often as it puts the defence in a bad position has worked overall for the Fish, but against good teams it has proven to be a losing strategy. Luckily, the Cadillac do not fall into that category. Erieau's front seven will create some anxious moments in the pocket for Sebastian's hyper QB, but the corners will be hard-pressed to keep pace with studs, Odell Beckham Jr and Doug Baldwin. Expect Winston to keep flinging the ball in their general direction in the hope they will make some plays. **PICK: SEBASTIAN**

Of course, there is some entertainment value as well as an historian's curiosity in learning, after the fact, how New Jersey let another one get away. But watching their debacles in real time is simply too sad for any fan with a spark of empathy and humanity. Go ahead and mark this as loss for New Jersey but hold off throwing your money down on the Convicts until certain that the dead body won't have one of those sudden Hollywood zombie resurrection moments that puts a scare into everybody just when the movie appears to be ending. The Balls are at home, where they have their single win, and they have a, sometimes, respectable defence. Okay, that's it for plusses. On the negative side, they have an uninspiring quarterback, a dog-tired running back, and a lazy 'prima dona' at wide receiver. Conversely, the Convicts have a real quarterback and a team of options. **PICK: CHINO**

FROM THE EFL ARCHIVES – In Week Thirteen of the 2011 EFL Season, the Durham Thunder Lizards faced elimination against the "powerful" Blue Eagles. Scarborough was still being billed as the most potent force in the league, despite trailing Gwinnett in their own division. The Eagles' misfortunes continued to snowball with a 34-23 loss to a spirited Durham squad "led' by *Tim Tebow*. The cult figure only attempted 2 passes and rushed just 3 times, but since he had scored on a 14-yard run he had led the Lizards to the win. *Philip Rivers*' 3 TD passes were a mere footnote in the game. The Death Valley Undertakers made it 3 wins in a

row with a 26-20 whipping of the Patriots. Although the score suggested a close contest, this was far from the reality for most of the game. Death Valley had a 23-0 lead heading into the 4th quarter before *Peyton Manning* suddenly woke up and started passing, seemingly at will. A recovered onside kick helped and next thing the 'takers knew they were clinging to a 3-point lead, 23-20. But a time-consuming drive assisted by the fresh legs of rookie *DeMarco Murray* burned off most of the clock and added an insurance FG. Hyper-hyped linebacker, *Clay Matthews*, the media darling for Defensive MVP on the worst defensive team in the league, had 1 tackle in the contest that was explained by apologists as due to the Pats avoiding him.

The most exciting game of the week meant zilch in the standings. The 2-11 Mohave Hellfire bumped off the 4-9 Iowa City Cubs, 23-22 on a 54-yard *Rob Bironas* FG with just 0:42 left in the 4th quarter. The lead changed hands 6 times and had the fans at the half empty Joe Ferguson Stadium on the edge of their seats.

Individuals recognized in Week 13 were *Frank Gore* of the Regulators, 188 total yards and 3 TDs versus Markham; and *Robert Mathis* of Gwinnett, with 2 sacks and 1 stuff.
