*Colorado notches historic first win

WINNEMUCCA – In the face of howling wind and flurries in Winnemucca's 'Hole in the Wall' stadium, the Colorado Thundersnow looked right at home and defiant of the elements. They scored with the wind, they scored against the wind. Yes, believe it or not, they scored – a franchise high 27 points! Not since Week Three against Pickering had the Snow looked so in gear on the attack. Except this time, the running game showed up as well. With **Kevin Smith** and **Matt Forte** grinding it out with effectiveness on the turf, **Matt Ryan** had time, when he needed it, to throw the ball.

In a game that was not really as close as the score indicated, Colorado scored the first 20 points on two **Robbie Gould** field goals and a couple of Matt Ryan touchdown passes to tight end, **Tony Scheffler** to dominate the first 35 minutes of the game. The Outlaws' offense, which had been held to just 3 first downs in the first half, finally came to life toward the end of the third quarter when **David Garrard** found **Laveranues Coles** in the corner of the end zone from 14 yards out to break the Colorado shutout and put the home team within striking distance heading into the fourth quarter.

But history would not be denied for the Thundersnow on this day. On the Outlaw's next possession, **Calvin Pace**, unquestionably Colorado's defensive MVP this year, broke through the line to sack **David Garrard** on a critical 3rd down conversion attempt and Colorado got the ball back on the Winnemucca 44 yard line after a shanked Chris Kluwe punt netted 0 yards. **Matt Ryan**, showing the instinct of a champion, (albeit a champion of a 0-11 team), went for the jugular on the next play, hitting **Mark Clayton** for a 28-yard gain on a long crossing pattern, then again on a medium out route for 13 yards to bring the ball inside the Winnemucca 10 yard line. A holding penalty on Jacoby Jones brought the ball back 10 yards, but three plays later, Ryan found **Tony Scheffler** for their third TD connection of the day from 8 yards out to all but seal the deal for Colorado.

The Game Ball deservedly went to the Captain of this young expansion squad, **Matt Ryan**, who was efficient, if not prolific, in victory with 14 completions in 20 attempts for 145 yards and 3 TD passes. **Kevin Smith** rushed for 96 yards on 16 carries and **Matt Forte** added 66 yards on 19 carries to carry the offensive load on a windy day in Winnemucca. **Tony Scheffler** caught 5 passes for 58 yards and 3 TD passes and now leads the team in touchdowns scored with 4.

As for Winnemucca, they hibernated during the first half, waking up too late to avoid getting hit by a Colorado Thundersnow-style blizzard, and in the end looked lost. Both teams are looking forward to next year, because this year could not have been much worse. But at least on this day, Colorado got to finally experience the glow of victory.

GAME POINTS: Durham's **Ike Taylor** picked off **Peyton Manning** 4 plays into the game and returned it 56 yards to the Patriot 7 yard line, leading to a **Mason Crosby** chip shot field goal and a 3-0 lead. It turned out to be the highlight of the day for Durham as Manning went on to be nearly perfect after that, throwing 2 TD passes before the half and another in the 4th quarter, to lead the Pats to an easy win over Division rival Durham.

KEY PERFORMANCES: **Peyton Manning** finished the day 30 of 41 for 371 yards, 3 TDs and 1 INT. **Wes Welker**, **Jason Witten** and **Chad Johnson** all had over 100 yards receiving and 1 TD each. **Marcus Trufant** snagged his 7th interception of the year. **Adrian Peterson** was held to 55 yards on 14 carries. **Frank Gore** and **Clinton Portis** both struggled, combining for just 49 yards on 18 carries. **Philip Rivers** completed only 9 of 21 passes for 92 yards.

ROMO THROWS 3 TDS TO TIP COWS

GAME POINTS: **Plaxico Burress** turned a simple hitch route into a 39-yard TD to tie the game 14-14 in the 3rd quarter. **Larry Johnson** and **Kenny Watson** rushed for 31 of 36 yards on Kutztown's next possession to set up **Nate Kaeding's** go-ahead field goal from 39 yards. Cowtown threatened in the 4th quarter, but an untimely false start penalty on 4th down and inches at the Kutztown 38 put them out of field goal range and forced a punt. The Golden Bears would keep the ball for almost the entire game after that, scoring the clinching TD on a 14-yard pass from **Tony Romo** to Burress.

KEY PERFORMANCES: **Tony Romo** went 17 of 31 for 216 yards, 1 INT and 3 TDs. **Plaxico Burress** made all the clutch catches, snagging 5 passes for 93 yards and 2 TDs. **Chris Redman** struggled, completing only 8 of 23 passes for 119 yards and 1 INT. **Marion Barber** scored Cowtown's 2 TDs.

MARKHAM PREVAILS IN UGLY UPSET

GAME POINTS: Charles Tillman picked off Donovan McNabb and lateralled the ball to James Sanders, who returned it 15 yards for Markham's only TD of the game. That score started a 13-point 4th quarter comeback for the North Stars that erased a fragile 12-3 Pickering lead built up over the first three quarters. The Spartans struck first on a 2-yard TD pass from McNabb to Chris Johnson in the 1st quarter, but Lawrence Tynes missed the extra point. That would prove significant later as the Spartans were forced to play for the TD on their final possession, leading to a second and final interception by Tillman.

KEY PERFORMANCES: Jamal Lewis rushed for 143 yards on 26 carries to lead the Stars' offence. Charles Tillman had 2 key interceptions, while Mike Vrabel recorded 3 sacks and 1 forced fumble to lead the defense. Donovan McNabb completed 20 of 37 passes for 223 yards, 1 TD and 2 INTs.

GAME POINTS: Antonio Cromartie intercepted Carson Palmer and returned the ball 24 yards to the Gladiators' 4 yard line to set up 4-yard TD pass from Tom Brady to Brandon Marshall with 3 seconds remaining in the 1st half. That score put the Dragons up 17-7 and set the tone for a jittery second half for Palmer. Nate Burleson returned a punt 88 yards for a TD to give Gwinnett an early 2nd half boost, but a 53-yard TD pass from Brady to Marshall and 3 Ken Hamlin interceptions, one returned for a TD, locked up Florida's 11th win.

CUBS WIN SEE-SAW BATTLE IN CHINO



NEW YORK – The latest mega-fraud on Wall Street has me remembering that just about everything in this big town has an element of disingenuousness to it. Not that there is anything wrong with that, but when you get caught, it's bad for your image and, therefore, bad for business. This city is all about business.

COLORADO COMES THROUGH

Loyal and suffering Colorado fans finally got something to cheer about after their beloved **Colorado Thundersnow** gave it hard to their expansion counterparts, the **Winnemucca Outlaws** on a blustery day in Winnemucca. I have to admit, I was glad they won. I like **Matt Ryan** and I think he is going to be a star in the EFL very soon. For most of the season, though, the Colorado offense has looked only slightly more potent than a sardine in a diabetic coma. The quarterback has to take at least *some* of the blame for that *if* you believe that the quarterback is the most important position in offensive football (and if you are feeble-minded enough to think otherwise, disregard). This season has been a learning experience for everybody in the Colorado organization. The good news is that they seem to be improving by small increments every week.

WINNEMUCCA GOES THROUGH THE MOTIONS

On the other side of the good news story in Colorado is the bad news story in Winnemucca. Well, not so much bad news as.....*indifferent* news. Does anybody really care what happens to the Outlaws? A modest crowd of 14,326 fans showed up at the 'Hole in the Wall' to watch their team disgrace itself against the weaklings of the EFL and nobody seemed to really care, not least the coach. With Colorado advancing into gale force winds in the second quarter, they wisely handed the ball off 12 times during a 15-play touchdown drive near the end of the first half. The Winnemucca response was to sit back and wait on the pass for 12 of those plays. Coach, **Pierce Roberts** was nowhere to be seen during the game and word was that he was text-messaging plays to his coaching staff, who relayed them onto the field without taking into account the situation. Obviously, the EFL is not quite as elite as we had hoped.

JEFF DOHRN ANNOUNCES 'COACH OF THE YEAR' CANDIDACY

Toward the end of his post-game press conference after his **Los Angeles Knights** danced all over the hapless **Anchorage Buccaneers**, 27-9, Coach **Jeff Dohrn** announced his candidacy for 'EFL Coach of the Year.' This announcement was surprising only because all coaches are automatically candidates and no announcement is required. Dohrn believes he deserves kudos for mentoring two misfit quarterbacks into the third and fourth QB rankings in the EFL. Having nothing good to say about either **Tavaris Jackson** or **Brodie Croyle**, I would have to agree that Dohrn has done something exceptional, if not miraculous, with his offense. Defense is another matter. The Knights are near the bottom of the league defensively despite an abundance of talent, and one has to wonder where Los Angeles would be if their defense equaled their offense in pleasant surprises. In the final analysis, the Knights, and Dohrn, will be judged by their record. At the moment, the Knights are 7-5 and heading for the playoffs. Where they go from there will determine who gets final recognition for the ultimate coaching achievement.

SFL REFUGEES SEEKING ASYLUM

Cornerback, **Nick Harper** of the Mississippi Rebels and running back, **Quinton Ganther** of

the Miami Monsoons are also in the hunt. *Froste Rucker*, the defensive end with the best name in the business is also available as is veteran center, *Andy McCollum*. Word is that even more players are waiting for the final word regarding SFL solvency. If the league were to fold completely, there would be an overwhelming influx of new players looking for work in the EFL.

COACH COGHLIN ON HOT SEAT

Riding the crest of a six-game winning streak, and facing a key Divisional opponent, the **Cowtown Corn Kings** elected to start back-up *Chris Redman* over *Chad Pennington* against the **Kutztown Golden Bears** in Week Twelve. The surprise move came after a Pennington-led six game winning streak had brought the Corn Kings back into the playoff picture from the abyss of a 0-5 start. Cowtown coach, **Jim Coghlin** rationalized his choice by citing the weather and the advantage of Redman’s stronger arm in the windy conditions of Tillman Field. When game day arrived and conditions were not so windy, Coghlin sent Redman out anyway. The results speak for themselves: 8 completions in 23 attempts for a QB rating of 34.5 and a Corn King loss. In spite of success running the ball, the Corn Kings had no passing game. Cowtown fans are blaming Coghlin, apparently forgetting that this also happened under Pennington early in the season. 

JIMMY'S WEEK THIRTEEN PICKS

CHINO @ CHARLESWOOD (LINE – PATRIOTS BY 6)

The Patriots are the first team to clinch a Division title and are now playing for home field advantage throughout the playoffs. Chino has clinched a playoff berth but wants to reclaim the West Division from Iowa City. Last year's Championship finalists are 1-1 all-time against each other, but Chino can claim the bigger victory, making history by beating Charleswood in the ultimate game and claiming the first ever EFL title. The Pats remember this loss with bitterness and are looking for revenge. They face a Chino team that continues to show the ability to surprise, although on a lesser scale than last year. While the Convicts should not be underestimated, the difference between their squad and the Pats has widened since last year's dramatic clash. Charleswood has the clear edge in most offensive and defensive categories, but is vulnerable to the run, giving up 4.6 yards per rush, 15th in the EFL. L.T. is as eager to run against the Pats' line as Jay Cutler is reluctant to pass against the Pats' secondary, ranked 1st in the league by a wide margin. If Chino can slow the game down, they stand a chance in the hostile confines of Patriot Place. If the Pats can grab the early lead, watch out Chino! I would like the Convicts at the Big House, but on the Pats' home turf there is only one outcome worth betting on.

IOWA CITY @ DURHAM (LINE – CUBS BY 3)

The Thunder Lizards are a disappointment this season on many levels but they still remain in the hunt for a wildcard berth in the Can-Am Conference. The Cubs are on the verge of clinching the West Division title and would like to finish the job as early as possible. The Lizards have the home field advantage this week but some local pundits are questioning whether the chronic wetness of Jurassic Park is suited to the Durham attack, which is centered on the running game. Despite strong personnel, the Durham rushing attack continues to perform at a mediocre level, especially at home against the faster defenses. The Cubs boast one of the better run pursuit defenses in the EFL with DeMeco Ryans and Patrick Willis in support of the defensive line, meaning the Lizards will have to run with caution. The Durham passing game is doing better overall, but their success is mostly against the weaker teams. Don't expect Philip Rivers and Co. to attempt the power passing game this week. Look for the Corn Kings to hand the ball back to Chad Pennington this week – perhaps one week too late to save their season. With so many teams close together in the mix for wildcard berths in the Can-Am conference, a loss would not put the Cows completely out of the race, but it would be a severe, if not a mortal blow, to their playoff hopes. The Knights have an outside shot at the West Division title and have clinched a playoff berth, so there is not the same sense of urgency at the Round Table. But with Coach Dohrn angling for Coach of the Year honours, a strong finish is imperative for Los Angeles. They will find running the ball against Cowtown's front four a little tougher than usual, which means that one of either Brodie Croyle or Tavaris Jackson will have to step up and make plays in obvious passing situations. The Corn Kings' pass defense has been average overall and surprisingly ineffective in putting pressure on the quarterback. If the trend continues this week, the Knights could have success in the passing game. The Corn Kings' shaky offense could either be the perfect victims of an often foolishly aggressive Los Angeles defense, or the perfect beneficiaries. After all of the bumbling and stumbling and comedy and tragedy of the Buccaneer's season, I still cling to the belief that they have the talent to be a contender. Too bad it will not be this year. The Bucs find themselves eliminated from playoff contention after all tie-breakers are considered and have nothing to play for but pride and some kind of vicarious satisfaction in knowing they made a difference for *another* team's season. A victory at home against Kutztown would make a lot of Can-Am Conference contenders very happy indeed, and Anchorage should keep this in mind as they take the field in an otherwise meaningless game for them. The Golden Bears currently hold the final playoff seed in their conference, but are looking over their shoulders. This year's "Golden Boys" in the EFL are winning despite a hefty dose of mediocrity on the stats sheet; making big plays at the right times and somehow surviving their own turnovers while making opponents pay for theirs. Will Anchorage, with nothing to play for, finally put it all together when it won't help them at all? I say, yes – it would be a fitting twist of the dagger in the heart of their lost season to demonstrate what *could* have been.

They are about to come crashing back down to Earth this week against the Dragons, but that will not necessarily mean the end of their playoff hopes. The Spartans face off against the angry Gladiators and will have their hands full as well. Florida can clinch the South Division with a win, which gives them reason enough to show up

and play for at least half the game. The only thing that will keep this match from becoming a football atrocity will be Jim Heaton's benevolence.

PICKERING @ GWINNETT (LINE – GLADIATORS BY 7)

The Spartans fell apart offensively last week against the North Stars, which has to be cause for concern heading into the Coliseum to face a frustrated and angry Gladiators squad, losers of three straight. Carson Palmer is struggling again, but could find some relief this week against a Pickering secondary missing their top corner, Anthony Henry. The Spartans are looking forward to letting their Two Taylors loose on a Gwinnett run defense which is surprisingly dead last in the league, surrendering 5.0 yards per rush. If Pickering can run the ball, (and there is no reason to believe they won't as they lead the league in rushing average), look for McNabb to have a big day exploiting openings in the Gwinnett secondary. The Glads need this game badly, though, which means they will be pulling out all the stops. They are at home and rumour has it that the Palmer-eating lions have returned to the cages beneath the field at Gwinnett Coliseum. The last time this happened the Glads won big. They are the front runner in that race and should remain that way after this week. The Outlaws are a joke, but what is about to happen to them this week against the "blitzing bomber," Generalissimo Elder, will not be very funny. Their only hope will be that drastically poor weather conditions at 'Hole in the Wall' will keep Air Warner from flying high.

RINGGOLD @ COLORADO (LINE – CRIMSON HAWKS BY 5)

The Toyota Thunderdome will be packed and rocking with the return of the 1-11 Thundersnow to their home field. The fans who cheer every first down (because there have been so few of them) will be in full throat attempting to boost their team to the dizzying heights of a two-game winning streak. Colorado is no doubt an improved team and they enjoy the benefit of home field advantage, but the Crimson Hawks are no Winnemucca. Ringgold, with a new but tenuous lease on life, will be gunning hard to keep their playoff hopes alive, if only by a thread. Colorado is banged up with the loss of Nathan Vasher, Jonathan Vilma, and Trevor Pryce – key players at each level of the defense – and will be able to dress only two wide receivers due to injuries; Mark Clayton and rookie, Dwayne Jarrett. The league's patsies are more vulnerable than ever, making a Ringgold loss here is unthinkable.
