




WEEK FIFTEEN IN BEWIEW



HIGHI QHT PEFF Joe Flacco completed 20 of 29 for 206 yards, 2 TDs and a game day QB rating of 112.1.

- Kevin Walter caught 5 passes for 67 yards, 1 TD and a long of 33 yards.
- Aaron Kampman made 5 tackles, deflected 2 passes, stuffed a run, pressured the QB twice, and forced a fumble.
- Philip Rivers completed 11 of 24 for 105 yards, 1 INT for a game day QB rating of 41.1.
- Jared Allen made 4 tackles, 1 sack and pressured the QB twice.

EAME SUMMARY: The Corn Kings held the ball for nearly 10 minutes to start the game thanks to a **Nick Mangold** fumble, recovered by Aaron Kampman, on a return of a short kick-off after the Corn Kings had converted the opening drive into a 22-yard Olindo Mare field goal. Taking advantage of the short field, Cowtown moved it 24 yards to the Durham 1 yard line, but an incomplete pass on 3rd down forced a decision to take the easy points, sending Mare on for a 19-yard field goal to make it 6-0 before the Durham offence had got their hands on the ball. The Lizards wiped out that advantage and took the lead on their first possession of the 2nd quarter, driving 80 yards in 13 plays with Tim Tebow finishing it off with 3 straight carries, including a 17-yard bootleg to set up a 1-yard TD run on the sneak to make the score 7-6 for Durham at half time. Durham started the second half with the ball but soon gave it away when *Terrell Thomas* picked off *Philip* Rivers and returned it 24 yards to the Durham 15 yard line. Three plays later, Maurice Jones-Drew followed a block by Maurkice Pouncey up the middle for a 4-yard TD run to give Cowtown a 13-7 advantage. The Thunder Lizards bounced back with a 24-yard field goal by **Adam** Vinatieri to close the gap to three points, then the two teams settled into a punting duel that took the game into the 4th quarter. The Corn Kings broke the stalemate with a 63-yard drive that featured a key 3rd down, 34-yard completion to **Devery Henderson** that put the ball on the 2 yard line. After Jones-Drew was stuffed for losses on two carries, Henderson came through again, getting the dump-off pass from **Joe Flacco** for a 5-yard TD that gave the Corn Kings a 10-point lead with 8:14 remaining. But Durham got that back immediately when David Reed took the ensuing kickoff 89 yards to the house to make the score 20-17. Cowtown put it away on their next series when Flacco went long to **Kevin** Walter for a 33-yard TD pass to give Cowtown a 27-17 lead with 4 minutes left. They would hold the lead and emerge with their 13th win.

List quarter to keep the game scoreless through one period. The Spartans posted their first points after 3 straight carries for 22 yards by *Chris Johnson* brought the Markham linebackers in close to guard the run. *Matt Cassel* took advantage with a 32-yard long pass to *Anquan Boldin* that set up a 1-yard TD run by Johnson to make it 7-0. The Markham offence, quiet until that point, suddenly came alive after a 15-yard personal foul penalty against *Ray Edwards* converted a 3rd and 11 in the Markham zone. *Mark Sanchez* lofted a pass into the arms of *Kenny Britt* for a 24-yard gain and converted a 3rd and 6 with a 10-yard hitch to *Jahvid Best*. Three plays later, on 3rd and 8, Sanchez drilled a long pass into the hands of *Patrick Crayton* for a 29-yard TD pass to even the score at 7. The Spartans bounced right back with a quick drive to the Markham 13 yard line, but a 7-sack by *Rob Ninkovich* and two incomplete passes brought out Scobee for a 38-yard field goal to give Pickering a 10-7 lead at half time. A 5-yard sack by *Ray Edwards* and a holding penalty on *Tyson Clabo* helped stop Markham's opening drive cold, giving the ball to Pickering at their own 46 yard line. *Percy Harvin* turned the corner for a 37-yard end around to the Markham red zone, where Johnson took over and took it the rest of the way to score on a 10-yard run and make it 17-7 for the home team. The North Stars charged right back, converting 3 more 3rd downs on an 80-yard drive that finished with Sanchez finding *Jared Cook* for an 11-yard TD. The rest of the game was a battle for field position with both kickers missing field goals to keep the score at 17-14 and give Pickering their 14th win of the season.

EAME SUMMARY: In the hunt for a playoff berth, the Excaliburs got off to a good start when linebacker **Geno Hayes** intercepted Peyton Manning on the Pats' opening drive and returned it 61 yards for a TD and an early 7-0 lead. That would turn out to be the high point of the game for York and they would not enjoy their lead for long. Starting with poor field position at the 7 yard line after Mike Goodson was tripped up on the kick-off return, the Pats started slowly, with 6 consecutive running plays and a daring, but successful 4 th and inches gamble at their own 17 yard line, but gradually picked up steam. Using the short passing game, they converted another 4th down at their 44 yard line to reach mid-field. Three plays later, Manning connected with Marques Colston on a medium fly that went 36 yards for a TD to tie the game at 7-7. The York offence finally touched the ball at the 3:29 mark of the 1st quarter but gave it way immediately when *Marcus Trufant* intercepted Tom Brady at the York 42 yard line. A 25-yard pass in the flat to Goodson followed by a pass interference penalty on York safety, Danieal Manning set up a 9-yard TD pass to Jason Witten to give Charleswood a 14-7 lead. The Pats got the ball back after a short York drive and moved 78 yards in 18 plays, consuming over 10 minutes on the clock, finishing off with 3 straight carries by Adrian Peterson, who busted the last one into the end zone from 3 yards out to grab a 21-7 lead heading into half time. The Excaliburs started the 2nd half with an 11-play, penalty-riddled drive that stalled at the York 48. Starting at their 26 yard line, the Pats drove all the way to the York 4 yard line where Mike Goodson appeared to have scored; but after review the ball was placed at the one foot line. The Pats tacked on a short field goal to finish off a 24-point burst that carried them through a late York push to lift their record to 10-5 and put a dent in York's post-season hopes.

- Hakeem Nicks caught 12 passes for 116 yards and 2 TDs and Terrell Owens caught 10 passes for 100 yards and 2 TDs.
- Mohave safety, Quintin Mikell made 6 tackles ad intercepted a pass.
- Eli Manning completed 18 of 25 for 234 yards, 1 TD and 1 INT for a game day QB rating of 97.8.
- Dez Bryant caught 6 passes for 71 yards and 1 TD and Mike Thomas caught 5 passes for 65 yards.
- Paul Posluszny made 9 tackles and stuffed 1 run and DeMeco Ryans made 8 tackles and deflected a pass.

GAME SUMMARY: Mohave running back Christopher Ivory broke a 50-yard TD run at the 4:02 mark of the 1st quarter to post a 10-0 lead and give the Hellfire offence a jolt that powered them the rest of the way. The Violators struck back with *Eli Manning* hitting *Dez Bryant* 3 times for 53 yards, including a 14-yard TD toss to round off a quick 66-yard drive to make the score 10-7. However, Mohave came right back with a 66-yard drive to the end zone that featured a 4th and 3 conversion near mid-field and a pair of key 3rd down conversions, including a 5yard TD pass from *Matt Schaub* to *Terrell Owens* to give the Hellfire a 17-7 lead. After *Lawrence Tynes* missed a 52-yard field goal attempt, Mohave added to their lead as Schaub picked apart the Virden secondary, completing 6 of 8 for 48 yards of a 58-yard drive that ended with Schaub finding Hakeem Nicks crossing the middle of the end zone from 4 yards out for a TD and a 24-7 Mohave lead at half time. The Hellfire picked up in the 2nd half where they left off in the 1st, with Ivory breaking a 29-yard run and Schaub completing 4 of 5 for 46 yards, including a 24-yard catch-and-run TD pass to Nicks to make the score 31-7. The Violators took over and held on to the ball for almost a full 9 minutes, covering 61 yards on 15 plays, but ultimately settled for a field goal when Mike Thomas was stopped 5 yards short of a 1st down inside the Mohave red zone. The Hellfire did not let up despite a 21-point lead. With both the rushing and passing games in high gear, Schaub led his team 86 yards in 10 plays and topped it off with a 7-yard TD pass to Owens to increase their lead to 38-10. They added a 48-yard Rob Bironas field goal after a Quintin Mikell interception gave Mohave the ball in Virden territory. As faint playoff hopes vanished, the Violators posted a final TD on a drive consisting of 12-straight carries by **LeGarrette Blount**, who scored on a 13-yard pitch after covering 80 yards of real estate.

- Cam Newton completed 9 of 24 passes for 89 yards, 2 INTs and rushed for 76 yards on 12 carries for 164 total yards.
- Chad Ochocinco caught 2 passes for 25 yards and Knowshon Moreno rushed for 14 yards on 6 carries to "lead" the skill players.
- Barrett Ruud made 11 tackles while Bernard Pollard made 4 tackles, stuffed a run and forced a fumble.

EAME SUMMARY: Three completions to **Tony Gonzalez**, including one for 25 yards, keyed an opening drive that came to a halt at the Chino 8 yard line, forcing the Knights to settle for 26-yard field goal to open the scoring. LA added a second field goal in the 2nd quarter after Antoine Bethea intercepted Cam Newton and returned it 25 yards to the Chino 38 yard line. After gaining a quick first down, Roddy White was stopped short on 3rd and 11, bringing on Carpenter again for a 33-yard field goal to make the score 6-0, Knights. After a pair of punts by each team, the Convicts' suddenly burst free on offence. Newton completed 4 of 5 attempts for 46 yards and ran for 22 in leading his team on a 69-yard drive that he capped off with a 1-yard QB sneak across the goal line, to give the convicts a 7-6 lead at half time. The slim Chino lead did not last long, however. After shutting down Newton and the Convicts on the opening possession of the 2nd half, the Knights took over at their 31 yard line and went on the move. Shonn Greene turned the corner on a sweep and galloped 19 yards to mid-field then Josh Freeman converted 4th and 3 at the Chino 41 with a 14-yard yard sweep. On the next play, Freeman found White over the middle for a 29-yard TD pass to give his team a 13-7 advantage. That is where the score would stay. The 'Blue Shield' stiffened after that and the Convicts' offence could not penetrate, gaining just 4 first downs, one of those on a penalty, over the course of the remaining quarter-and-a-half. Starting their final two drives at their 3 yard line, Chino's rookie QB failed to fight off poor field position and a swarming, hungry Knights' defence in his bid for a miracle comeback. A low throw, incomplete to **Knowshon Moreno** signalled the final play for Chino and the end of their 2011 playoff hopes.

Another 15-yard run by Foster brought his team to the 2 yard line and two plays later Bradford snuck across the goal line from 1 yard out for a TD to make it 17-14. Death Valley countered immediately with a 55-yard pass to *Aaron Hernandez*, setting up a 3-yard TD pass to *Brandon Tate* to re-establish their 10-point advantage, 24-14; but the Cubs fired back with equal speed, with a 17-yard run by Foster setting the stage for a 38-yard TD pass to Wallace to make it 24-21, Undertakers. After *Neil Rackers* tied the game on a 42-yard field goal, Kasay put Death Valley in the lead with a 50-yard boot, only to see the slim lead vanish on the ensuing kickoff with *Michael Spurlock's* 96-yard return for a TD, giving the Cubs their first lead of the game. *Jairus Byrd* and *DeAngelo Hall* both snared interceptions in the final minutes to hold off a Brees rally and the Cubs stayed alive in the playoff race.

It has reached the point where I will call down to the concierge and ask him what the pedestrians are wearing on the street before I will emerge from my condo to tackle the City every day. It's not only annoying as hell; it is also having a deleterious effect on my Healthy Urban Lung Disease (HULD), which has returned this year stronger than ever. I hate winter and I hate people who like winter.

TRENCH WARFARE

Benny Clamp, the lovable but ugly teddy bear of a lug who hosts ABC's weekly TV magazine, 'Crush,' is back with his "Top Ten Trenchmen," and once again making the claim that one of them should be on the ballot for Offensive MVP. Benny's number one candidate for that prestigious honour comes as no surprise because he is the same one he vouched for last year: Los Angeles offensive tackle, **Joe Thomas.** But he's not just saying it because he likes Thomas; he has the stats to back up his claim.

Benny has rating offensive linemen down to a science; whether or not it's a junk science is yet to be determined. But there is no doubting that Benny spends more time breaking down offensive line play than anybody who is not actually coaching an offensive line in the EFL. He pours over tapes of every team in the league and rates the run blocks and pass protection. Once he has determined the 'Big Runs' (runs of 10+ yards or key short down yardage situations) and the 'Bad Runs' (runs resulting in a loss), he determines the player who threw the key block, or missed the key assignment, and assigns that player a 'Big Run' or a 'Bad Run' accordingly. Subtract the bad from the good and another 2 points for each sack allowed, and you have Benny's "Trench Plus-Minus" (TPM) rating. Benny uses the TPM and his own keen sense of good line play to rank his linemen. His Top Ten, revealed this week, contained some names that will surprise most fans and supposed "experts" in the Media.

Ever wonder how the Knights' *Jamaal Charles* is running over the competition at an absurd 6.4 yards-per-carry pace? It's not just his moves and his speed, it's **Joe Thomas**! Thomas is Benny's Top Lineman, "the All Pro of All Pros," he calls him, with a league-leading 44 'Big Runs,' 2 'Bad Runs,' and no sacks allowed for a TPM of **42**! That puts him 23 points ahead of the no. 2 ranked lineman, teammate guard, *Vince Manuwai*, with a TPM of **19** (28/9/0).


Following Thomas and Manuwai, in rank order, are: *Chris Snee* (PIC) 19; *Jahri Evans* (CHI) 18; *Nick Mangold* (DTL) 16; *Doug Free* (CHP) 13; *Jordan Gross* (COW) 10; *David Diehl* (COW) 10; *Jason Peters* (YOR) 9; *Gabe Carimi* (YOR) 9. Both Free and Carimi jump out at the reader as big surprises but Benny stands by his numbers.

Who are the worst offensive linemen in the league? Clamp is keeping his mouth clamped shut on that subject. "Linemen get all the blame when things don't go well and none of the credit when they do," he explains. "I'm not going to add to someone's bad day by letting the world know about it." However, you can find out if you order his book, 'Block Party,' due for release at the end of the season, for just \$29.99 plus shipping and handling.

COACHING FOR DUMMIES

Think of **Brian Billick** and Super Bowl XXXV might be the first thing to come to mind or, in more recent times, EFL TV analyst for FOX. More likely, however, you will think of a coach with a reputation as an excellent offensive coordinator who, as a Head Coach, led a defensive-minded team with a perennially sick offence. This lack of offensive production was Billick's *Achilles' heel* and eventually got him fired. Billick knows what it feels like to be labelled an "under-achiever." He never, in retrospect, got full credit for winning the big one because, in the end, he never changed the nature of the team he coached. The team stayed within its original character and won or lost seemingly in spite of its coach.

It has been reported that Scarborough coach, "Jonesey," struck up a friendship with Billick after a FOX telecast of the Blue Eagles' Week Eleven loss to Pickering. There was a lot of pressure on Scarborough to win that game; it was at home, the Spartans looked beatable, and the Blue Eagles needed the win both for practical reasons and for morale.

The subsequent loss left new owner **Chris Dickinson** and his high school pal-cum-coach, **"Jonesey"** despondent. Feelings of despair and inadequacy drove them, as they had in the old days, to Spanky's Pub on Kingston Road where, to their surprise, they ran into Billick, who for some reason was secretly waiting to meet his agent in this obscure hole-in-the-wall bar. Some say there is no such thing as chance and, in retrospect; this "chance" meeting may have been ordained by the hand of a *Higher Power*.

After a moment of awkwardness, as they lied to each other about why they were there, the trio got comfortable as Tammy the bartender brought an unending stream of draft and shots to the table. In a few hours they were drunk and having a grand old time. The combination of the alcohol with the realization, within their little group, that they were all losers and no longer had to hide that fact from each other, created a bond between them. If my sources are correct, it's a bond that may end up saving the Blue Eagles' season.

Billick may not have been able to see or correct his own situation while he was coach of the Ravens, but there is no doubting that he remains a shrewd observer and a student of the game. His knowledge and expertise were two key things the Scarborough coaching staff was missing. It turns out that, since their chance meeting at Spanky's, Billick has been providing "Jonesey" and his staff with tips and advice via e-mail, telephone, and Skype. The results of this coaching tutelage were

not immediately apparent as Scarborough dropped two of their next three games, including a deeply embarrassing 21-14 home loss to Garland. But this week, things started to click in practice after Billick suggested that "Jonesey" and his staff watch some film of South Carolina.

"Good idea!" said 'Jonesey, "We'll get used to the sites then we can fly down there early and get used to the weather."

"Not South Carolina, the *State*," Billick said with slight exasperation, "South Carolina, the *football team*! Haven't you watched any game film?"

"Game film? What's that?" Jonesey asked.

Professional football players can be just like kids: they will take advantage of the babysitter, which is how they have viewed the Scarborough coaching staff to this point. Watching game film can be tedious, so if nobody is there to tell them to do it, most of them won't do it, which is apparently what has been happening for most of this season. Well, it turns out that a little film can go a long way. *Aaron Rodgers* and *Brandon Marshall* were the principal benefactors of three-day film study session, connecting for three touchdown passes in a 31-17 thumping of the Regulators at Williams-Brice Stadium. Rodgers added a fourth TD pass to *Jermaine Gresham* to post his best statistical day of the season, finishing with a game-day QB rating of 121.4. Perhaps more importantly, for its playoff implications, the defence held off *Tony Romo* and *Frank Gore*, two of the main forces behind a suddenly potent South Carolina offence. "Jonesey" already has the stockpiled film of Gwinnett for the Blue Eagles' Week Sixteen showdown for the South Division. We'll know soon if he can turn the film into a wrap.

I'D LIKE TO THANK MY MOM

Since clinching a playoff berth, the Undertakers have passed first and asked questions later. In Week Fourteen, *Drew Brees* attempted a season-record 61 passes in a 28-16 loss to LA. That number is just 4 shy of the all-time single game record of 65 set by *Matt Ryan* of Garland in the Mustangs' 55-24 loss to Ringgold in the final week of the 2010 season. In Week Fifteen, Brees attempted 51 while trying to out-pace a near career-day for *Sam Bradford* as the Undertakers fell 34-27 to the Cubs at Joe Ferguson Stadium.

It was a much-needed win for **Deron Redding's** team and, with York dropping a decision to Charleswood, now puts them in the driver's seat for the final wildcard berth in the PAC. The Cubs' offence awoke from a 3-week slumber, posting 360 total yards, 236 of those in the second half, to stay close to the pass-happy Undertakers. But it was finally a 96-yard kickoff return for a TD by *Michael Spurlock* that put the Cubs over the top and completed their comeback. **Deron Redding** was his usual buoyant, up-beat self after the win, blathering on excitedly about each player on the team and the loyal support of his coaching staff; he even managed to sneak in a thank you to his parents, grand-parents, various cousins, and his wife for supporting him through this tough season. He handed out 53 game balls, including one to injured Chris Gamble, "because we are all in this *together!*" he bellowed while shaking a stuffed replica of 'Barry the Bear Cub.' "I'm really proud of how we showed resiliency and mental toughness in this win," he said, coming close to tears at the podium. "It would have been real

easy to pack it in after we fell behind 14-0 and were sputtering on offence. But you never gave up. Like a baby bear protecting its mother you showed you were real Cubs!" (Redding can get a little excited and mix up the metaphors, but one gets his drift).

It's the same as it always is after a Cubs' win: Redding's post-game address is like an Academy Award acceptance speech that concludes with a sermon on grit and determination. This one was particularly melodramatic because there have been few wins this year that meant as much as this one. Coming against hated Death Valley, the victory may have turned the tide in a season that appeared to be slipping away fast with 3 straight losses prior to a shaky rebound against feeble Chino last week. The Cubs control their destiny, as Redding pointed out as he approached the climax of his motivational address to his team and the Iowa City faithful. "When you get home tonight to your families, kiss your wives, take some time to play with your children or spend time with others you hold dear to your hearts, say a prayer thanking the Lord for your blessings, and plug in CD #12 of my 'Be the Game Boys' motivational series, entitled: 'Go for It!' Now we turn our focus to the Knights!"

NO RESPECT FOR FLACCO AND CORN KINGS

The Corn Kings are 13-2 after beating Durham 27-17 at Jurassic Park this week and find themselves in a rare position to knock off 14-1 Pickering for the North Division title if they can beat them at home next week. Despite that, one reporter from a major network asked *Joe Flacco* how he felt about coming into Durham and upsetting the now 8-7 Thunder Lizards. The unflappable Flacco looked momentarily flapped as he tried, it appeared, to resolve the illogic of it all. His team was now 5 games ahead of the Thunder Lizards and leading the league in overall offence and defence. Most Power Rankings listed them at number one, ahead of the team they are trailing by one game in the North Division. Yet, here was a reporter asking him how it felt to *upset* the Thunder Lizards. Certainly, it was a big win – the Lizards are talented, had the home field, and sensed they were playing for their playoff survival. Nevertheless, the Vegas line listed Cowtown as a slim favourite on the road, a clear endorsement of their record. Yet, first impressions die hard - even in the face of evidence. The pre-season pre-conception that the Corn Kings were in rebuilding mode has left an indelible impression on the football world. The team itself had declared so. With many of the same players as those who participated in the team's 3-13 campaign last season still on the roster, the question has to be asked: how are they doing it?

Flacco had a simple answer. "We are executing on the field," he said. "We prepare good game plans and execute. We have also been fortunate that when we run into problems on offence, our defence steps up. It's pretty synergistic." If Flacco and the Corn Kings can execute next week against Pickering, they will do the unthinkable – knock a 14-2 team out of the top spot in a Division and grab the #1 seed in the Can-am Conference. Only then, it would appear, will they get the respect they deserve.

AROUND THE EFL

The Convicts eliminated themselves from the playoff race with a deflating 13-7 loss to the Knights at Round Table Stadium in Week 15. Make no mistake - they did it themselves. The disinterested Knights paid respect to the spirit of competition by trying, but some key regulars either did not dress or saw little playing time. The air has been escaping from the Newton Balloon for weeks now and the last remnants finally came sputtering and fluttering to earth with a 7-point, 183-yard, two-turnover performance by the comatose Convicts' offence. Tragically, the only sign of life when Chino had the ball came from *Cam Newton* himself, who rushed for 76 yards in addition to the 89 passing yards to account for 164, or 90% of his team's yards. So, where was the rest of the offence? Where were veterans *Hines Ward*, *Derrick Mason* and *Chad Ochocinco*, or power-back, *Steven Jackson*? According to film of the game they were on the field; or people wearing their numbers were. No player had any comment to make after the game, so we do not know yet what was going through their heads - if anything.

With an opportunity to keep their playoff destiny in their own hands, York went to Patriot Place needing a win by any means. In the end, neither their offence nor their defence stepped up to the challenge in one of the more pathetic team efforts seen by any team this year as the Swords fell 24-17 in a game not nearly as close as the score suggests. After a 61-yard "pick six" by York linebacker, *Geno Hayes* on the opening drive, *Peyton Manning* and the Pats posted 24 unanswered points and held on to the ball for a jaw-breaking 42-and-a-half minutes. As for *Tom Brady*, words cannot do justice to the bleakness of his performance, and that of his supporting cast. If this team makes the playoffs it will be an indictment of the entire Conference.

With one eye looking ahead to their climactic final week clash with Scarborough and the other on the Mustangs, the Glads forced 4 Garland turnovers, three of those *Matt Ryan* interceptions, and used the short field to put just enough points on the board to dispatch the pesky South Division basement-dwellers 20-10 at The Gwinnett Coliseum. **Doug Shirley's** team continued to perfect the 'Swiss 4-3' and worked out the 'Zurich 3-4' while playing the perfect sparring partner for Gwinnett to prepare them for their real test coming up this week.

It was a similar situation in Pickering as the distracted Spartans held off the annoying North Stars, 17-14 in a game marred by a referee's oversight as the Spartans clung to a 3-point lead with less than two minutes left. The ref forgot to advance the ball after a Pickering first down and nobody except **Gus Konstantakos** noticed until 4th down had been announced. Luckily, Pickering won anyway, thereby preventing a homicide.



JiMMy'S Week FIFTEEN PICKS

GWINNETT @ SCARBOROUGH (line – GLADIATORS by 1)

In spite of all their troubles throughout the course of an under-achieving season, the Blue Eagles can actually win the South Division with a victory over Gwinnett this week. The Glads have not been able to gain separation from their unlucky rival despite near-catastrophic stumbling by the team favoured by most to win their third championship, albeit under a different name than the first two. Now it comes down to one game. Based on both teams' body of work this season, the Glads have to be the favourite here; but one must pause to consider the home field advantage and a strong performance by the Scarborough offence last week in South Carolina. If Aaron Rodgers is finally on track, it could give the over-worked Scarborough defence a much-needed boost. Leading in no category except sacks (38) they have been an embarrassment defending the run and mediocre just about everywhere else. They *think* they are the best, but now the Blue Eagles 'D' must balls up and prove it or shut up. The Glads are playing defence at a high level but are not blowing up anybody with their offence despite more weapons than the Pentagon. I'm blaming the lack of finish by the Glads' offence on Big Ben's tendency to be an occasional idiot. So, the match-up I see is this: an under-achieving offence against an under-achieving defence when Gwinnett has the

ball; and an under-achieving offence against one of the league's best defences when Scarborough has the ball. It does not take the proverbial "rocket scientist" to see where this game is going, but I don't expect it to be decided conventionally. A big turnover will carry the day and I am guessing the Glads will be the beneficiary. **PICK: GWINNETT**

SOUTH CAROLINA @ GARLAND (line – MUSTANGS by 1)

Both these teams are 4-11 and going nowhere except to position themselves on the 2012 rookie draft board. Neither team will admit it publicly but neither really wants to win this game. I know that reality comes as a shock to those naive few who think pride plays a role in the manliest of games – it may to the players, but not to the coaches, unless their jobs are on the line. Mysteriously, neither one of these two losing coaches is in the remotest danger of losing his job if one of them were to lose this game. Doug Shirley is revered in small town Texas and Hal Corson has at least one more year of grace before the fans and Media start calling for his head to be stuck on a pike. This one is a virtual coin flip and a game to be avoided if you are betting the mortgage money. However, if you *must* bet the mortgage money because a beefy, mean man with a crowbar is threatening you with bodily harm, or worse, if you don't pay back the \$130,000 you lost betting on Scarborough this year, then go with the home team. PICK: GARLAND

PICKERING @ COWTOWN (line – CORN KINGS by 7)

This is it – the battle for the North Division crown. Pause, for one moment, to recognize the achievements of both of these teams – a combined 27-3 heading into the final week of the season and now fighting it out for home field advantage in the playoffs. The fact that the two teams with the best records in the league are fighting it out in the same division is not actually a surprise. The surprise is that it is happening in the North Division; not the South Division, where it was originally predicted by many analysts. According to 'Professional Football Focus,' a statistics-based rating agency, neither of these teams should be where they are now in the standings; which begs the question: "how are they doing it?" As a bettor, I care less about "how" and more about "will." In the world of "will," I see Pickering as the team most likely to defy the odds and carry the day on the road against the team with the overall statistical edge; mainly because they are the Champions and carry the pedigree. Pickering's Kyle Vanden Bosch is out, but otherwise there are no significant injuries to report for either team. The Corn Kings probably deserve their favourite status, but the Spartans will continue to get the job done against the odds, just as they have all year. PICK: PICKERING

MARKHAM @ DURHAM (line - THUNDER LIZARDS by 9)

Durham must win this game to stay alive in the playoff race, but if they do, their fate will still depend on the outcome of the Scarborough and Gwinnett match-up – a Gwinnett win means a wildcard berth for Durham, but a Scarborough win means elimination. The Thunder Lizards no longer control their fate but they can increase their odds with a win against the only doormat left in the North Division – Markham. The team with only six defensive backs has just five healthy ones heading into Week Sixteen. That means the North Stars cannot field a 'Dime' package, forget a 'Quarter' defence; but that fine point is not likely to matter a lot as such defences are usually employed by teams protecting a lead – an unlikely situation for Markham. With the home field in their favour, the Thunder Lizards are well-positioned to tear apart the Markham offence and in an even better position to stop Mark Sanchez and his feeble supporting cast. But the same could have been said about Pickering last week and the North Stars gave them a run for their money. Like always with the league's most un-inspiring team there is an element of uncertainty about how they will perform heading into each game. I think I have them finally figured out, but don't ask me to explain it. I was right about them covering the spread versus Pickering last week and I will be right again in picking them to come up short at Jurassic Park. PICK: DURHAM

VIRDEN @ YORK (line – EXCALIBURS by 4)

The pitiful performance by York last week has frightened away bettor's support heading into this do-or-die contest, shrinking the line down from 6 points at the beginning of the week to the number you see above. By falling to Charleswood in ignoble fashion, the Excaliburs have created for themselves a dilemma: they could very well do *and* die, if Iowa City knocks off the Knights. They are also demoralized. The York receiving corps is actually regressing, a development previously thought to be impossible given the extent of their season-long troubles. This is having an effect on the entire offence, including Tom Brady, and the malaise has spread to the defence. The Violators have nothing to play for except the joy of beating a team when it's down – an activity they apparently enjoy. I don't expect Virden to completely have its way with struggling York, but I expect that Brady will have an unwelcome fight on his hands. **PICK: VIRDEN**

LOS ANGELES @ IOWA CITY (line - KNIGHTS by 1)

For the second straight week the Knights will go through the motions against a Divisional opponent. Last week the motions were enough to dispatch the tired Convicts; this week will be a different story. The Cubs' offence awoke from a three-week nap and hung 34 points on the Undertakers in Week Fifteen. Okay, it was the Undertakers' defence – not exactly the cream-of-the-crop – but the point is that the Cubs have regained a bit of their lost swagger. Attitude is the most important thing for Iowa's coach and he likes what he sees at the moment. His team has been practicing hard all week, knowing they can clinch the final playoff berth in the PAC if they can ambush the Knights at Joe Ferguson Stadium. Having long ago clinched the West Division and having just recently locked up the number one seed in the PAC, the Knights' motivation in this game consists almost entirely of a virulent, undying loathing of their opponent. LA would like nothing better than to end the Cubs' season this week and avoid having to face them in the playoffs. Don't expect the Knights to play safe and count on Iowa City to charge hard out of the gate. It will be a good game, down to the wire. **PICK: LOS ANGELES**

MOHAVE @ CHARLESWOOD (line – PATRIOTS by 10)

The Hellfire have lit a fire under their offence too late to be of any real benefit but early enough to jeopardize their draft status. Not to worry, you Mohave fans looking to the future; the Pats will put Matt Schaub back in his place and ensure that he does not reach the 60% completion mark for the season. With nothing to play for but pride, Charleswood slowly crushed York to death last week and did it so methodically and effortlessly that nobody is concerned that they tired themselves out with the effort. A similar kind of game is very possible this week as Peyton Manning, never one to take any game lightly, sits alone studying film, determined to add another easy win to his statistical legacy. If you value money, taking the Pats is a good buy. **PICK: CHARLESWOOD**

CHINO @ DEATH VALLEY (line – UNDERTAKERS by5)

Expect the Undertakers to continue their passing experiments this week against the Great Wall of Chino. If you're interested in a real betting challenge, forget the game; the over/under line for Death Valley called running plays this week is 6 and worth a look at the "under." The Undertakers have made it clear since they locked themselves into the third seed that the rest of the season would be about fine-tuning the Death Machine for a post-season rampage. The defence is experimenting with pass coverage and "Crazy" Clay Matthews is resting up for even scarier berserker rages in the playoffs. On Chino's side of the fence, the situation is grim – even for a team that calls a refitted prison its home. Punishment drills have become so severe that players are reportedly faking injury to avoid practice. No wonder the running backs can't run and receivers can't get open. The Convicts just want the season to end so they can sit in their cells and watch American Idol auditions. **PICK: DEATH VALLEY**
