VIRDEN — One has to look back to Week Three of the EFL's inaugural season, when the Anchorage Buccaneers beat Durham 31-28 on a 6-yard touchdown run by Joseph Addai, to find the last and only other time the Virden franchise won two games in a row. This week they did it for the second time in their history thanks to *Adam Vinatieri's* 35-yard field goal with 7 seconds remaining to squeak by the Winnemucca Outlaws 22-20. The thrill-seeking crowd of Violators fans at the *TERRORDOME* savoured the victory while they hoped that they won't have to wait another two years for their next pair of back-to-back wins.

Virden jumped out of the gate quickly, putting Winnemucca back on their heels, moving the ball with ease on their opening drive. *Drew Brees* converted a 3rd and 20 on a 23-yard pass to *Devin Hester* and 6 plays later *Clinton Portis* busted through the Outlaws' line to charge 29 yards to the Winnemucca 8 yard line, where he promptly fumbled away the ball trying shake away from linebacker *Zac Diles*. Virden challenged the call on the field, claiming that Portis' knee was down before the ball came out, but there was inconclusive evidence to overturn the ruling and the play stood. *David Garrard* immediately gave the ball back to Virden on a pick when he checked down to corner *Brian Williams* instead of receiver *Michael Crabtree*, but the Violators' *Adam Vinatieri* missed a 49 yard field goal attempt to keep the score blank. Finally, Virden was able to ride their early momentum to a big score on their next possession when *Drew Brees* connected with *Marvin Harrison* for their second 33-yard TD pass in as many weeks to draw first blood (which, incidentally, in the *TERRORDOME* literally means "first blood").

The Outlaws' offence woke up and answered with a grueling and impressive drive that lasted 15 plays over almost 9 full minutes and featured 5 straight runs by *Julius Jones* to set up a *David Garrard* 5-yard TD pass to tight end *L.J. Smith* to tie the game at 7. The deadlock would not last long. *Brian Dawkins* intercepted Brees on the next play from scrimmage and returned it to the Virden 27 yard line. A 12-yard run by *Pierre Thomas* brought the Outlaws inside the red zone and Thomas finished it off two plays later with a 7-yard run for a TD to make it 14-7for Winnemucca. Vinatieri would start another fine day with the boot by kicking a 42-yard field goal near the end of the second quarter to make the score 14-10 for Winnemucca at the half.

The second half started badly for the Outlaws. With punter Kyle Larson sitting on the bench, quarterback David Garrard tried to

punt the ball on 4th down and mishandled the snap. Virden took over at the 15 and although they couldn't gain a first down, an easy Vinatieri field goal narrowed the Winnemucca lead to 14-13. Garrard re-created some breathing room, firing a bolt on the mark to *Delanie Walker* for a 23-yard TD pass that, after a failed two-point conversion attempt, made the score 20-13.

Both teams drifted into the doldrums offensively until a 15-yard facemask penalty on *Brian Dawkins* turned a 12-yard pass to *Robert Royal* into a 27-yard gain for Virden. It put them in position for Vinatieri's third field goal from 39 yards out to narrow the Outlaws' lead to 20-16. After a three-and-out by Winnemucca on their next series, a short punt by Larson gave Virden good field position. Vinatieri rescued a shaky drive with a booming 50-yard field goal to pull Virden within 1 point. Following another three-and-out by the suddenly stagnant Outlaws' offence, Virden got the ball back at their own 34 with exactly 2 minutes left in the game. A 20-yard pass from Brees to Harrison brought the ball across midfield and into the outer edge of Vinatieri's range. Three more plays pushed the ball into the red zone where Coach Barrate elected to kick on second down with 7 seconds left. That's when Vinatieri kicked the game-winner from 35 yards out, his fifth field goal on the day, to give Virden the hard fought win.

DRAGONS DUMP DURHAM – STAY UNDEFEATED

GAME POINTS: LaRon Landry picked off Philip Rivers to stop a Durham drive deep in Florida territory early in the second quarter, leading to a 28-yard TD pass from Aaron Rodgers to Brandon Marshall to give the Dragons a 10-0 lead and all the points they would need. The T-Lizards could not solve a Florida defense that limited them to 24 minutes of possession and just one third down conversion in 13 attempts. Florida's **DeAngelo Williams** put the game out of reach with 10 straight carries for 61 yards and a 1-yard TD run in the opening drive of the third quarter.

NEW YORK – Count me among the "paranoid" who plan on declining the H1N1 vaccine. The seasonal flu kills between 250,000 and 500,000 people worldwide each year. The death toll to date from "Swine Flu" is just over 5,000. Australia just completed its' so-called "second wave" of flu, without widespread vaccination, and lost 185 people to the virus compared with roughly 3,000 to the "regular" flu. There are differences between regular flu and H1N1 that cause concern for health workers – younger people are infected at a higher rate and the genetic content of H1N1 makes it a risk to become more virulent. Parents are rightly concerned about their kids. If I were a parent, I would probably knuckle under and get the shot for them and pray that the drug companies know what they're doing. But for me, I'm not falling for the hype. The mixed messages from the "experts" and the selective Media reporting make me suspicious. Regardless, I never get a seasonal flu shot and I am not about to get one now just because "Presidential Candidate" Barrack Obama has declared the swine flu a National Emergency. Plus, I hate needles.

THE GROUND GAME HAS RUN ITS COURE

Everyone knows that a successful passing game is the foundation of a good modern offence and has been since Bill Walsh's 49ers pioneered the West Coast Offence in the early 80's. What is only beginning to dawn on analysts is how much the running game is taking a backseat to the passing game these days. I make this point following a week in which a number of teams used the running game effectively to preserve and, in a couple of cases, extend leads. Seeing this and being surprised by it told me that I had not been seeing it much.

Fewer and fewer teams are running the ball as the focus of their offence. Those who try are being denied. Mohave has tried nothing *but* the run for two consecutive weeks, completely forgetting the pass against two of the league's best pass defenses and has gone nowhere offensively. Markham's rushing and ball control numbers looked great this week against Garland but they lost 31-11. Pickering bucked all recent trends by sticking with the run after *Chris Johnson* sparked their attack with a 58-yard TD on a pitch to the outside. Shades of *Walter Payton* in the good ol' days! But that is the exception that proves the rule.

This does not mean that running the ball effectively is no longer important – but good running is a mere supplement to the passing game in today's schemes. A dangerous running back with big-play potential is a deterrent to the opponent's pass rush, not a reliable weapon for regular use. Just ask Durham's *Michael Turner*, who threw himself against the Florida "firewall" while it stood in pass defense mode and was completely frustrated. Interestingly, the top three individual rushers in Week 5 were on losing teams.

The ability to run, or stop the run, has seemingly no statistical relation to overall success – at least to this point in the season. Iowa City is best in the league at stopping the run but sits at the bottom of the standings with a 1-4 record. Garland is surrendering almost 5 yards a carry on the ground and runs it on offence for a measly 2.8 yards a carry and is surprising everyone with a 3-2 record. Conversely, Pickering is rushing the ball at 4.9 yards a pop and has a 2-3 record to show for it.

There are, of course, a number of variables in team success that I am not accounting for: such as defense, player match-ups, coaching, game situations and sheer luck. Turnovers, of course, always play a huge role. However, the old conventional wisdom that teams that run the ball and control the clock control the outcome of games is looking increasingly outdated.

THE TERRORDOME – A PLACE OF JOY?

The haunted house that is Virden's stadium, the **TERRORDOME**, was rocking with excitement and smiling faces after the Violators' 22-20 victory over Winnemucca. It was the team's second consecutive win, only the second time in the dismal history of the franchise that they have managed the feat of following up a win with

a win. How long will this happiness last? I hope it lasts a little longer, if only to validate what I have been saying about this team since its inception: that with *Drew Brees* at quarterback they can be competitive. Unfortunately, the upward trend of relative success is bound to take a turn for the worse, probably sooner rather than later. The reason? They have *only Drew Brees* and nothing else! A fire sale on talent and some questionable acquisitions toward the end of **Anthony Fenton's** tenure as owner and GM has crippled the Violators for at least a couple of years. Right now they are getting good coaching but eventually **Lance Barrate** will run out of tricks and the players will revert to who they are. The good news for fans of Virden is that the new Front Office is serious about rebuilding and putting a competitive product on the field. It should not be long before the Violators strike terror into their opponents instead of their fans.

SHE NEEDS TO BE ARRESTED AND JAILED

Predictably, the situation finally got out of control in Markham with the 'Fat Lady in Row 54.' The "Shame of Markham" was charged with Uttering Death Threats, Aggravated Assault, 5 counts of Assault Causing Bodily Harm, 27 counts of simple Assault, 63 counts of Mischief, Common Nuisance, Indecent Act, and Causing a Disturbance after last week's game between Garland and Markham. The North Stars' *biggest* cheerleader went berserk after Markham turned the ball over on downs at mid-field and Garland quarterback *Matt Ryan* went deep to *Wes Welker* on the next play for 52-yard touchdown pass to give the Mustangs an insurmountable 31-5 lead with 7 minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

The Fat Lady's rampage began with a string of crude invective directed at Ryan that would have shocked Sarah Silverman; escalated to obscene gestures and removal of portions of her clothing; and then ended with her throwing drinks, food and 'Depends' undergarments (used and unused), at spectators, security and police as they tried to bring her under control. The debacle caused a temporary stoppage in play on the field as players and officials stared up at the stands in shock. Part of the outrageous scene was actually broadcast live on National Television before a network censor woke up and shut down the video feed from the stadium. Fortunately a colleague of mine was actually in the same section and saw and heard everything.

He says it was one of the most unnerving things he has ever experienced – the Fat Lady was so loud and powerful that you could actually smell her fetid cheese dog breath and feel light sprays of spittle from 20 rows away. He was hit in the ear by a jumbo hot dog and considers himself one of the lucky ones. A security officer suffered permanent injury when the Fat Lady got a hold of him and took a bite out of his calf.

Bizarrely, she has yet to be arrested and jailed for any of this. She remains at the stadium recuperating from a mild heart attack brought on by the stress of her outburst. They cannot move her. Technically she was arrested, according to a Police spokesman, who explained that the Fat Lady was "not free to leave" when Police attempted to secure her and was, therefore, "arrested." She is now apparently "in custody," but remains sitting in her row of seats due to her medical condition and her extreme obesity. She cannot walk and officials are afraid that hoisting her up with a crane will aggravate her heart.

A Bail Hearing was held in Rows 53 and 52 on Monday morning and because of this legal proceeding the public now knows that the woman who people had dubbed simply, "the Fat Lady," is actually Gretta Frances Clapper, a 38-year old divorcee from Holland's Landing, Ontario. During the week she works as a "telemarketer" for a "1-900" firm. She has two children, both living with their father, who has full custody. Other details of her private life are under a Court-ordered publication ban as revealing them might prejudice her trial. She is banned from 'The Dawg Pound' as part of her release conditions but since she cannot actually move, she remains "in custody" at the stadium under 24-hour guard.

The word "embarrassment" is not sufficient to describe this whole sorry situation. "Outrage" is more appropriate. I blame management at 'The Dawg Pound' and North Stars' owner **Darrin Jones** for it. They not only condoned this Circus Freak's behaviour, they encouraged it. 'Fat Lady' T-shirts (available only in extra large sizes) and 'Fat Lady Triple Jumbo' hot dogs are hot sellers at the concessions. Clapper herself spends a small fortune on food at the stadium. Where she gets the money for it is unclear, but the "1-900" business must be booming. Markham hosts Chino next week. It will be interesting to see how officials handle the situation if the Fat Lady is still occupying Row 54.

FLORIDA IN THE POST-BRADY ERA

Could it be that we on the outside of the Florida organization were wrong about *Aaron Rodgers*? At this point last season, the *Tom Brady*-led Dragons were rated 8th in the league in overall offence at 5.3 yards per play. This year they sit at #6, gaining 5.2 yards per play in a year when offensive output is down. Last year at this time, *Tom Brady* was the sixth rated passer in the league with a 92.7 QB rating. This year, *Aaron Rodgers* is also the sixth rated passer in the league with a 92.9 QB rating. Last year Florida was 5-0 after five weeks as

they are this year. Last year, the Florida offence got better as the year progressed and finished #1. *Tom Brady* led the league in passing with a 114.3 QB rating en route to the league Offensive MVP award. *Aaron Rodgers* has his work cut out for him if he is going to follow in Brady's footsteps, but so far he is doing no worse than Brady did. Some pundits are even opining that Florida may be better this year with Rodgers at the helm. I'm not ready to go there, but until a team steps up and stops him I will be giving Rodgers the benefit of the doubt.

NEW YORK GRIPES

Kurt Warner is reportedly unhappy with Mohave coach, **Bobby Elder**. The veteran QB has attempted just 11 passes in the past 2 games and could not conceal his frustration late in the game against Chino. "Booorrrring," he was heard to yell at the start of the snap count before his 22nd consecutive handoff to **Steve Slaton**. Far from being a sign of lack of professionalism, I think Warner's insubordinate outburst was decidedly understated. If I were a Hellfire fan, I would be outraged at the coaching staff. At least *try* to move the ball through the air! With a game plan like that you might as well have **Kellen Clemens** behind center.

The stink from Iowa City is wafting like the most putrid flatulence under the noses of the league's sportswriters and television commentators and nobody is saying anything about who dealt it. Journalists want to see the Cubs do well because they generally like **Deron Redding** and many have staked reputations on Iowa City challenging Chino for the West Division title. Well allow me to be the first to openly declare that the Cubs *STINK!* They are a bunch of pampered, overpaid, bumbling clowns and *Trent Edwards* is a mincing panty-waist who is afraid to throw the ball more than 5 yards downfield. There! That should open up the commentary a bit!



JIMMY'S WEEK SIX PICKS

FLORIDA @ KUTZTOWN (LINE - DRAGONS BY 9)

The Dragons got bit by the injury bug last week and will be missing Heath Miller and Lofa Tatupu for this contest. The Golden Bears will be without Tracy Porter and Leroy Hill, which will hurt against both the pass and the run. So far Florida has done everything right this season – they lead the league in both points scored and in fewest points surrendered. This has been because of a balanced offence and an impenetrable defense. Opposing QBs are passing at a pathetic 52.8 efficiency rate against them. That's bad news for Tony Romo, who is starting to feel the effects of no run support. It will take a minor miracle to keep this game close.

PICK: FLORIDA

GWINNETT @ VIRDEN (LINE - VIOLATORS BY 2)

Virden is in a position to post a franchise first three-game winning streak if they can find a way to knock off the Gladiators. It's possible – Virden is healthy while Gwinnett is missing D.J. Williams and will have to start H.B. Blades at linebacker. Matt Cassel is posting 'Pro Bowl' numbers but he can thank Thomas Jones's league-leading 473 rushing yards for that success. The Glads' offensive line looked bad when it mattered last week against Cowtown, raising questions about their ability to come from behind. Despite the hype for Virden and the fans' sudden love affair with Drew Brees, I don't think the Violators are ready for a run of victories. They are playing solid defense and getting just enough offense to stay close. They will stay close in this one, but they will not win. Gwinnett is coming off a loss and their star players will come to play.

PICK: GWINNETT

CHARLESWOOD @ RINGGOLD (LINE - PATRIOTS BY 6)

The Crimson Hawks have a -7 turnover ratio in addition to being near the bottom of the league in offense. They managed their one win because they crammed most of their season's offence into one game against Cowtown in Week Four. That single performance stands alone and don't expect a repeat of it this week against the Pats' defense. Despite the injury to Adalius Thomas and Asante Samuel being questionable for this contest, Charleswood will have no trouble stopping Ringgold and they should be able to move the ball well enough without Chris Samuels on the line to gradually pull away and cover the spread.

MOHAVE @ GARLAND (LINE - MUSTANGS BY 4)

These are two teams going in opposite and unexpected directions. Mohave has lost 3 straight and appears stuck in neutral while Garland is enjoying a 2-game winning streak and a surprising 3-2 record. It is hard to gauge Mohave at this point – they are coming off losses to two good defenses in which they employed an unconventional offence to little effect. They should be able to run the ball against the worst run defense in the league but do they *want* to? The Mustangs have been following Matt Ryan's jet stream and striking quickly on offence. Yes, they have moved the ball well, but their 40% third down conversion rate ranks in the bottom half of the league and their turnovers have been inopportune, half of them coming in opponent's territory to stop scoring drives. On the other hand, the top rated LA defense is playing like it and moving the ball well on offence to boot. Although some cracks appeared in Jason Campbell's game last week against Kutztown, don't expect the same problems at home this week against Durham. The Thunder Lizards must make some dramatic adjustments on offence or fall to 3-3.

PICK: LOS ANGELES

COWTOWN @ WINNEMUCCA (LINE - CORN KINGS BY 4)

David Garrard had success against Cowtown's secondary last year when it was a better group. This year, Garrard has more weapons at his disposal and the Corn Kings are last in the league defending the pass, meaning Winnmucca should be able to put some points on the board. Expect him to see a lot of action this week as the Cubs try to draw the Pickering linebackers and safeties into the box so Trent can air it out against the likes of William Gay and Abram Elam. The Cubs' run defense should be able to limit the damage that Chris Johnson can inflict on the ground, forcing Eli to the air to move the ball and score. Dare I pick Iowa City again? Here it goes.....

PICK: IOWA CITY

CHINO @ MARKHAM (LINE - CONVICTS BY 8)

The interesting thing about this game is that there is nothing interesting about it at all. I am curious about nothing except whether or not the Fat Lady will still be in Row 54 come game time. The Convicts' defense will keep McNabb in quarantine and Jamal Lewis in solitary confinement. Chino's running game will continue to get back on track with or without L.T. Markham is in for another long day.
