



HIGHLIGHT REFEL: Ronde Barber returned two interceptions for touchdowns, the first on a lateral from Antoine Cason, to lead the rout.

- Rashad Jennings rushed for 101 yards and 1 TD on 11 carries.
- Matt Cassel completed only 6 passes in 13 attempts with 1 interception, but gained 130 yards and scored 2 TDs.
- Peyton Manning attempted 57 passes, completing 32 for 302 yards but also threw 4 interceptions.
- Oshiomogho Atogwe made 9 tackles, 4 deflections, 1 run stuff, and returned an interception for a TD to stand out for the defence.

EAME SUMMARY: Things got off to a great start for the Patriots in the 2010 EFL Championship re-match when **Melvin Bullitt** picked off a pass from Matt Cassel on 3rd and long and ran it back 23 yards for the opening TD. A sailing snap over the head of Pats' punter Jason Baker on the Pats' next possession gave Pickering the ball at the Charleswood 1 yard line. After getting stuffed for a loss, Chris Johnson carried it over from 2 yards on the next play to even the score at 7. Peyton Manning responded with passes of 54 and 17 yards to Santonio Holmes then connected with Jason Witten for a TD from 9 yards out to take back the lead, 14-7. That would be as high as Charleswood would get, however. After a Spartans' field goal, Oshiomogho Atogwe picked off Manning as the Pats crossed mid-field and returned it 60 yards for a TD to give Pickering a 17-14 lead. After another Josh Scobee field goal to make it 20-14, Mike Goodson fumbled away the kick return, giving Pickering the ball at the 23 yard line. Rashad Jennings and Darren Sproles took them close and Cassel finished it off with a 6-yard TD pass to Sproles to extend the Pickering lead to 27-14 with over six minutes still remaining in the half. The Spartans were not done. Facing 3rd and 12 at their 38, Manning's pass to Jacoby Jones was picked off by Antoine Cason. He lateralled the ball to Ronde Barber and he took it 51 yards to the house. A late field goal by Charleswood made it 34-17 at half time. The second half opened well for the Pats with a 74-yard TD run by Adrian Peterson to make it 34-24. But optimism would be fleeting for the home team. Anguan Boldin broke free after snaring a short slant and took it 78 yards for another TD. Ronde Barber added a "pick six" in the 4th quarter to top off a shockingly easy rout.

- Santana Moss caught 5 passes for 114 yards and 3 TDs, including a 62-yarder.
- Maurice Jones-Drew and Brandon Jackson combined for 186 yards rushing and 65 receiving yards. Jackson added a rushing TD.
- Matt Schaub went 19 of 27 for 231 yards and 1 TD, but was also picked off twice.
- Chris Ivory carried the ball18 times for 95 yards.
- The Corn Kings converted 9 of 11 first downs.

EAME SUMMARY: Cowtown took the opening drive 80 yards in under 4 minutes on the strength of a 22-yard run by **Maurice Jones-**Drew and a 36-yard pass to Brandon Jackson to strike first on a 9-yard TD pass from Joe Flacco to Zach Miller. The Corn King machine stalled briefly as the teams traded punts then kicked back into gear in the final minutes of the first guarter when Jackson ripped off a 21-yard run and Flacco followed with a 20-yard pass to Miller then a 17-yard TD pass to Santana Moss, his first of three on the day, to make it 14-0. Mohave got back in the game with a grinding 85-yard drive that burned nearly 10 minutes off the clock. A 27-yard completion from *Matt Schaub* to Benjamin Watson on 3rd and 22 kept it alive then six straight runs by Daniel Thomas, the last for 19 yards to the end zone, completed the epic journey that breathed life into the fans at the Fiery Depths. But when Cowtown got the ball back they continued to roll like a giant cob over the Mohave defence. A 37-yard pass to Kevin Walter sparked a pass-only drive that saw Flacco go 5 for 6 for 80 yards and finish it off with a 15-yard TD toss to Moss to make it 21-7. A mere two minutes later, the Corn Kings added another when Moss broke free behind coverage and carried a medium fly 62 yards to pay dirt for a 28-7 half time lead. Charles Godfrey picked off Schaub to start the second half and Jackson broke a 42-yard long run for another TD to make it 35-7. Mohave added two TDs in garbage time to close the margin slightly, but not enough.

- Eli Manning completed 21 of 40 for 270 yards and 2 TDs but also threw 3 interceptions.
- **DeAngleo Williams** rushed for 92 yards and 1 TD on 22 carries.
- Violator reciever Dez Bryant caught 6 passes for 138 yards and 1 TD.
- The Markham defence deflected 11 passes, forced 3 fumbles and made 3 picks.
- Stefan Logan piled up 166 yards returning kicks and punts.

GAME SUMMARY: Antoine Winfield made his league-leading third interception to snuff out Virden's opening drive and set up a 40yard David Akers field goal, giving Markham an early 3-0 lead. Eli Manning atoned for that early miscue with two big completions to Dez Bryant - the first for 34 yards and the second for 6 yards and a TD to grab the lead 7-3. The North Stars crossed up the Violators' defence with some clever play-calling, keeping them off-balance with alternating runs and passes to move the ball 78 yards. A pair of 11-yard runs by DeAngelo Williams, the second for a TD, put the home team back in front 10-7. Going for the big strike, Manning threw deep on Virden's next series and was picked off by safety, Chris Hope, who carried it back 46 yards to the Virden 11 yard line. Four plays later, Jahvid Best was across the goal line from 1 yard out to give Markham a two-score lead, 17-7 early in the 2nd quarter. From that point the offence on both sides suddenly stopped as the teams managed just one first down between them for the rest of the half. No more points would be scored until Virden finally broke through late in the 3rd quarter with a 37-yard field goal by Lawrence Tynes. Markham answered that with a 26-yarder from Akers to regain the 10-point advantage. Virden rallied late with 74-yard drive in which Manning completed 7 of 8 attempts, the last a 10-yard TD pass to Julio Jones. But Terrence Newman shut down Virden's final opportunity with an interception at his 33 yard line with 25 seconds left.

- Calvin Johnson caught 7 passes for 75 yards to lead the Durham wide receivers.
- Tom Brady completed 20 of 40 passes for 207 yards, 1 TD and 1 INT.
- Brandon Jacobs carried the ball 12 times, gaining 59 yards.
- **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie** made 5 tackles, 2 deflections and became the first player to intercept Brady this year.
- Lamarr Houston had 2 sacks, 1 QB pressure, and 1 run stuff to lead the Durham defensive line.

GAME SUMMARY: Trying to jump start a faltering offence, the Excaliburs challenged Durham early by trying to convert a 4th and 1 at the Thunder Lizards' 44. Brandon Jacobs came up a foot short, turning the ball over on downs. Durham marched the other way and with the help of a facemask penalty against Daniel Muir penetrated the York red zone. Philip Rivers found Danny Amendola in the back of the end zone from 13 yards out to give Durham the early 7-0 lead. York took the kick-off and drove to the Durham 39 yard line where they faced 4th down and 6. Again they opted to gamble and again they fell short, giving the ball back to the Lizards, who turned the good field position into a 40-yard Adam Vinatieri field goal for a 10-0 lead. The Lizards would add another 3-pointer before the half for a 13-0 advantage. York finally got on the scoreboard early in the 3rd quarter after a 32-yard pass to **Roy Williams** helped set up a 47-yard **Graham Gano** field goal. After forcing a Durham three-and-out, the Yorkies assembled their most sustained drive of the day, covering 65 yards and ending with a 5-yard out pass to Tony Scheffler to pull within 3 points. On York's next possession, a shanked punt by Sav Rocca gave Durham excellent field position at their 43 yard line. On the ensuing drive, *Tim Tebow* rushed twice for 30 yards and scored on the last from 15 yards to clinch the win for Durham.

- Chad Henne completed 28 of 53 for 278 yards, 1 TD and 2 INTs in place of injured Aaron Rodgers.
- Josh Cribbs rushed twice from scrimmage for 53 yards.
- The Chino Defence deflected 11 passes and stuffed 5 runs
- Scarborough running back, Ray Rice was held to just 48 yards on 24 carries, but scored a TD.
- Justin Tuck had a monster game, making 10 tackles, 1 sack, 2 deflections, 1 run stuff, and 3 QB pressures.

GAME SUMMARY: Billy Cundiff booted a 55-yard field goal with 6 minutes remaining in the 4th quarter to tie the game and force overtime. He then won it on a 36-yard field goal with just 2:23 remaining in extra time to tally Chino's first victory of the season and hand Scarborough their second consecutive loss. Chino got off to a fast start when Brodney Pool picked off Chad Henne deep in Blue Eagles' territory and returned it 10 yards for a touchdown at the 6 minute mark of the 1st quarter. The Convicts used the unconventional running game to build a 17-6 half time lead, getting a 34-yard TD run by rookie quarterback *Cam Newton* on the naked bootleg and a 29-yard Cundiff field goal set up by a 53-yard end around by Josh Cribbs. Scarborough surged back in the second half to take the lead with two quick 3rd quarter touchdowns: the first an 11-yard run by Ray Rice, set up by a 21-yard pass to Brandon Marshall; and the second a 7-yard TD pass to Jermaine Gresham after a 19-yard punt return by CJ Spiller set up a short field starting at the Chino 35 yard line. Brutal defences took over on both sides after that with the Convicts gradually winning the field position battle. Starting on their own 44 yard line, a 17-yard drive, keyed by Derrick Mason's 14-yard reception on 3rd and 9, was enough to get Chino in position for Cundiff's game-tying kick.

- **Peyton Hillis** caught 3 passes for 44 yards to lead all receivers with a 14.7 average.
- The Knights' Defence held Garland to just 1 3rd down conversion in 10 attempts and negative-2 yards rushing.
- Wes Welker caught just 4 passes in 9 targets for 30 yards.

GAME SUMMARY: Mustangs' rookie, Patrick Peterson returned Steve Weatherford's punt 89 yards for a quick opening touchdown. It would turn out to be their lone highlight for game. The Knights replied with the Cedric Benson show, handing the ball off to him 8 times in a 12-play drive, the last carry good for a 2-yard TD run to tie the game. After a quick Garland three-and-out, Eric Weems broke a 42-yard punt return to give the Knights great field position in Garland territory. That set up a 1-yard TD run by Jamaal Charles, giving Los Angeles a 14-7 lead late in the 1st quarter. The teams traded field goals to maintain the 7-point differential heading into half time. The half time adjustments by LA's "Blue Shield" defence were more than the Mustangs could handle. They completely shut down the Garland running game, forcing it backwards 2 yards, and kept Matt Ryan cautious and ineffective through the air. Their answer on offence was to attack the Mustangs' defensive line with a steady does of Charles to start the second half. He carried 4 times for 43 yards on the Knights' second possession of the 3rd quarter, setting up a 1-yard TD pass to Roddy White to give Los Angeles a 24-10 lead. The same pattern continued, with Garland stalling on the attack and Los Angeles pounding the ball into the line in reply. But with **DeMarcus Ware** zeroing in on the blitz, Big Ben lofted the ball in the air a split second too early and Undertaker safety, William Moore jumped the route for the game-saving interception in the end zone. It ended a lively back-and-forth offensive display by both teams that saw Death Valley match Gwinnett TD for TD through most of the 1st half until a botched snap to Glads' punter Andy Lee set the Undertakers up at the Gwinnett 20. Drew Brees took full advantage, hitting Braylon Edwards on a short slant which was good for 18 yards and a TD to give his team a 21-14 lead heading into the locker room. It was a lead that would hold up the rest of the way even as Gwinnett managed to overcome part of a 17-point deficit in the 3rd quarter. Roethlisberger connected deep with Maclin for a 78-yard TD pass to pull within 10 points, 31-21. After trading field goals, the Glads made it a one-score game mid-way in the 4th quarter on a Big Ben 3-yard TD scramble. The Undertakers looked poised to put the game away on a late 4th quarter march into the Gwinnett red zone. Rejecting a field goal attempt for a 6-point lead, Death Valley failed to convert 4th and 5, setting up the dramatic final drive.





ZUCCOTTI PARK – With no place to live while my condo is under repair, I have been taken in by the kind protestors here in Zuccotti Park. These people can be friendly but they are quite crazy. The few who can string together two or more coherent sentences are the *de facto* "leaders," but they make it quite clear the moment you refer to them as such that there are no leaders in the Occupy Wall Street movement. They are merely voices in the non-binding, consensus-based collective decision-making process known as the "people's assembly" (small "p" please), which stretches worldwide in over one thousand cities.

How typical of this younger protest generation that nobody wants to take responsibility for this dull-witted, new age, faux-communist fiasco of a movement. At least the old-fashioned Communists, Marxist-Lenninsts and Maoists stood up personally to be counted and the strong among them were not afraid to lead the weak for the collective good. In the good old days we got to execute or imprison the leaders of these movements when they inevitably collapsed under the weight of their own fallacies while we spared their blind followers. Not this new group! When things eventually fall apart for the 'Occupy' movements we will have to imprison the whole lot of them.

BRING ON EXPANSION!

The EFL wants expansion. Two years ago the membership voted to bring in two new teams, but last year they voted to suspend to process due to upheavals in Kutztown and Ringgold. This year, the secretive and dictatorial Committee of Directors that runs the league in the shadows behind the scenes apparently has bigger plans than anyone anticipated. **Yorgo Kaldis,** grim mouthpiece for 'The Committee' deadpanned in a rare television interview recently that the league is hoping to expand their expansion to four teams instead of two. When a somewhat astonished **Bob Costas** asked if he was joking, or perhaps attempting to create panic in the teetering rival SFL, Kaldis replied, "The SFL is already panicking and I don't know what a joke is."

If this is true (and there is no reason to believe otherwise) then I say bring it on! It does not look as if any of the current ownership groups have plans to move their franchises to New York City so the only way to get a team to the Big Apple may be through expansion. There are no guarantees, of course. The big markets, with the exception of Los Angeles, have been so far unrepresented in the EFL membership; which is a barrier to maximization of revenue. The Chicago bid fell through at the 11th hour last year and since then no sounds have emanated from the large Midwest market. The only confirmed bid for expansion in 2012 is from a Virginia consortium led by **Will Blandford**. Where will the others come from? The league is providing few details but Kaldis went on the record saying, "there is enough interest that we believe we will be able to pick and choose." Let's hope so – for New York's sake!

'BE-WARE' THE UNDERTAKERS!

Ben Roethlisberger's two-game "timeout" was lifted by coach, Dave Birdsall just in time for him to face his "former team" or, to phrase it more accurately, a franchise that Big Ben played for when it had a different name and a very different roster. The faces, the look and the names have changed almost completely since Roethlisberger was a member of the Crimson Hawks (now the Undertakers), but Undertaker DeMarcus Ware remembers his days playing on the defensive side of Big Ben's team. As a result, he was openly itching to get his shots in for all the bad memories of horrendous losses, going back to the days of the pitiable Meadowlands Swamp Dogs, for which he lays the blame at the feet of Big Ben and his maddening inconsistency. "I can say it now," Ware told Death, the Undertakers' grim beat writer, before the game against Gwinnett, "most of the time he was with us, Ben stunk! When he did play well he'd go out celebrating and get arrested. He was arrested every time and the cops always let him go! Pacman is a boy scout next to Ben!"

When told of Ware's comments, Ben replied, "F&^% him!" But in the end, it was Big Ben who F^*#ed himself with a little help from his old friend. With less than a minute remaining in the game, trailing 34-31, the Gladiators faced 1st and goal at the Death Valley 7 yard line after two long passes from the hand of our anti-hero to **Reggie Wayne** and **Jeremy Maclin** covered 64 yards in a mere 22 seconds. The table was set for a *Heroic Moment* for the first year Gladiator pivot

With the capacity crowd at the Coliseum on their feet, Ben dropped back to pass as the most dangerous pass rusher in Death Valley's 'Fearsome Foursome' came at him from the blind side. He lunged past left tackle *Sam Baker* with long arms extended to wrap up his prey. Sensing he was in danger, Ben lofted a floater high into the corner of the end zone, but not high enough. Undertakers' safety, *William Moore* leaped and picked it out of thin air for the game-saving interception. Big Ben didn't get to see it. He lay underneath a frothing and bellowing Ware, who took a little more time than usual to pick himself off the turf to celebrate.

CHAMPIONSHIP RE-MATCH IS NO-MATCH

Just call them the **Pick-Sixering Spartans**! The heralded re-match of last year's Championship game turned into the season's biggest anti-climax as the Spartans demolished the Patriots 55-24 on the strength of three interception returns for touchdowns. *Peyton Manning* doubled his total over the first four games of the season by throwing 4 picks in a single game against his cross-conference rival. This was Charleswood's game to lose and they did not disappoint, literally throwing away a game they were favoured by the majority to win.

Manning, who has a free hand to call his own plays at the line, seemed determined to personally beat the team that had deprived him of a Championship ring last year. *Adrian Peterson*, the league's leading rusher, saw the ball only 13 times while Peyton attempted a whopping 57 passes. An inspired Spartans' secondary responded to Manning's challenge and ended up humbling him in front of his home town fans. While we all know it's a passing league, running backs like Peterson skew

the formula when injected into the game plan. With 107 yards, Peterson made the most of his chances but one has to wonder what he would have done with more touches.

Still, it would have been difficult for Charleswood to overcome the lost fumble and the bad punt snap in addition to the four Manning picks, with the running game alone. This was just a bad day for the Pats while the Spartans, who got a good day from **Rashad Jennings** and a 78-yard catch-and-run from *Anquan Boldin*, reaped the full rewards of opportunism.

UNBEATEN KNIGHTS BEAT DOWN NAGS

The Mustangs devised an ingenious game plan to try and crack the Blue Shield. Designed to take the Knights by surprise, Garland used the weaker part of their offence to attack the strongest part of the Knights' defence.

It's called "challenging" your opponent. It can work wonderfully when the team doing the challenging has something to challenge with. But when you are the Garland Mustangs, trying to spread out the defence with 4 and 5 wide receiver sets does not work against a team with an excellent pass rush and two All Pro cornerbacks shutting down the only two real weapons you have in the vertical passing game. As the game played itself out to its inevitable conclusion, **Peyton Hillis** and **Matt Forte** paced the sidelines in obvious distress. Were they wondering what might have been if they had been permitted to challenge the softer edges of the Knights' defensive line or were they quietly cursing their coach?

While it's never easy facing the Knights' defence, it becomes much harder when half of the offence – the better half – doesn't even get into the game. The Mustangs set a league record they cannot be proud of for most futile performance in the ground game with negative 2 yards rushing on 3 carries – as a *team*! The Knights countered with 250 yards rushing as *Jamaal Charles* and *Cedric Benson* both topped 100 yards on the day. The result was an easy 27-10 win for the EFL's only remaining unbeaten team.

'BAOW CHICK-A-BAOW WAOW!'

The Hellfire's troubles are producing lively and "hot" comment in the local media. **Jack Wannabe**, a controversial local writer who covers several sports franchises in the Mohave area, weighed in with some observations of the 0-5 Hellfire after their embarrassing 38-21 loss at home to Cowtown. Although I cannot reprint them in their entirety, both for copyright and journalistic standards reasons, I can tell you that it involved dubbing the visitors from Cowtown, "Porn Kings" due to the manner in which they handled the Mohave defence.

It was a fitting analogy, except that I am sure the Hellfire did not enjoy the experience one bit. 489 total yards and 38 points by the Cowtown offence more than nullified Mohave's best offensive display so far this year. But the fact that two of their three touchdowns came in garbage time does not change the mildly consoling fact that they managed to score more than 20 points for the first time this season. TRANSCENDENT QUARTERBACKS

The latest rumour to surface in Camleot is that *Tom Brady's* girlfriend is chopping up *psilocybin* mushrooms and tossing them into his salads to expand his vision on the field. If true, it seems to be expanding the number of receivers he sees as well. In a 20-10 loss at home against Durham, York's third consecutive loss, it certainly appeared that a transcendent Brady was seeing things on the field that others were not. This observation about a quarterback is usually meant as a compliment, but in this case it is an extravagant explanation for Brady's perplexing inefficiency – not only in this game, but throughout the entire season so far.

In an otherwise achingly boring game, the other topic worth discussing was Durham's occasional quarterback, *Tim Tebow*, who scored the touchdown that put the game out of reach for York on a 15-yard dive play that only he, as a quarterback of sorts, could pull off against a keying run defence.

Tebow is a unique sports figure who transcends team loyalties and stats. In limited action, Durham's colourful back-up has posted a 70.8 QB rating – boosted by his single completion in 5 attempts being good for a TD – and has rushed 4 times for 28 yards and 2 TDs. To score 3 touchdowns in 4 games while only seeing the field for about 6 minutes is a fairly impressive accomplishment. On the other hand, not being suitable for the remaining available minutes is not so impressive and speaks to how far Tebow has to go before he will be considered a viable starting QB. But, as I have mentioned before, don't tell that to his fans. The blinkered zealots from football's Christian right wing see nothing but Messiah in lefty's long looping delivery and onfield praying.

AROUND THE EFL

The Convicts finally notched a mark in the WIN column against an unlikely victim. The Scarborough Blue Eagles lost their second straight game for the first time since they dropped a 23-22 decision as the Florida Dragons to this same Chino squad in Week 15 of the 2007 season. Folks; "2007" is no typo. It has been four years since that franchise lost two games in a *single season*, let alone two in a row. Interestingly, in two 15-1 seasons following Florida's pedestrian inaugural campaign their only two losses came at the hands of these same Chino Convicts. In fact, Chino, at 4-1, is the only team with an all-time regular-season winning record against the Scarborough/Florida franchise. Purists may wish to put an asterisk beside this win, however. The offensively challenged Convicts got a big hand from Scarborough's *Chad Henne*, starting in place of the injured *Aaron Rodgers*. On the Blue Eagles' second possession, Henne threw his third "pick six" of the season to put his team behind early and went on to post a game day QB rating of 58.5 trying to carry his team against the Great Wall of Chino. *Billy Cundiff's* 36-yard field goal with 2:23 remaining in overtime prevented the Convicts from becoming the first EFL team in history to play for a tie before winning a game.

Another team cracked the goose egg under the 'W' column in Week Five. Despite missing most of their secondary and their best defensive lineman, the Regulators' defence rose to the occasion and surprised the Cubs at Joe Ferguson Stadium. They marginalized *Sam Bradford* while managing to "contain" *Arian Foster* to 142 yards and 1 TD on 29 carries - a 93-yard improvement on their performance against *Chris Johnson* the week before. But the real cause of South Carolina's first victory of the season was an impressive performance under pressure by quarterback *Jason Campbell*. In spite of 8 QB pressures, 1 sack and 3 knockdowns, Campbell singed the Cubs' secondary for 264 yards passing. More importantly, South Carolina converted 12 of 14 third downs under Campbell's unexpectedly calm and deliberate leadership. In the end, it was not a narrow victory for *Hal Corson's* Southern Comfort Crew. They held their lead for most of the game and finished 11 points up on the shocked Cubbies, who fell to 2-3.

Just when I had written off Markham as a "Winnemucca class" team (1-15 two years running for those who don't remember the league's worst franchise) **Darrin Jones'** crew responded with a defiant 20-17 victory over Virden to rise to 2-3. They did it in their usual inconspicuous manner, leaving analysts puzzling over how to explain it (the mind-numbing effects of 11 consecutive punts and only 2 plays over 25 yards – both by the losing team – will blunt the faculties of even the sharpest commentators). Finally, in the wisdom of those who decide such things, **Stefan Logan** was awarded the Game MVP honour for the marvellous accomplishment of averaging 25 yards per kick return and 16.5 yards per punt, accumulating 166 yards in real estate – a full 69% of the total yards gained by the offence. Markham is a real TEAM - they win and lose as one - making it difficult to find a single standout or a single goat (although **Mark Sanchez** is always a viable candidate for that dishonour). The Markham secondary gets honours for having picked off three passes, but dare not boast too loudly about it considering the source – **Eli Manning** has thrown 13 passes to his opponents, more than double the number thrown by the next in line.

MVP WATCH

Long time readers will remember I like to speculate about the league's most valuable players, but I have never broached the subject so early in the season. Unlike last year's Pickering-Florida love-in, this season boasts many candidates for the EFL crown and therefore, more potential candidates for MVP. It's only Week Five, but if the trend continues, LA's *Josh Freeman* will have my vote for the offence while Cowtown's *Tramon Williams* will get my endorsement for the defence. The Knights are the only remaining unbeaten team and, although he did not dominate against Garland, Freeman's presence meant respect for the pass that opened up room for the running game. Meanwhile, Williams, leading the league in deflections and second in interceptions with 2, is the only explanation for the shocking dominance of the Corn Kings' defence, the main reason they are 4-1.

CHARLESWOOD @ GWINNETT (line – GLADS by 4)

I admit it. I am freaked out by Peyton Manning's imitation of his brother Eli in the Pats' blowout loss to Pickering last week. Fortunately for Peyton, Gwinnett's secondary is currently decimated by injuries. Asante Samuel is out and Dunta Robinson is doubtful while the world-beating safety Troy Polamalu questionable. With Casey Hampton also doubtful to start, the Pats have to feel optimistic that they will score some points. The question remains: how many will the Gwinnett offence score back? Big Ben returns for good and is looking dangerous despite a last minute interception in last week's loss to Death Valley. This is shaping up to be a very close contest with the home field tilting the outcome in favour of the home team, but not quite enough for them to beat the spread. **PICK:**

CHARLESWOOD

SOUTH CAROLINA @ MOHAVE (line – REGULATORS by 1)

Proof that the offensive line matters can be found in Mohave. After blaming Matt Schaub and the skill players for one of the worst offences in football after four weeks, the Hellfire attack picked up last week when their battered offensive line faced a weak defensive line in Cowtown. Although it didn't help them win the game, it did show them that they can score when the quarterback has time to throw. That confidence booster should carry over this week against a much worse defence riddled by injuries. Forced to start a rookie, Major Wright, at safety, the Regulators will be highly exposed against a Mohave offence happy to welcome back Hakeem Nicks at wide receiver to compliment Terrell Owens. Expect Jason Campbell to get a wake-up call against Champ Bailey and the Mohave secondary. Felix Jones will find out too late that he can run against the Hellfire line and Mohave will finally win one. **PICK: MOHAVE**

VIRDEN @ SCARBOROUGH (line – BLUE EAGLES by 5)

The main action on this game in Vegas is the "pick line" for Eli Manning: over/under 2. With Darelle Revis and Michael Griffin patrolling the secondary behind a terrifying pass rush, the odds are good that the Scarborough defence could do all the important scoring. With Aaron Rodgers back in action, the offence should account for some scores as well. The Violators continue to compete in games despite mediocre talent but there has to be a point at which the smoke and mirrors no longer fools opponents. On the road at Bluffs Stadium, against a great team smarting from an unexpected two-game losing streak, the Blue Eagles may be the opponent that shows Virden who they really are. I will up the ante on the 5-point spread and call a "Blue Eagle blowout." **PICK: SCARBOROUGH**

YORK @ GARLAND (line – EXCALIBURS by 2)

Strangely, two 1-4 teams meet and the visitor is favoured. This is strictly due to the "Tom Brady Effect," since the Mustangs hold the edge statistically over York in both offence and defence. Old notions die hard and the notion that Tom Brady is still an elite quarterback is dying harder than most. People want to be sure that he is actually drinking, on drugs or on psychedelic substances before betting against him. Well, I need no such reassurances – I have seen enough. Intoxicants or not, if his poor performance to date is not enough to convince you that the Mustangs are the team to beat this week, the absence of Jason Peters at left tackle and Cullen Jenkins at defensive end for York should end the debate. **PICK: GARLAND**

MARKHAM @ CHINO (line – CONVICTS by 3)

For a split second I chuckled and motioned to check off the Convicts, but then caught myself. The Convicts of 2011 are not the Convicts of previous years – they are no lock to win against any team, even Markham. The North Stars remain terrible, in spite of their victory last week against Virden, but they are still the North Stars and are therefore always a candidate to score an upset in unpredictable circumstances. So, is this a game that anyone can win? Theoretically, yes; practically, no. The Great Wall of Chino prevents any realistic chance of a Markham offensive push, leaving Darrin Jones' hopes in the hands of their defence, which is missing Jonathan Babineaux and isn't very good anyway. It appears I have come full circle. **Pick: CHINO**

DURHAM @ LOS ANGELES (line - KNIGHTS by 3)

The Thunder Lizards have the most efficient defence in football and are No. 1 against the pass, but don't bank on an easy road win for the Dinosaurs as a result. Stats can be deceiving and the only statistic that counts is the W-L record, where Durham has faltered twice and the Knights have not. If I had Michael Turner or Michael Bush in my fantasy pool I would be avoiding them this week against an excellent run defence and looking to start Jamaal Charles on the other side against a Durham line that scares nobody. Josh Freeman will have to respect Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie and Adrian Wilson, but not for too long. Expect a close game, possibly overtime.

Pick: LOS ANGELES

PICKERING @ DEATH VALLEY (line – UNDERTAKERS by 6)

In spite of the 'Fearsome Foursome' quartet of linebackers, the Undertakers are ranked last in the league in defensive efficiency, surrendering 384 yards per game. The great equalizer is that they also lead the league in turnovers with 12, a +8 ratio and are ranked second in sacks. The Spartans are becoming a one-dimensional team on offence – a luxury they cannot afford against a team like Death Valley. If Chris Johnson and Rashad Jennings are their only weapons deployed here they will stall eventually and be forced to the air, where the Undertakers will bend a bit before breaking you with a big sack or a turnover. Meanwhile, Drew Brees is leading the EFL in passer rating and Andre Johnson is officially part of the offence again after a slow start. The Undertakers could find themselves in trouble in the running game, where Rashard Mendenhall is occasionally hot, but mostly cold. If Death Valley cannot establish the run it will slow them down enough to make this game nearly dead-even (pardon the pun). The final result can go a field goal either way. **Pick: PICKERING**

IOWA CITY @ COWTOWN (line – CORN KINGS by 8)

There is no team more surprising so far this season than Cowtown. That means that either the experts were wrong about the Corn Kings' prospects or the team is due for a letdown soon. This week they host a Cubs teams that is nursing wounds inflicted by the last-place Regulators in Week Five. The Cubs are looking forward to a game where they should be able to control the ball on the ground and exploit the play-action. If they get behind, however, their young quarterback will almost certainly struggle against the Corn Kings' nickel and dime packages. Joe Flacco is looking good these days and will provide a passing threat that cannot be ignored, but Maurice Jones-Drew is the principal weapon the Cubs must look for. Patrick Willis is back in, which could make all the difference on defence. The key to victory for Cowtown is to force some mistakes from the young Iowa QB and hope they can slow down Foster. Iowa City needs to listen to Deron Redding's motivational CD #5 – 'You Are What You Are,' and play their game without fear. **Pick: IOWA CITY**
