HIGHLIGHT DEEL: Ben Roethlisberger completed 14 of 26 for 181 yards and 1 TD

- Reggie Wayne caught 6 passes for 93 yards and 1 TD, and Jeremy Maclin caught 3 for 44 yards to lead the air attack.
- **Jim Laurinaitis** made 7 tackles, deflected 3 passes and recovered a fumble.
- Darren McFadden rushed 17 times for 66 yards and scored York's only TD.
- Tom Brady completed 20 of 36 for 222 yards and threw 2 rare interceptions for a game day QB rating of 50.9.

CAME SUMMARY: The Excaliburs were never in this game from the beginning. On their opening possession, *Tom Brady* was picked off over the middle by linebacker, Daryl Smith, setting up the Gladiators at the York 44 yard line. Ben Roethlisberger hit Jeremy Maclin for completions of 16 and 21 yards then Ahmad Bradshaw ran it into the end zone from 5 yards out to capitalize on the turnover and give Gwinnett an early 7-0 lead. The York offence fizzled quickly on their next possession, moving the ball 19 yards before punting it back to the Glads. Gwinnett drove the ball back into the York red zone, but had to settle for a 33-yard Josh Brown field goal. Less than one minute later, the Glads got the ball back after Troy Polamalu picked off Brady at the York 33 yard line. Three plays later, Roethlisberger hooked up with Reggie Wayne for a 19-yard TD pass to increase the Gladiators' lead to 17-0 early in the 2nd quarter. The teams traded field goals before the half for a 20-3 Gwinnett lead as the players headed into the locker room. Both teams did not get generate much offence when they returned to the field for the 2nd half. With the 4th quarter looming and still trailing by 17, the Swords gambled on 4th and 7 at their 47, but failed to convert when Leodis McKelvin jarred the ball out of the hands of Roy Williams. Gwinnett took over in York territory and moved into field goal range for Brown, who cashed in 3 points from 48 yards out to increase the Glads' lead to 23-3. York finally struck back with a major to draw within 13 points after Brady connected with Michael Crabtree for 32 yards to set up a 3-yard TD run by Darren McFadden. But, after stopping the Excaliburs on 4th and 23 at the York 22, the Gladiators put the game on ice with a Bradshaw-only drive of 5 straight carries for the final TD.

returned it 34 yards to the Durham 41 yard line. With a chance for a field goal at the 33 yard line, the Convicts went for it on 4th and 2 and **Steven Jackson** converted with a 4-yard run. A 9-yard bootleg by **Cam Newton**, an 11-yard run by Jackson, and then a second 9-yard bootleg for a TD by Newton, put Chino in front 20-13, a lead they would hold and add onto in the 2nd half. It was a big turning point for the Convicts. The Thunder Lizards had led 13-10 at half time on the strength of a 44-yard TD pass from Rivers to **Antonio Gates** and two chip shot **Adam Vinatieri** field goals – the second coming 12 plays after **Devin McCourty** forced a Jackson fumble, recovered by **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, at the Durham 31 yard line. Down 13-3 at that point, the Convicts were able to tack on a late 1st half TD after Jackson atoned for his fumble with a 32-yard run; Newton then rambled for another 25 yards on a bootleg and threw a 9-yard TD pass to **Hines Ward**, one of just 6 completions on the afternoon for the Chino rookie QB. The Convicts' defence shut down the Durham offence in the 2nd half and eventually the offence caught up and put the game away decisively. After 3 consecutive three-and-outs by Durham, Newtown finished off a 3-play scoring drive with a 45-yard TD on another bootleg. **Billy Cundiff** added a late 39-yard field goal to cap off a decisive and important win for Chino.

- Jason Witten caught 7 passes for 54 yards and 5 first downs and Santonio Holmes caught 5 for 52 yards and 1 TD.
- Shaun Phillips made 11 tackles, deflected 1 pass, and safety Chris Harris returned an interception for a TD.
- Frank Gore carried the ball 19 times for 84 yards and Jason Campbell scrambled for 34 yards.
- Austin Collie made 9 catches for 62 yards and 1 TD, while Greg Jennings had 8 receptions for 106 yards.
- Linebacker, E.J. Henderson made 10 tackles and stuffed 2 runs, and safety Patrick Chung had an interception and 32-yard return.

CAME SUMMARY: Charleswood safety Chris Harris intercepted Jason Campbell and returned it 21 yards for a TD to highlight a 17point 1st quarter for the Patriots. Seldom used running back, Javon Ringer tore off runs of 14 and 17 yards while Adrian Peterson added a 12yard gallop around the end to set up an easy 4-yard TD pass from Peyton Manning to Santonio Holmes to make the score 17-0 late in the 1st quarter. The Regulators responded with *Frank Gore*, who sparked a drive with runs of 11 and 22 yards to break into opposition territory. But facing 4th down and 1 at the Pats' 24 yard line, Campbell attempted to sneak the ball across the first down line and fell just short, turning the ball over on downs to the Pats. The Regulators finally broke into the score column with mere seconds remaining in the 1st half after a 14-play, 60yard drive ended with Nate Kaeding booting a 29-yard field goal to shave 3 points off the Charleswood advantage. The 2nd half began with both teams trading punts before South Carolina's offence engineered a prolonged drive that covered 91 yards and gouged over 9 minutes off the clock. It ended with Campbell finding Chris Cooley wide open over the middle of the field for an 8-yard TD pass to make the score, 17-10 for Charleswood. The Patriots answered that score on their next possession with one of their own. A 24-yard reception by Jacoby Jones broke into the Regulators' red zone and five plays later, Manning found Jason Witten wide open on a 7-yard slant to re-establish a two-touchdown lead, 24-10. A 6-yard TD pass to Austin Collie to narrow the deficit to 7 points and an interception by Patrick Chung to the Pats' 12 had Regulators' fans thinking comeback; but a sack by **Phil Taylor** and a deflection by **Ed Reed** on 4th down in the end zone ended the threat.

- Mario Williams made 4 tackles, 1 sack, 2 run stuffs, 2 QB pressures, 2 forced fumbles and returned one 82 yards for a TD.
- Cubs' safety, **Donte Whitner** made 6 tackles, deflected 3 passes and forced a fumble.
- Mark Sanchez completed just 11 of 23 passes for just 83 yards, 0 TDs, 1 INT, and was pulled from the game in the 3rd quarter.
- Takeo Spikes made 11 tackles and deflected 2 passes to stand out for the Markham defence.

GAME SUMMARY: With the North Stars crowding the line gunning for Arian Foster, Sam Bradford went deep to Mike Wallace for a 70-yard TD bomb to jump out to a 10-0 lead late in the 1st quarter. After failing to counter on their next possession, Markham caught a break when the Cubs' Kellen Winslow fumbled at his 30 yard line, turning the ball over to the Stars. But receiver Kenny Britt gave it right back and more when Donte Whitner stripped the ball and Mario Williams picked it up and ran it back 82 yards for a TD to make it 17-0. Markham finally replied with some points after a 35-yard run by Jahvid Best put David Akers in range for a 49-yard field goal. However, a 21-yard pass interference penalty against Antoine Winfield and a 15-yard unnecessary roughness penalty against Takeo Spikes fuelled an 81-yard lowa City drive that ended with Neil Rackers kicking a 25-yard field goal with 43 seconds left in the half to give the Cubs a 20-3 lead at the halfway mark. The Cubs had to punt from deep in their own end after going backwards on the opening drive of the 2nd half, giving Markham good field position at the 47 yard line. A 21-yard run by Best and a 12-yard reception by Britt keyed a promising drive to the Cubs' red zone; but Markham's comeback hopes took a hit when Mark Sanchez was picked off by DeAngelo Hall at the lowa City 8 yard line. From there, an 11yard completion to Larry Fitzgerald was extended by a 15-yard facemask penalty against Charles Tillman to get them out of a hole. Then Foster and Donald Brown both pulled off carries of 13 yards each to set up a 6-yard TD pass to Fitzgerald. Markham added a late TD, set up by a Casey Matthews interception, when back-up Jake Locker found Best for a 4-yard TD pass, but by then the Dawg Pound was empty.

- Cameron Heyward made 2 tackles, recorded 1 sack, deflected a pass, pressured the QB, and returned a fumble 68 yards for a TD.
- Matt Ryan completed 24 of 55 pass attempts for 229 yards, 1 INT and 1 TD for a QB rating of 54.3.
- Matt Forte rushed for 44 yards and 1 TD on 7 carries and added 3 receptions for 27 yards.

GAME SUMMARY: The Mustangs were violated three times by big plays in the first half to fall behind Virden 20-0. It started on the third play from scrimmage when Michael Thomas snared a short hitch in tight man coverage and somehow slipped out of the grasp of defender, Patrick Peterson to break free for a spectacular 77-yard TD. The second came as Garland was marching in Virden territory with the aim of evening the score. Safety, Eric Berry picked off Matt Ryan at the Virden 13 and returned it 56 yards to the Garland 31 yard line, setting up an eventual 30-yard field goal by Lawrence Tynes. The third came with less than a minute left in the 2nd quarter as the Mustangs tried to get on the board before half time. Matt Forte snagged a 22-yard pass from Ryan but Erik Flowers punched it out and defensive end Cameron Heyward picked it up cleanly and rumbled 68 yards for a TD and a 20-0 Virden lead. The Mustangs came charging out of the gate in the 2nd half but fell flat. Three straight long balls, all missed, and a 4-yard scramble by Ryan turned the ball over on downs and the Violators capitalized after a short drive with a 28-yard Tynes field goal. Garland's next possession saw more pass attempts and more failure to move the chains. A medium out pass to Wes Welker on 4th down and 7 sailed over his head and Virden took over again in Garland territory at the 38 yard line, setting up Tynes' 4th field goal of the afternoon to make it 26-0 Violators. The Mustangs finally marked up the scoreboard aided by two long completions to Jordan Shipley, the second into the end zone from 22 yards out to make it 26-7 for Virden late in the 3rd. However, the Violators would put the game away from their 13 yard line when Thomas got behind a goal line defence to sprint 87 yards for his second long TD.

- Roddy White caught 6 passes for 48 yards and 1 TD.

CAPPE SUPPLATERY: A tipped pass fell into the hands of center, Casey Wiegmann for a 3-yard TD pass that allowed Los Angeles to tie the game at 20-20 with 3:33 left in the fourth quarter. But the vaunted Knights' 'Blue Shield' was unable to stop a late Pickering drive led by rookie QB, Joe Webb, who gained 13 yards on a bootleg to get into field goal range for Josh Scobee. A 9-yard pass to Percy Harvin and a 4-yard run by Chris Johnson got them closer, to the LA 17 yard line, where Pickering coach Gus Konstantakos allowed the clock to run down to 3 seconds before Scobee nailed the game-winner from 35 yards out to hand LA their second straight loss and give his team the best record in the EFL. Harvin's 9-yard reception was a nice finishing touch on a game where he contributed in multiple facets of the game. Harvin got Pickering on the board first with a 29-yard TD run on the end-around. He also got the game-winning field goal drive off to a good start with a 32-yard kickoff return to the Pickering 37 yard line. After falling behind 7-0, the Knights came back and took the lead on a 31-yard field goal by Dan Carpenter and a 6-yard TD pass from Josh Freeman to Roddy White, set up by a 28-yard Freeman scramble and a 25-yard run by Cedric Benson. But the Spartans answered that with a quick 10 points of their own – a 32-yard field goal, followed by a 28-yard TD pass to Anguan Boldin, while the LA defence crowded the line looking for Johnson, to grab a 17-10 lead at half time. The teams exchanged field goals in the 3rd quarter, setting up the 4th quarter dramatics that saw the Knights tie the game in unlikely fashion, only to give it back on the final possession.

CAME SUMMARY: The defences on both sides applied the heat to opposing quarterbacks in 93-degree weather at The Fiery Depths. The Hellfire defence turned in their best performance of the season by far, limiting the Blue Eagles' running game to an average of 3 yards per carry and subjecting Aaron Rodgers to more pressure than he has felt in years. Unfortunately for the home squad, the Blue Eagles' defence had a similar stellar outing and, in the end, Rodgers proved more adept at evading the pressure and finding the open receiver than his Mohave counterpart, Matt Schaub. It was a defender's day from the very start. The first 8 possessions of the game ended in 7 punts and 1 interception. The first scoring opportunity came at the 6:59 mark of the 2nd quarter when **Sebastien Janikowski's** 51-yard field goal attempt hit the upright and missed. The Hellfire took over and, after nearly giving the ball back with a Mike Tolbert fumble on the first play, drove in dink-and-dunk fashion to the Scarborough 14 yard line where they finally stalled and Rob Bironas broke the scoreless tie with a 32-yard field goal. That would be all the scoring in the first half with Mohave holding the narrow lead coming as a surprise to most. The 3rd quarter started with a three-and-out by the Hellfire followed by a Scarborough 10-play drive that went 60 yards and ended with Rodgers threading the needle into the teeth of a 6man stacked line for a short quick 1-yard TD pass to Ray Rice. This would turn out to be all that the Blue Eagles would need on a day when the defences ruled the gridiron. They got an insurance score thanks, in part, to a Mohave gamble that went wrong. Facing 4th down and 2 at the Scarborough 28, the Hellfire turned down a field goal attempt and sent Tolbert on the sweep. A six-man defensive front gave him no place to run and he was stopped for a 1-vard gain. Scarborough followed up with a 12-play drive for the clinching score, a 6-vard pass to Lance Moore.

NEW YORK – My weekly instalment reports on the Knights' quest for a perfect season lasted one week. Not even long enough to pluralize it. What was supposed to be a series on the Knights' victory run turned out to be a rather brief *report* on the team's first loss. Was I responsible, in some way, for that loss? Or did Mr. Finchley's impromptu idea of a weekly chronicle curse the franchise?

The human conceit that somehow we, as individuals, have an impact on events central to other people's lives by simply thinking about them, or by performing some ritual, or by wearing some "lucky shirt" or sitting in a "lucky chair," is something we grow out of as we get older. Yet, even in our adult years, we can revert to superstition instinctively when the irony of circumstances hits us over the head. To me, that means we instinctively *believe* in our individual power to change the world even if we don't *think* we can. That also means that, for me and billions of people on this planet; the world revolves around each of us individually as we revolve around each other.

FOURTH DOWN FOLLIES

It is time to *stop the fourth down insanity!* While there is a growing school of coaching thought that questions traditional 4th down conventions, some coaches are "going for it" on 4th down in situations that would have been considered grounds for committal to a mental institution in the old days. To be sure, "playing it safe" on 4th-and-short has been questioned, and challenged, more and more as a loser's formula by coaches in the mainstream. But lately, aggressive offensive strategies that involve daring 4th down-and-long attempts are coming into vogue. '4th and Go' is "trending" in the coaching 'Twitterverse.' The question: is this trend the next step in the continuous evolution of football, or a passing fad indulged by desperate coaches on the edge?

A quick look at the data suggests the latter. After ten weeks, the average number of 4th down conversion attempts per team is 16. On the high end is Garland, with 38 attempts; on the low end is Cowtown with 1. Half the league's teams fall within the 10-18 range, while the remaining half of the league occupy different levels toward the extremes on both ends.

It is interesting to note that the four teams with 25 or more attempts, **Death Valley** (25), **York** (30), **Mohave** (33) and **Garland** (38), have a combined record of 11-29; while the four teams with 8 of fewer attempts, **Gwinnett** (8), **Pickering** (7), **Virden** (6) and **Cowtown** (1) have a combined record of 27-13. This is, in part, due to the obvious fact that weaker teams are more often in situations where they are trying to come from behind and must take chances on 4th down. But, in the case of this particular group of four at the top of the chart, it is also due to a "gutsy" (or foolhardy) philosophy that puts 4th down in play virtually any time, as early as the first quarter with the score tied, at virtually any spot on the field. The thought behind this strategy seems to be; "we're bad, we need an extra down to compete." But, as we're seeing, increasing the number of risky 4th down gambles when your team is not very competitive just makes everything worse. The Top Four were all expected to be better than their current records. Of the 'Bottom Four,' three are among the top teams in the league. **Virden**, at 3-7, is the anomaly; but they would probably have more 4th down attempts but their games have been close and **Eli Manning** keeps getting intercepted before they make it to 4th down situations.

It may be easy to dismiss the impact of 4th down experimentation when it involves teams like **Mohave** and **Garland**. But how does the 4th down insanity impact a serious game? In **Death Valley** this week, a game still well within reach for the home team (down 14-10 with 5:53 left in the third quarter) took a significant turn against them when they failed to convert on 4th and 1 at their 23. Overcoming two holding penalties, the Corn Kings managed to stay in field goal range without earning a first down. *Olindo Mare* kicked the field goal and suddenly the Corn Kings were up by a TD, instead of 4 points, in a tight game. The Undertakers may have lost anyway, but there was a real momentum shift on that series. Although they had given up a couple of big plays, the dangerous **Death Valley** pass rush had been disrupting the **Cowtown** offence and preventing their usual sustained drives. There was a sense before that gamble that the game could have gone either way. But after the Undertakers put their team's "manhood" on the line unnecessarily and failed to gain a

yard, the sense that one team was over-compensating for an inferiority complex became a belief in the players' minds, and the Corn Kings went on to beat Death Valley easily, 31-13.

Supporters of 4th down insanity might counter that, had Worthley's gamble worked, we would be praising him as some kind of 'avant garde' genius. Not really. Throwing short, he would likely have gained a first down somewhere between his 24 and (to be generous) his 35. Big deal! The reward was small compared with the risk and therefore was a sucker's bet.

THE YORK REVOLUTION

The crowd at Camelot got ugly drunk and mean watching the Excaliburs' Week Ten debacle against the Gladiators. The loyal and normally cheery fans in York seem to have finally come to the realization that there is no light at the end of the tunnel for this curiously weak team with so much unrealized potential. Nobody expected the Swords to dominate

in 2011, but few, if any, expected a team with *Tom Brady* at quarterback to be two games out of a playoff spot after 10 weeks.

As long as there were no great expectations of their team, the fans at Camelot were more than happy to eat and drink until the stench of vomit overpowered the smell of exhaust fumes in the parking lot after games. But since brimming hope was gradually beaten down and flattened by the Hammer of Defeat in 7 out of 10 games this year, a growing sense of disappointment and betrayal turned the once jovial masses into angry mobs as the Excaliburs fell 29-10 to Gwinnett.

When fights started breaking out in the third quarter and the beer taps were shut off early for the first time since the franchise came to York, a petrified Head of Security went to owner, **Jay Hammond's** luxury box with an urgent message that the fans were restless and complaining that they had no beer to drink. Red-faced and sauced to the gills, Hammond apparently bellowed, "they have no beer? Let them drink scotch, then!" Word of Hammond's comment spread quickly through the stands and soon, a mob estimated at about 1,000, drunkenly staggered up the stairs to storm Hammond's private box. "TO THE BASTARD!" they chanted as yellow-clad security fled before them.

Not quite realizing his peril, Hammond leaned out from his luxury suite and addressed the mob with his thumb to his nose, his fingers wiggling and his tongue out. This just made them angrier and within minutes they had broken through what remained of stadium security and had stormed into the suite. Hammond narrowly escaped the wrath of the drunken crowd by quickly changing his shirt, throwing on a King Arthur mask (a popular item at the souvenir stands) and joining in the trashing of his own private box. He eventually got out of harm's way by leading a charge into the visiting Gwinnett owner's box before slipping away through a service tunnel to call the Police.

Police arrived by the dozens and eventually restored order, but not before another group of fans stormed the York dressing room and tied up the assistant coaches. Led by a fan named Nick, decked out in a Lancelot outfit, a group of about two dozen inebriated season ticket holders proclaimed themselves 'The Fan's Assembly' and declared that they would be calling the plays for the rest of the season. Their reign was short-lived as Nick's assistant, Charlie, located the beer keg storage room while searching for the team's playbook. This led to the Fan's Assembly drinking themselves into unconsciousness and eventual arrest.

DOUBTING THOMAS

Virden wide receiver, *Mike Thomas* is used to being overlooked as a number one receiver. *Dez Bryant* and *Julio Jones* are considered by many to be the top studs in Virden stable. That's okay by Thomas – he prefers it that way. "All the time

growing up, people doubted my ability. But I always believed in myself," Thomas told ESPN commentator, **Russ Flont**; who proclaimed Thomas to be a future hall-of-famer, and the possible supplanter of *Jerry Rice* as the all-time leading receiver in history, after his standout performance in Week Ten against Garland. Thomas is creeping up the leader board and drawing serious attention from Fantasy coaches everywhere.

Thomas certainly played a key role for his team this week. He got the Violators started with a brilliant 77-yard catch-and-run TD and never looked back in leading a 33-14 shellacking of the Mustangs. Despite missing 10 players due to injuries, by far the most in the league, Virden looked healthy and the Mustangs looked sick. *Eli Manning* had his first interception-free game of 2011 and, in the process, showed what he could do when he doesn't throw the ball to the opposing team. Of course, he got a lot of help from Thomas' individual effort, who's 236 yards on 8 catches set a single game mark for the 2011 season. Thomas got a little help from the Garland defence on his final 87-yard TD reception. In a new twist to the train wreck that is the Garland coaching staff's approach to strategy in 2011, the Mustangs formed up in a goal line defence at the Virden 13 yard line. Yes, that is correct, the VIRDEN 13 yard line. Thomas benefitted from having nobody to beat on the play apart from fee safety *Earl Thomas*, who he had gained a step on from the outset. In a whacky way the choice of defence made sense in retrospect – the Violators did actually reach and cross the goal line on the play.

AROUND THE EFL

How good is Chino's run defence? Aside from being first in the league with a full yard-per-carry advantage (2.8) over their nearest competitor, Virden (3.8); they have given up just two runs of 20+ yards in 10 games: a 25-yarder to Gwinnett's *LeSean McCoy* and, this week, a 24-yarder to Durham's *Michael Turner*. That run, and a 44-yard TD pass to *Antonio Gates*, were the only two highlights for Durham fans in a 30-13 loss to Chino in Week Ten. How bad is Durham's run defence? Not the worst, but this week they looked like it, surrendering 288 yards rushing – the most by any team in a single game this year. 109 of those came from *Cam Newton*, who rushed for more yards than he passed for - proving that the sensational rookie can beat you one way or the other. The Convicts urgently needed a win to stay above water in the highly competitive West Division playoff race. Meanwhile, the loss puts the Thunder Lizards two games behind the Corn Kings and one game behind Gwinnett in the wild card race. They are looking for new gimmicks after the "Crossbow" (the formation led by *Tim Tebow* that forces an opponent to guess if he will run or pass) did not fare well in a critical situation against a defence that does not need to overplay the run to stop it.

The Regulators are going to be a thorn in opponents' sides in the final third of the season if their recent performances against LA last week and Charleswood this week are any indication. The Pats rode a 17-point outburst in the first quarter to survive a late push-back by **Hal Corson's** feisty team. Briefly it looked like an amazing comeback was in store for boisterous and rowdy South Carolina fans. *Patrick Chung* picked off *Peyton Manning* and returned it 32 yards to the Pats' 12 yard line with 4:43 remaining. Trailing 24-17, the Regulators needed a TD to tie, which would have made it anybody's game. But the Pats stood firm as *Phil Taylor* sacked *Jason Campbell* for a 7-yard loss on 2nd and goal from the 3, and *Ed Reed* batted away a 4th down pass for *Austin Collie* in the end zone. The Pats felt they had narrowly avoided an embarrassment in Columbia, but if the Regulators continue to play tough, losing to them will not be the embarrassment it would have been in the first half of the season.

Just call him "Bombs Away Bradford." One of the bright spots in an up-and-down season for young Cubs' quarterback, *Sam Bradford* is his success rate on the long bomb. Bradford is 8 of 12 for 371 yards and 4 TDs for a QB rating of 149.3 throwing the long bomb (a pass attempt of 30 yards or more). Much of this success is due to receiver *Mike Wallace*, the target of all 12 attempts, getting open behind the defender. Wallace is the league's premier deep threat, but nevertheless, Bradford deserves credit for hitting the moving target. This gives Iowa City a weapon no other team has - the entire league rest of the league has thrown just 12 bombs, completing only 2 of them for 65 yards. The 'Long Bomber' struck again in Week 10, burning Markham corner, *Antoine Winfield* for a 70-yard TD strike to give the Cubs a 10-0 lead in the 1st quarter and setting the tone for a dominating Cubs win that could have been much worse than the 27-9 score would indicate.

The Knights came into Thermopylae Stadium determined to stop running back *Chris Johnson*; but that effort, as well as the loss of *Nnamdi Asomugha* in the first quarter, may have opened the door for young quarterback *Joe Webb* to show that he is a little better than a mere game manager. With *Matt Cassel* out, the Spartans were forced to turn to the young rookie, who had never started a game in his career, but had experienced first string pressure relieving the brittle Cassel in three previous contests. After leading a last minute drive for the winning field goal in a 23-20 win against one of the top defences in the league, Webb is now established as a reliable back-up – an asset the Spartans did not know they had at the start o the season.

In a game marked by a surprisingly strong showing by the Mohave defensive line, the Blue Eagles squeezed by the Hellfire for their 7th victory of the season, to keep pace with the surging Gladiators in the South Division. The Scarborough offensive line, one of the better outfits in the league, wilted in the Mohave heat and allowed rookie *Tyson Alualu* and second year defensive end *Robert Ayers* to look like Pro Bowl candidates as those two harassed and knocked down *Aaron Rodgers* 10 times, including a sack and a forced fumble. It was more pressure than Rodgers is used to facing but he responded well eventually throwing the only TD passes of the game to account for his team's 14 points. *Matt Schaub*, far more accustomed to defensive harassment, did not fare as well and that was the difference in the ball game. If you're the kind of hard-nosed fan who loves defence, you would have enjoyed this game; but if you are like most of the league's fans you would have flipped the switch and never come back right after *Ray Rice* caught that 1-yard TD pass in the 3rd quarter.

JiMMy'S Week ELEVEN pickS

IOWA CITY @ CHARLESWOOD (line – PATS by 5)

Both teams dispatched relatively weak opponents in Week Ten so both will have to turn up the intensity level for this match. The team that takes the other more seriously first, will have the edge. The Pats are losing true believers every time Peyton Manning lets a weaker opponent back into the game with an unforced error – as he did last week against South Carolina. This week his team faces a club they should beat at Patriot Place, but which has true playmakers on both sides of the ball and a knack for knocking off giants. The Pats are no longer giants but they have the talent to take out the Cubs and their unreliable quarterback without breaking much of a sweat. While the Cubs continue to move the ball with ease, their defence remains questionable despite some top grade talent and they are now missing Chris Gamble at cornerback. Expect the Pats to get a fine day from Adrian Peterson and a solid game from Peyton to cover the spread and a bit more. **PICK: CHARLESWOOD**

DEATH VALLEY @ MOHAVE (line – UNDERTAKERS by 3)

The Hellfire see an opportunity to score some points here against the league's most generous defence but they may come away disappointed at their haul. While the Undertakers are giving up big plays and big yards, they also have the strongest pass rush in the league, and when it is able to get through, few quarterbacks can overcome it. Mohave has one of those offensive lines that will continually test its own quarterback by letting opposing linebackers into the backfield. Despite having serious reservations about Chris Worthley's ability to fix the defence that Darth Vader broke, I can see the 'Fearsome Foursome' and friends generating a six-sack day against Matt Schaub and creating turnovers in the passing game. Meanwhile, Drew Brees will do just enough against a mildly resurging Mohave defence that Death Valley should just barely cover against the spread. **PICK: DEATH VALLEY**

VIRDEN @ CHINO (line – CONVICTS by 6)

The Violators showed last week against Garland how dangerous they can be when Eli Manning plays turnover-free football. Mike Thomas can score from any area of the field, both catching the ball and returning kicks. This week, however, he may be showered with more attention than usual as Eli's other main target, Dez Bryant, sits due to injury. Although he must be respected, LeGarrette Blount has had just one rushing day over 100 yards and he is extremely unlikely to get even half that amount against Chino's run defence. Cam Newton showed in last week's upset over Durham that he can win a game with his legs if he has to. The Virden line, although playing well, lacks true run-stopping talent and will be vulnerable to Newton's improvisational skills. Expect a return to "Turnover Time" for Eli and a good rushing performance from Steve Jackson and rookie Cam. **PICK: CHINO**

YORK @ LOS ANGELES (line - KNIGHTS by 8)

Both teams have lost 2 straight and find themselves dealing with confidence issues. The inability of the Knights' critically-acclaimed defence to stop Joe Webb from marching the Spartans into field goal range in the final minutes of a Week Ten loss to Pickering has many in the Media questioning their heart. Although still ranked in the top four, the Knights' defence goes forward into this week missing Nnamdi Asomugha, their best player. Against most other teams this would be a significant and clear disadvantage, but against emotionally unstable York, the

pressure of the opportunity may be enough to keep Tom Brady's offence tight and ineffective – as it has been most of this season. York is desperate for a win and LA, while not desperate, is very concerned about their sudden loss of fortune after ruling the EFL for half a season. York needs to get their tight ends back into the game, since their receivers are not getting the job done. If they do, I can see Tom Brady, already bottomed out emotionally after a disappointing 3-7 start, rising out of his rut with a fresh approach to the passing game against a limping and mildly depressed LA. After all, "misery loves company." **PICK: YORK**

PICKERING @ SCARBOROUGH (line – BLUE EAGLES by 2)

The Spartans have been moving the ball and scoring in spite of an ordinary quarterback who bears no resemblance to the ego-maniac who led this same team to the Championship last year. This can be attributed to the running game and an offensive line that gives Matt Cassel (and Joe Webb) time to throw. Pickering is also well-coached and, at 9-1, is getting the most out of its talent. The Blue Eagles are best in the league in red zone defence and at sacking the QB, but otherwise are not dominating the rankings as they should be. The offence is even worse – ranked 13th and, just last week, struggled to score 14 points against the Mohave turnstile. With all this in view, about the only thing the Blue Eagles have going for them is the home field advantage. If you had asked me about this game before the season started I would have laughed and thrown my pay cheque on Scarborough. Now, I'm laughing in the other direction. **Pick: PICKERING**

DURHAM @ GWINNETT (line – GLADIATORS by 5)

Although the early part of Gwinnett's 2011 journey was plagued by injuries on defence and inconsistencies on offence, their recent performances over the course of a four-game winning streak suggest they may be set to finally realize their potential as a usurper of the South Division hierarchy. Although I did call it, Durham's largely unexpected loss to Chino last week blunted their swagger and pushed them a game out of the wild card race. They now need to post a winning record over the remaining 6 weeks to have a good chance at a playoff berth – too bad for them that their final run of six begins in Gwinnett. The Glads are getting stronger while Durham is stepping backwards. Take the home team to win with the points. **Pick: GWINNETT**

GARLAND @ MARKHAM (line – NORTH STARS by 5)

With six days to go until game day, the North Stars have not sold even half of the tickets available for this 'Clash of the Molluscs,' meaning this game will almost certainly be blacked out in the Markham area unless Darrin Jones buys the remainder of the tickets and donates them to the Penetanguishene Mental Health Centre, as he did once before in 2010. Let's hope he allows the game to be blacked out and that it will start a trend to black it out everywhere, except for Garland. The prospect of accidentally flipping to this game on EFL Sunday Ticket has me worried, and a blackout would alleviate that concern. Still, as long as somebody is betting on this contest, I have a job to do. One team has to win and, although neither team has played well in recent weeks, the Mustangs were the last to actually win a game, so I say they are peaking for this one. **PICK: GARLAND**

SOUTH CAROLINA @ COWTOWN (line – CORN KINGS by 14)

The Corn Kings bounced back from a one-point loss to Gwinnett in Week Nine with a convincing 31-13 win on the road against Death Valley last week. This week they face a much healthier Regulator team that, over the past two weeks, has spoiled the Knights' perfect season bid and come from behind to challenge Charleswood late. Tony Romo is still out, but with the way Jason Campbell has played in his absence this no longer means much. Although many fans are still in shock about the Corn Kings' overwhelming success to this point, it is finally time to acknowledge that they are among the league's top teams; ranked #1 in both offensive and defensive efficiency, in case you have any doubts. But while they should be a prohibitive favourite against South Carolina, even with Maurice Jones-Drew on the sidelines, Joe Flacco will certainly miss Cowtown's leading rusher this week, and that will make a difference in the spread, if not the bottom line. **PICK: SOUTH CAROLINA**
